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### **DENVER BRONCOS MINI CAMP QUOTES (6/13/18)**

#### **DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR JOE WOODS**

##### **On CB Bradley Roby**

“He’s been doing a great job. He actually had a really good day yesterday. The biggest thing with Roby is that he’s always been a starter for us. He starts in the sub, which we’re on the field in sub more than we are in base, so I think it snapped for him to feel like he’s a starter. So far, he’s embraced that role and he’s done a pretty good job.”

##### **On having Pass Rush Consultant DeMarcus Ware at practice**

“It’s awesome. It’s always good. He looks like he can still play. Just having a guy of his stature come in and work with our players, that just validates some of the things we’re teaching and it helps us tremendously in getting them to believe in the concepts. That’s what he’s run. [Linebackers] Coach [Reggie] Herring coached him in Dallas. [Cowboys Defensive Coordinator] Rob Marinelli, who I coached with in Tampa, coached him in Dallas. It’s been great to have him around.”

##### **On Ware’s potential impact on OLB Bradley Chubb**

“It’s awesome. Like I said, it’s really good because he’s hands-on. He’s in the meeting room, he’s watching tape with the guys, he’s looking at all the things we’re doing with our pass-rush stunts, and to get his hands on them in the drill work has been awesome for us. We’re glad to have him back this week.”

##### **On CB Isaac Yiadom**

“He’s making progress. Obviously, there are a lot of new things that he didn’t experience in college at Boston College. He’s a guy that’s very smart. He challenges people and he doesn’t back down. He’s making some mistakes, but he corrects them pretty quickly.”

##### **On OLB Von Miller and Chubb’s relationship**

“It’s that Batman-and-Robin type of relationship. Right now, Bradley is just listening. He’s all ears, trying to take in as much information because obviously Von is one of the best pass rushers in the game. It’s been good just to see those guys talk in meetings, get on the field, spend some time one-on-one going through drills and different things they’re doing with their hands. He’s definitely going to benefit from being in the same room with Von.”

##### **On the camaraderie among the safeties**

“It’s good. Those guys have been together for a long time, and bringing [S] Su’a [Cravens] in, he fits right away. He has that little bit of swagger that you like. It’s been good so far. Those guys, they hang out and they watch tape together, so we just look for that to continue throughout the season.”

**On his comfort calling defensive plays**

"I definitely got more comfortable as the season went on. The biggest thing is learning the stunts, learning what pressures you want to run versus different protections and having [Defensive Line Coach] Bill Kollar and [Linebackers Coach] Reggie Herring in the room helped me tremendously. Right now, I have a better grasp on everything, so I feel extremely confident going into my second season calling [the plays]."

**On what S Justin Simmons needs to do to become a Pro Bowl caliber player**

"The biggest thing he has to do is just go out there and do his job. He's a talented player and he has versatility. If you just go out and make the plays you're supposed to make, then you'll get those types of awards. We just want him to be a great team player and help us get to the Super Bowl first."

**On if they can sneak Ware onto the field to play in games**

"I'd like to (laughs). It's great having him around, but he looks like he can still play. He's been a tremendous help so far to all of our guys in the offseason."

**On Ware's ability to teach**

"To me, it's just a respect factor. He's played for a long time and he's a future Hall of Famer. Just to have that guy coaching, I think it means a tremendous amount to those guys. To me, that's the biggest benefit, because they know he's actually been on the field and he's done it at a high level."

**On CB Tramaine Brock**

"He's a veteran. V.J. (Head Coach Vance Joseph) coached him in the past. He's a veteran and he's a tough guy. He doesn't say a lot, he just shows up and plays football. To have that veteran experience of a guy that's actually been in game situations and make big plays is big for us."

**On if OLB Jeff Holland can take a similar career path as former CFA OLB Shaq Barrett**

"You never know. The biggest thing is making plays between the white lines. We record all of the positive that guys make, and right now he's blowing people away. He had a big day at the end of last week in OTAs, but right now he's leading the charge. We just need to see what he does in training camp and in the preseason."

**On ILB Josey Jewell**

"When we got with all of our rookie class we drafted, the one thing you saw on tape with those guys were all really good football players—high football IQ. You could see them react and make plays fast on tape. Since [Jewell] has shown up, that's who he is. It just took him a little while to learn the system, but he's doing well in our base defense as well as our sub packages."

**On what he hopes to see tomorrow**

"The biggest thing is just cleaning up mistakes. We stayed on schedule with our install. We basically have a 12-install plan, so our 12th install is going in tomorrow. For us, we're just going to stay on track and try to clean up some mistakes we've made in the prior practices."

**On what's in the 12th install**

"A little bit of everything. We're just to the point where we're getting to some of our sub packages. We did some things yesterday with the new sub package and we did some things today. There are some mistakes we have to clean up that happened, but we'll have another little twist going in tomorrow with our sub."
