## BRONCOS IMPROVE TO 2-0 WITH WIN OVER GIANTS

The Denver Broncos (2-0) tied a team record with their seventh straight victory on the road while topping 40 points in consecutive games for the second time in club annals with their 41-23 win against the New York Giants (0-2).

The last time Denver won seven consecutive road games was from 1976-77. It was also in 1976 when the Broncos topped the 40-point mark in back-to-back games.

The game also marked Denver's 400th overall win since the 1970 NFL merger, making the Broncos just the fifth team to reach the milestone during that time.

## PEYTON MANNING ECLIPSES 60,000 YARDS

On Denver's opening drive, QB Peyton Manning became the third player in NFL history (Brett Favre & Dan Marino) to throw for 60,000 career yards. He is the fastest of the three to accomplish the feat, reaching the milestone in 7,841 attempts.

Manning, who completed 30-of-43 passes (69.8%) for 307 yards with two touchdowns (105.5), also tied his own NFL record with his 15th consecutive game registering a rating of at least 90.0 (previously accomplished in 2008 – Games 1-15).

## MISCELLANEOUS GAME NOTES

**RB Knowshon Moreno**, who rushed for 93 yards on 13 carries (7.2 avg.), scored two touchdowns of 20+ yards to mark the eighth time a Bronco has accomplished that feat in the same game (first since **RB Willis McGahee** at Oak., 11/6/11)... Denver recorded four interceptions for the first time since the 2001 season when the team accomplished the feat three times during the season... Broncos **CB Chris Harris** had an interception for the second consecutive game to become the first Denver player since **CB Champ Bailey** in 2009 to have a pick in back-to-back games... **CB Dominique Rodgers** made his first interception as a Bronco—a score-preventing pick in the end zone with 0:09 remaining in the first half... **LB Danny Trevathan** led the team with a career-high 10 tackles (8 solo), including the only sack of the game (9 yds.)... Broncos **WR Demaryius Thomas** (5 rec. for 52 yds.) passed **Bob Scarpitto** into 15th place on the team's all-time receiving yardage list and passed **Brandon Stokley** into 24th place on the club's all-time receptions list... **K Matt Prater** attempted (and converted) his first two field goals of the season and is now the franchise leader in career field goal accuracy (.808 / 118-of-146), passing longtime Bronco **Jason Elam** in that category.
