## BRONCOS WIN 17th CONSECUTIVE GAME; IMPROVE TO 6-0

The Denver Broncos (6-0) defeated the Jacksonville Jaguars (0-6) by a score of 35-19 to earn their 17th consecutive regular-season victory—tying the Chicago Bears (1933-34) for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history.

Denver joins the Kansas City Chiefs (6-0) as the two remaining undefeated teams in the NFL this season.

## WELKER GETS 800th CAREER RECEPTION & POSTS SIXTH CONSECUTIVE GAME WITH TOUCHDOWN

Broncos WR **Wes Welker**, who posted six catches for 63 yards (10.5 avg.) and a touchdown, became the 27th player in NFL history to post 800 career receptions with his 20-yard scoring catch in the first quarter. He joins Broncos Ring of Fame WR **Rod Smith** as the only two undrafted players to reach that milestone.

His touchdown marked his team-leading eighth score of the season, tying the club record for most consecutive games (6) with a scoring catch and becoming the first NFL player to record a touchdown reception in his first six games with a team.

## JULIUS THOMAS FINDS THE END ZONE AGAIN

Broncos TE **Julius Thomas**, (4-22, 1 TD) recorded his seventh receiving touchdown of the season to tie TE **Riley Odoms** (1973) for the fifth-most scoring catches in a season by a Broncos tight end. Only Hall of Fame TE **Shannon Sharpe** caught more touchdowns in a season among Broncos tight ends (four times).

## MANNING KEEPS PACE WITH HISTORY

Broncos **QB Peyton Manning**, who completed 28-of-42 passes (66.7%) for 295 yards with two touchdowns and one interception (92.9 rtg.), has now posted the most touchdown passes (22) through six games in NFL history.

Manning also passed Hall of Fame **QB Dan Marino** into second place in NFL history with his 204th career game with at least one touchdown pass.

## MORENO TAKES OVER THE NFL LEAD IN RUSHING SCORES

Broncos **RB Knowshon Moreno** rushed for 42 yards and three touchdowns on 15 carries (2.8 avg.) in addition to leading the team with seven receptions for 62 yards (8.9 avg.).

His three rushing scores tie for the third most in a single game in Broncos history and the most since **RB Tatum Bell** had three at San Diego on Dec. 31, 2005. He also took over the NFL lead with seven total rushing scores on the season, tying his career high set during his rookie season in 2009.

Broncos **CB Kayvon Webster** recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter... **LB Danny Trevathan** posted his team-leading third interception of the season in the fourth quarter as well... **DE Malik Jackson** posted a career-best two sacks (12 yds.) and three total tackles for a loss—all coming on the same series in the third quarter to force a Jaguars three-and-out... Denver held Jacksonville to 0-3 on fourth downs and has now stopped its opponents on all six fourth-down tries this year... **CB Chris Harris** led the Broncos with a career-high 11 tackles (10 solo)... **CB Champ Bailey** made his season debut and led all players with three passes defended.
