DENVER ROLLS UP IMPRESSIVE ROAD WIN; FACES ARCHRIVAL RAIDERS AT HOME SUNDAY

The Broncos jumped out to a 20-0 first-quarter lead, and never looked back, notching their seventh win of the season, 34-13 at New Orleans. Running back Reuben Droughns set the pace for Denver early, taking the first offensive play of the game 51 yards for a touchdown. He finished the game with 166 yards rushing on 28 carries (5.9). Quarterback Jake Plummer, who for the second straight week went interception free, threw for 224 yards on 19 of 29 passing and two touchdowns. Wide receiver Ashley Lelie also had a big game for the Broncos, catching three passes for a team-high 79 yards, including a 37-yard touchdown, his sixth touchdown on the season of over 30 yards (NFL leader). Despite allowing 411 total yards, Denver's defense kept the Saints off balance all game, picking off quarter Aaron Brooks three times, and sacking him twice. With the win, Denver improves to 7-3 overall, maintaining its lead in the AFC West.

In Week 12, the Broncos return home where they will face their archrival, the Oakland Raiders on Sunday, Nov. 28. Kickoff for the game is set for 6:30 p.m. (MST) at INVESCO Field at Mile High, and it will be broadcast nationally on ESPN's *Sunday Night Football*. Denver took the first game of the series this season, with a 31-3 win at Network Associates Coliseum.

RADIO/TELEVISION vs. OAKLAND

The Broncos and the Raiders renew their rivalry for the second time this season, in front of a national television audience on ESPN. The game will be broadcast on ESPN's *Sunday Night Football*, and locally on KUSA-TV (NBC-Channel 9). **Mike Patrick** will provide the play-by-play, and joining him in the booth will be **Joe Theismann** and **Paul Maguire** doing the color commentary. **Suzy Kolber** will be on the sidelines.

For the 35th consecutive year, KOA radio (850) is the flagship station for the Denver Broncos radio network, and every game this season will be broadcast. **Dave Logan** and **Scott Hastings** will provide the play-by-play and color commentary respectively, with **Alan Roach** on the sidelines. The Broncos radio network extends to nine states, and the KOA pregame show, hosted by **Mike Rice**, begins two hours prior to kickoff.

The game will also be broadcast in Spanish on KBNO radio (1280). **Milo Sanchez** will do the play-by-play, with **Luke Sandoval** adding color commentary.

Westwood One/CBS Radio will provide a national radio broadcast. The team includes **Dave Simms** with the call and **Bob Trumpy** by his side. **Neil O'Donnell** will be at field level.

THE SERIES vs. OAKLAND

The Broncos and the Raiders have met 88 times in the regular season, with the Raiders holding a 52-34-2 (.602) edge. Overall, the Broncos are 18-23-2 (.442) at home vs. Oakland, and 16-29 (.356) on the road. Denver's most notable streak occurred when it won 12 of the 14 games played from 1995 to 2001, including a stretch where they won 11 of 12. Under Head Coach Mike Shanahan, the Broncos are 15-4 (.789) against the Raiders, including 8-1 (.889) at home and 7-3 (.700) on the road.

• **TE DWAYNE CARSWELL**

Caught five passes in separate games vs. Oak. 11/11/02 and vs. Oak. 11/13/00 for the Broncos. Caught a touchdown pass at Oak. 10/17/04. In 19 career games vs. Oak. (8 starts), recorded 25 receptions for 252 yds. (10.1 avg.).

• **DE MARCO COLEMAN**

On Monday Night Football, totaled six tackles (all solo) and one sack (-6 yds.) vs. Oak. 10/21/96 for the Chargers. Added four tackles (3 solo) and a sack (-6 yds.) while forcing a fumble at Oak. 10/5/97 for the Chargers. In nine career games (9 starts) vs. Raiders, made 24 tackles (21 solo), three sacks (-16 yds.), two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

• **FB REUBEN DROUGHNS**

Rushed 38 times (franchise record in non-overtime game) and gained 176 yds. (4.6 avg.) with a touchdown at Oak. 10/17/04. In Denver's game at OAK. 11/30/03, rushed four times for 16 yds., caught a 6-yd. pass and returned a kick 32 yds. for the Broncos. Returned three kicks for 76 yds. (25.3 avg.) with a long of 30 at OAK. 11/22/02 for the Broncos.

• **K JASON ELAM**

Made 3-of-4 field-goal attempts, including a 52-yarder, at Raiders 1/2/94. Connected on 4-of-4 attempts, including a 53-yarder, vs. Oak. 11/22/99. In 23 career games vs. the Raiders, converted 44-of-51 (86.3%) field-goal attempts and is 2-of-2 on 50+-yard attempts for the Broncos.

• **S NICK FERGUSON**

Tied a career-high with 12 tackles (9 solo) in a start at Oak. 11/30/03 while adding a forced fumble for the Broncos.

• **TE PATRICK HAPE**

In a start at H-back, caught two passes for 20 yds. (10.0 avg) at Oak. 11/5/01 for the Broncos. In nine career games (1 start) vs. Oak., caught five passes for 36 yds. (7.2 avg.).

• **DE REGGIE HAYWARD**

Recorded sacks two recent Broncos games against the Raiders (1.5 sacks for -10.5 yds. at Oak. 11/30/03 and 2.5 sacks for 18.5 yds. 9/22/03 vs. Oak.). Made five tackles (3 solo) at Oak. 10/17/04. In five career games (3 starts) vs. Oak., totaled 13 tackles (9 solo) and four sacks (-29 yds.).

• **KELLY HERNDON**

Intercepted a pass (2 yds.) and made four tackles (3 solo) at Oak. 10/17/04. Made seven tackles (6 solo) along with a fumble recovery in a start at Oak. 11/30/03 for the Broncos.

• **DE RAYLEE JOHNSON**

Enjoyed a three-sack (-13 yds.), six-tackle (4 solo) game along with two forced fumbles at Oak. 11/18/01 for the Chargers. Recorded two sacks (-16 yds.) at Oak. 10/5/97 for the Chargers. In 19 career games (7 starts) vs. Oak., has 23 tackles (14 solo) and 6.5 sacks (-37 yds.).

• **S KENOY KENNEDY**

• **S JOHN LYNCH**

Totaled six tackles (5 solo) and a pass breakup at Oak. 10/17/04 for the Broncos. In Super Bowl XXXVII vs. Oak. (1/26/03), totaled one tackle and one pass defended for the World Champion Buccaneers.

• **QB JAKE PLUMMER**

Threw three touchdowns and completed 11-of-20 passes (55.0%) for 190 yards with one interception at Oak. 10/17/04. Recorded a career-high 40-yd. run vs. Oak. 9/22/03 for the Broncos. Threw a 50-yd. touchdown while completing 22-of-38 passes (57.9%) for 249 yds. at Oak. 12/2/01 for the Cardinals. In six career games (6 starts) vs. Oak., completed

97-of-172 passes (56.4%) for 1,094 yds., 11 touchdowns and seven interceptions.

• **DT MONSANTO POPE**

In a start at Oak. 12/22/02, recorded two sacks (-7 yds.) and three tackles for the Broncos.

• **DT/DE Trevor Pryce**

Recorded a streak of four consecutive games vs. Oak. with one sack (9/20/98-11/22/99) for the Broncos. Made five tackles (all solo) at Oak. 12/22/02. In 13 career games (12 starts), totaled 39 tackles (33 solo) and five sacks (-22 yds.).

• **WR ROD SMITH**

Caught 10 passes for 91 yds. (9.1 avg.) and two touchdowns at Oak. 11/5/01 for the Broncos. Scored the game-winning touchdown in four-catch, 72-yd. (18.0) game at Oak. 11/4/96. Has scored a touchdown in seven games vs. Oak and has eight games with six or more catches. In 19 career games (16 starts) vs. Oak., totaled 87 catches for 1,051 yds. (12.1 avg.) with eight touchdowns.

• **LB DONNIE SPRAGAN**

Tallied five tackles (3 solo) and a sack (-1 yd.) at Oak. 10/17/04. Made 13 tackles (11 solo) and recovered a fumble in a start at Oak. 11/30/03 for the Broncos. In five career games (2 starts) vs. Oak., recorded 18 tackles (14 solo), one sack (-1 yd.), two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery.

• **LB AL WILSON**

Tallied 16 tackles (14 solo) at Oak. 12/22/02 for the Broncos. Made nine tackles (8 solo) and one sack (-1 yds.) at Oak. 10/10/99. In 11 career games (11 starts) vs. Oak., recorded 84 tackles (66 solo) and 2.5 sacks (-6 yds.).

BRONCOS/RAIDERS FESTIVITIES

Performing the national anthem is the 17th Avenue Allstars. Celebrating their 16th year as Colorado's premier vocal group, their extensive repertoire includes popular music and '50s doo wop, presented in an energetic and family-oriented show. Group honors include National A Cappella Champions and three-time western regional winners of the Harmony Sweepstakes held in San Francisco.

THE LAST TIME

WEEK 6: DENVER 31, at OAKLAND 3 (NETWORK ASSOCIATES COLISEUM, 10/17/04)

The Broncos dominated on both sides of the ball to improve to 5-1 on the season with a 31-3 victory over rival Oakland in front of 62,507 at the Network Associates Coliseum.

Quarterback Jake Plummer tossed three touchdowns and Reuben Droughns rushed for 176 yards on 38 carries to pace the Denver offensive attack while the Broncos' top-ranked defense shut down the Raiders, limiting them to just 145 total yards.

The Raiders scored first with a 35-yard Sebastian Janikowski field goal, which was set up after linebacker Marques Anderson intercepted a Jake Plummer pass early in the first quarter.

The Broncos responded quickly on the ensuing drive as Plummer found tight end Jeb Putzier in the end zone for a 12-yard score to give his team a 7-3 lead.

Denver wasted no time after getting the ball back at the start of the second quarter as they put together a seven-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to tight end Dwayne Carswell.

Plummer threw his third touchdown pass of the first half, a 31-yard strike to wide receiver Ashley Lelie, with 4:03 remaining in the second quarter to give Denver a commanding 21-3 advantage.

After Jason Elam booted a 33-yard field goal increasing the Broncos lead in the third quarter, Droughns capped off the scoring with a 4-yard touchdown run, the second rushing touchdown of his career.

Plummer finished the day 11-of-20 passing for 190 yards, three touchdowns and a 106.2 passer rating, while Putzier led all receivers with three receptions for 52 yards and a touchdown in the game.

The victory, Denver's fourth consecutive of the season, also marked Denver's fourth straight win over the Raiders and bumped Mike Shanahan's record to 15-4 overall against Oakland.

- Broncos head coach **Mike Shanahan** was the head coach of the Los Angeles Raiders from 1988-89.

Chukwurah contributed to Denver's win over New Orleans with a 12-yard sack of Aaron Brooks and great pressure on the quarterback that led to Al Wilson's interception return for a score. WEEK 11: DENVER 34, at NEW ORLEANS 13 (LOUISIANA SUPERDOME, 11/21/04)

The Broncos raced out to a 20-0 first quarter lead and never looked back en route to a 34-13 victory over the New Orleans Saints before a crowd of 64,900 at the Louisiana Superdome.

Denver, which improved to 7-3 on the season, wasted no time jumping on the Saints' defense as running back Reuben Droughns busted out for a 51-yard touchdown run on the team's first offensive play of the game. After the defense forced New Orleans to punt, the Broncos offense needed just three plays to score as quarterback Jake Plummer found wide receiver Ashley Lelie for a 37-yard touchdown pass, increasing the lead to 14-0. Jason Elam kicked field goals of 48 and 34 yards to cap off scoring in the 20-0 first quarter for Denver.

Kicker John Carney got New Orleans on the scoreboard with a 24-yard field goal in the second quarter, and on the Saints' next possession, on 3rd-and-8, Denver's defense put pressure on Saints quarterback Aaron Brooks, forcing a wild throw right into the hands of linebacker Al Wilson, who returned the ball 7 yards for a touchdown. It was Denver's first defensive touchdown of the season and the first interception return for a touchdown in Wilson's career.

A 30-yard touchdown pass from Brooks to wide receiver Donte Stallworth and another field goal by Carney brought New Orleans to within 14 points (27-13) at halftime.

The Broncos capped a 12-play, 76-yard scoring drive early in the fourth quarter with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to fullback Kyle Johnson, his second touchdown reception of the season, to give Denver a commanding 34-13 advantage.

The Saints threatened to score on the next drive moving down to the Denver's 7-yard line, but Broncos cornerback Champ Bailey made an acrobatic diving interception in the end zone on 4th-and-2 to deny the Saints another score. The Saints were again poised to reach the end zone near the end of the fourth quarter, but defensive end Reggie Hayward grabbed Denver's season-high third interception of the game and returned it 76 yards before being brought down at the 5-yard line, ending any threat of a comeback.

Droughns rushed for 166 yards rushing on 28 carries, marking his fifth 100-yard rushing game in six starts at running back this season. Plummer completed 19-of-29 passes for 224 yards and two touchdowns and a passer rating of 111.9.

HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN MONDAY QUOTES

Injury update after the New Orleans game

"Nothing serious. It shouldn't affect anybody. A couple bumps and bruises, but I think we're in pretty good shape. Nobody should be kept out of the game."

On if safety John Lynch came out of the game healthy

"Yes, he did. He only played like 14 or 15 plays. Our game plan was to play him in base (defense). When they got behind, they played a lot of three wide and four wide-receiver sets, so he didn't play as much as we thought he would going into the game. But he felt good, and I think it will wind up being good for us, too. I think he'll be refreshed and ready to go for next week."

On the injury to punter Micah Knorr in the Saints' game

"It was just a bruise (left leg). He just got hit from the side a little bit. He's a little bit sore right now, but nothing that should keep him out of the game."

On if the hit on Knorr was dirty

"No, it was a good hit. A legal hit. A lot of times those punters aren't used to getting hit like that. Looks like he'll be all right."

On Champ Bailey's diving interception

"I kind of get used to it. I see it consistently in practice. I see a corner making plays that most human beings can't make. He's got great speed. He's got fantastic hands. He's got awareness. He'll support the run. He can play the deep ball. He can play the short ball. You can see his speed catching up to the ball in the end zone. Not only did he catch the ball, but he got his feet down. He's just an amazing athlete."

On if Bailey has exceeded his expectations

"Like I say, you never know anybody until they come into the organization and you get a chance to work with them. Now there's a lot of great athletes, but you don't know the character of people until they work with you on a day-to-day basis. You don't know how they prepare. You don't know how they influence other people around them. He's just been a joy to be around. He's got a complete game. He handles himself like a pro with his preparation and influences young players. They see the standard that he sets and I think it carries over to the rest of our defensive backs. It's a pretty high standard, but those younger players know that if he works that hard and he prepares himself that way then that's what they're supposed to be doing. So, he's been a great influence to our defense."

On RB Tatum Bell's special teams play

"It gives you an idea of, number one, how fast he is. He's got the ability to make big-time plays. When Terrell Davis came in, he was player of the game, I believe, his first game. Football players make plays. You know, Reuben Droughns. He played the fullback position and was always a consistent special teams player. So, it's a good sign for Tatum. He's shown some toughness. He wants to be out there and he wants to make plays. When he gets comfortable with our system and we'll give him some opportunities to play tailback."

On the progression of rookie Tatum Bell as a running back

"It is hard to get a No. 2 spot unless you earn it. You don't do it in practice; You do it in the games. Garrison Hearst has done a great job for us. I think we all know what Garrison has done, and what he means to this football team. Sooner or later, Tatum will get in there and he'll get his opportunities, and when he does, hopefully he'll take advantage of it."

On the Broncos' red-zone offense

"To be honest with you, I don't think we have been as good as we could be. I think the last game (New Orleans) we were pretty good. I'd like to be more consistent. We have been (consistent) over the years. I think our players are starting to feel more confidence. We have some guys that switched around into different positions, and it does take some time. Last week, and in our last three or four games, we have scored some points and moved the football. Hopefully we can keep that going."

On RB Reuben Droughns' level of play

"Well Reuben didn't play one of his better games against New Orleans. He played a good game, a solid game, but it was not one of his better games. It just shows you what he is capable of doing when he puts one of his better games together. He played a solid game, and I was proud of him because he didn't turn the ball over and played hard. I expect Reuben to play like that."

On FB Kyle Johnson's improvement

"Kyle has done a good job. It first starts on special teams. He earned himself a position by making a difference on special teams, and that gave him an opportunity to play fullback. If he didn't help us on special teams, he would have never been out on the field. Once he proved he could help us there, we had to dress him. Once you dress a guy because he has helped you on special teams, you want to give him a few reps at the fullback position. We had some injuries, and he proved when he got his opportunity that he could block and made some good catches and big plays for us."

On the performance of QB Jake Plummer on Sunday

"Jake played exceptionally well in that game (New Orleans). He made some good decisions and some great throws. He managed the game very well. He is playing with a lot of confidence."

On Jimmy Spencer's first game as defensive backs coach

"Jimmy did good. I thought Jimmy did a great job, and so did (Assistant Defensive Backs Coach) Kirk (Doll), who's also working with the secondary."

On DE Trevor Pryce

"It's kind of day-by-day with Trevor. He is still getting rehab and getting stronger. (Head trainer Steve Antonopulos) feels like he is getting better, but he still has that problem with the nerve where he can't push off. We are keeping our fingers crossed, but we don't know anything more than last week."

On DT Luther Elliss, who injured his calf muscle last week

"His calf is getting better. It had to; He was on crutches the day after, and it was pretty black and blue. With those calfs, you are not really sure. He will get treatment this week, but Antonopulos feels like there is an outside chance that he will be ready. To say that at this time, I think is a little premature. I think we have to wait a couple days and see what he does on Wednesday, if he is able to jog, those types of things."

On the play of LB Patrick Chukwurah against the Saints

"He played really good. Patrick did a great job on special teams. Any time you have 60 passes in a game, guys get tired. He had 22 reps rushing the passer. I thought he played exceptionally hard. You could see his quickness out there. I really like the way he played throughout the game, both defense and special teams."

BRONCOS HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN

Mike Shanahan in 2004 completes a full decade as head coach of the Denver Broncos, and that decade of measurement against the game's all-time coaches places him among the pro football elite. After the team's 23-13 win over San Diego (9/26), he joined the exclusive club of head coaches to post 100 wins in the first 10 seasons with one club.

No head coach in the NFL has won more games than Mike Shanahan's 105 victories since the start of the 1995 season. Those 105 wins by Shanahan include seven straight in the playoffs (he is the only coach to have produced seven playoff wins in two years) during the 1997 and 1998 World Championship seasons, years in which he firmly established himself among the game's sideline greats. His postseason percentage of .700, on a 7-3 record, is second only to Vince Lombardi (9-1, .900) among coaches with more than five playoff victories.

Under Shanahan's guidance, Denver has: Posted the most wins in pro football history in a two-year period (33 in 1997-98); posted the most wins in pro football history in a three-year period (46 in 1996-98); won the most postseason games ever in a two-year period (seven, 1997-98); won 18 straight games over 1997-98 to tie the all-time NFL record for consecutive wins; been undefeated for three straight regular seasons at home (1996-98), just the second team ever to do so; and posted a 22-2 record in its last 24 games during the back-to-back title years.

He produced consecutive Super Bowl titles, three straight 13-plus win seasons (including postseason), and two AFC West titles from 1996-98. Shanahan led Denver to a 14-2 regular season mark and a 3-0 postseason mark in 1998, taking the Broncos back to the victorious Super Bowl glory they experienced in 1997. In his third season with the Broncos in 1997, Shanahan not only led the Broncos back to the Super Bowl for the first time in eight years, but he directed them to their first ever Super Bowl victory. Only Red Miller (1st year) in 1977 got a Broncos' team to the Super Bowl faster than Shanahan did.

In his 10th year with Denver, he has fashioned a franchise-record regular season home mark of **60-17 (.779)**, a regular season mark of **98-56 (.636)**, and an overall mark of **105-59 (.640)**. His NFL record as a head coach in regular season play is **106-68 (.609)** and his overall record is **113-71 (.614)**.

Over the last 12 years (ninth in Denver and the previous three in San Francisco) Mike Shanahan's offenses have finished number one in the NFL four times, second twice and third twice; in two of those campaigns Denver was just 17 yards and 83 yards short of the number one spot.

In 1998 the defending world champions stormed to their second straight title with an offense that scored 501 points and finished third in the NFL in total yards, while the defense had another spectacular postseason, allowing just 25 points and two touchdowns while sparking a remarkable 13-1 turnover ratio in the playoffs.

In 1997 he directed a Denver offense that scored a total of 583 points (29.2 per game) during the entire 1997 season, the fifth highest total in NFL history and the second highest total in AFC history for a combined regular and postseason. Of course, in 1998 Shanahan's Broncos topped that mark by producing 596 regular and postseason points. The all-time high of 636 points came from the 1994 World Champion San Francisco 49ers, for whom Shanahan was the offensive coordinator.

He led his team to a 12-4 regular season record in 1997, marking the first time in franchise history that the team won 12 or more games in back-to-back seasons.

During his NFL career, Shanahan has been a part of teams that have played in nine conference Championship Games, in addition to his six Super Bowl appearances (three victories), five with Denver and Super Bowl XXIX with San Francisco. In his 26 seasons as a pro and college coach, Shanahan's teams have participated in postseason or bowl games 21 times. Shanahan is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University, and also has a master's degree from that institution.

RAIDERS HEAD COACH NORV TURNER

Norv Turner is in his first season as head coach of The Oakland Raiders. Turner, 52, has 19 years of pro coaching experience—seven as a head coach and six as an offensive coordinator in the NFL. Turner was Washington's head coach from 1994-00 and directed the Redskins to four winning campaigns, including two in a row (1999 and 2000). His 1999 Redskins claimed their first NFC Eastern Division title since 1991. During his seven-year tenure in Washington, he led the Redskins to a regular-season record of 49-59-1. The Redskins went 1-1 in the 1999 postseason.

That season, the Redskins offense finished the year as the league's second-ranked unit. Turner has an 8-6 record versus coaches who were in the playoffs in 2003. Turner, who grew up in Martinez, California, has been regarded as one of the NFL's finest offensive coaches in his role as offensive coordinator for the Dallas Cowboys, San Diego Chargers and Miami Dolphins as well as head coach of the Redskins.

Turner was on Jimmy Johnson's Dallas coaching staff from 1991-93, where as the offensive coordinator he helped lead the Cowboys to two straight World Championships with wins in Super Bowl XXVII following the 1992 season and Super Bowl XXVIII following the 1993 season. Turner began his NFL coaching career as an assistant with the L.A. Rams in 1985.

Turner began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Oregon in 1975. The following year, he moved on to the University of Southern California where, for the next nine seasons, he served as the Trojans receivers coach (1976-79), defensive backs coach (1980), quarterbacks coach (1981-83) and offensive coordinator (1984).

Turner was a three-year letterman (1972-74) as a quarterback at the University of Oregon, spending two seasons behind NFL Hall of Fame quarterback Dan Fouts. Turner and his wife, Nancy, have three children, Scott, Stephanie and Drew.

BRONCOS CHAMPIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

The Denver Broncos honored their nominees for the Walter Payton Man of the Year 2004 awards at a private dinner on Thursday, Nov. 18. Jake Plummer, John Lynch, Rod Smith and Al Wilson were chosen and their community work was presented to a committee that chose Rod Smith as the organization's overall award winner. Smith will be the team's nomination for the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year award.

The Walter Payton Man of the Year award NFL's most prestigious off-field honor and is the only league honor bestowed on players who demonstrate excellence in their civic and professional responsibilities. The award is given at the end of each season to the NFL player who best provides leadership for his teammates on the gridiron and his fellow citizens in the community. The NFL will announce the 2004 Walter Payton Man of the Year at the Super Bowl.

The Denver Broncos hosted the first-ever Broncos Bowl presented by Verizon SuperPages on Nov. 13 at INVESCO Field at Mile High. Championship games for all four of the Denver Police Activities League age divisions (7 to 14 year-olds) were up for grabs. Broncos players and alumni were on hand as honorary coaches throughout the event. In addition, the Denver Broncos Cheerleaders will hosted an on-field clinic for Denver PAL cheerleaders followed by a special tribute to Denver PAL and all 2,000 of its youth football players.

The Denver Broncos and John Lynch Foundation's Lynch's Leaders program held another leadership forum for select Boys and Girls Clubs of Metro Denver members discussing corporate America at the Cope Boys and Girls Club Branch on Nov. 15.

The Oct. 31 game vs. Atlanta was dedicated to the Broncos Boys and Girls Club. John Arigoni, President and CEO of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Metro Denver, was presented with a check from Cindy Galloway, Denver Broncos Vice President of Community Development during a pre-game ceremony. In addition, a new public service announcement about the Club featuring Broncos Ring of Famer Billy Thompson aired during the game and 50 members of the Broncos Boys and Girls Club attended the game courtesy of the Broncos.

Bonfils Blood Center and the Denver Broncos teamed up to present Colorado's largest single-day community blood drive. Drive for Life 7 kicked off Tuesday, Oct. 19 at INVESCO Field at Mile High. More than 2,300 people attended last year's drive that boasts Rod Smith as its spokesperson. Rod's daughter Vanessa suffers from sickle cell anemia and receives regular blood transfusions that help her live a better life. In addition to having four different running backs rush for over 1,000 yards in a season (Terrell Davis, Olandis Gary, Mike Anderson and Clinton Portis), the Broncos are tops in the NFL with most individual 100-yard games with 73, including five in

The Broncos won their season opener for the fourth straight year by defeating division rival Kansas City, 34-24, in front of 75,939 fans at INVESCO Field at Mile High and a national television audience on ESPN's Sunday Night Football. Second-year running back Quentin Griffin, in just his second career start, led the Broncos charge with three touchdowns (2 rush, 1 rec) and 156 yards rushing on 23 carries, setting a new franchise record for rushing yards in a season opener. Kansas City jumped on Denver early after running back Priest Holmes' 2-yard touchdown run completed an eight-play, 80-yard drive on the game's opening drive.

After a 43-yard field goal by Jason Elam narrowed the gap for the Broncos, Denver took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter when quarterback Jake Plummer hit Griffin for a 1-yard touchdown. The Broncos defense stuffed the Chiefs once again to regain the ball, setting the stage for Griffin's second touchdown—a 25-yard scamper in which the tailback slashed through several defenders en route to the end zone.

Denver opened the second half with a 17-7 lead, but the Chiefs quickly got back in the game after capitalizing on two Broncos turnovers. Plummer's first pass of the half was intercepted by Kansas City linebacker Monty Beisel, setting up a 50-yard field goal by Lawrence Tynes. On the Broncos' next possession, a solid Kansas City pass rush on third down forced Plummer to errantly heave the ball in the air and right into the hands of linebacker Shawn Barber deep in Broncos' territory. The Chiefs took advantage when Holmes scored his second touchdown on the contest on a 4-yard run tying the score at 17-7.

Griffin stepped up once again on Denver's next drive, as he burst up the middle for a 47-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career. Holmes' day was not finished, however, as he tied the game on a 33-yard touchdown run, his third of the game, to knot the score at 24-24.

Elam helped the Broncos regain the lead after he booted a 45-yard field goal, and on the Kansas City's next possession, Denver's defense forced the Chiefs to punt. The Broncos responded with a 13-play, 87-yard drive that burned 7:10 on the clock and was capped by a 2-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to tight end Patrick Hape, securing the win for the Broncos.

Denver's offense amassed 413 total yards, including 202 on the ground. Defensive back Champ Bailey was solid in his Broncos debut, notching his 19th career interception in the second quarter and also doubled up as a wide receiver, catching one pass for 11 yards.

The Broncos fell to 1-1 on the season after a 7-6 defeat at the hands of the Jacksonville Jaguars in front of 69,127 at ALLTEL Stadium.

Despite statistically dominating the contest in terms of total yards, time of possession and first downs, the Broncos failed to reach the end zone and committed a costly turnover with seconds remaining in the fourth quarter.

Jacksonville scored the game's only touchdown with 12:39 left in the second quarter as Byron Lettwich found wide receiver Ernest Wilford for a 12-yard touchdown pass to give the Jaguars a 7-0 lead.

Two Jason Elam field goals (44, 22) narrowed the gap to 7-6 at the end of the first half for the Broncos.

Neither squad could sustain a drive for most of the second half as a total of eight punts were forced by the two defenses.

Denver missed an opportunity to take the lead with 36 seconds remaining in the third quarter after Elam's 51-yard attempt into the wind fell just short.

The Broncos struggled with poor field position in the fourth quarter, starting on their own two, 10, and 11-yard lines in their final three possessions of the game.

With no timeouts remaining and 2:20 left in the game, Broncos quarterback Jake Plummer took control of the offense on Denver's 11-yard line and marched downfield with four straight completions, including a key 20-yard strike to Nate Jackson.

Plummer then scrambled for nine yards and ducked out-of-bounds on the Jacksonville 26-yard line.

After running back Quentin Griffin picked up the first down on a two-yard run, Plummer spiked the ball to stop the clock at 1:07.

Two more Griffin runs brought up third down on the Jaguars 23-yard line with 37 seconds remaining.

On the next play, a bad exchange between Plummer and Griffin resulted in a fumble that was recovered by Jacksonville's Akin Ayodele, halting the Broncos' comeback bid.

Plummer completed 23-of-39 passes for 250 yards while Griffin finished with 66 yards on 25 carries. Veteran wideout Rod Smith led all receivers with six receptions for 83 yards.

A stingy defensive effort and a 294-yard passing day by quarterback Jake Plummer helped the Broncos improve to 2-1 with a 23-13 victory over the San Diego Chargers before a crowd of 74,533 at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

Denver scored first on its second drive of the game, as Plummer connected with wide receiver Rod Smith for a 16-yard touchdown to cap off a six-play, 72-yard drive to give the Broncos a 7-0 lead.

Holding on to a 10-3 lead early in the second quarter, the Broncos forced a fumble after safety Keny Kennedy sacked San Diego quarterback Drew Brees and defensive tackle Mario Fatatehi scooped up the ball on the Chargers' 36-yard line. Fatatehi's 8-yard return to the Chargers' 29-yard line helped set up an eventual 23-yard Jason Elam field goal to give Denver a 13-3 lead.

In the second half, a Quentin Griffin fumble on Denver's second play of the third quarter yielded a seven-play, 36-yard drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by Brees to close the gap to 13-10.

On the ensuing drive, the Chargers forced the Broncos to punt, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave Denver new life and the ball on San Diego's 34-yard line. After the Chargers' defense forced Denver into another 4th-down situation, the Broncos opted to go for it, and the result was a 33-yard touchdown strike from Plummer to wide receiver Ashley Lelie to give the Broncos a 20-10 advantage. Elam's 43-yard field goal on the Broncos' second drive of the fourth quarter gave Denver a 23-13 lead they would hold on to.

The Broncos kept San Diego star running back LaDainian Tomlinson in check for most of the contest, limiting the All-Pro to just 60 yards rushing, his lowest rushing output in his last 15 games.

Smith led all receivers with five catches for 75 yards while Plummer completed 25 of 36 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 112.5.

The Broncos improved to 3-1 with a hard-fought 16-13 road victory over Tampa Bay before a crowd of 65,341 at Raymond James Stadium.

The game marked the return of Broncos safety John Lynch to the city in which he played 11 years, and the team he helped lead to a World Championship in 2002.

Denver struck first after a hit by safety Kenoy Kennedy forced Bucs receiver Charles Lee to fumble the ball which was recovered by cornerback Willie Middlebrooks. The Broncos capped off a 43-yard drive with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Jake Plummer to tight end Patrick Happe to take a 7-0 lead.

Early in the second quarter, Denver increased its lead to 10-0 after Plummer hit tight end Jeb Putzier for a 28-yard completion, setting up a 49-yard field goal by Jason Elam. Tampa Bay countered on its next drive when Brad Johnson found wide receiver Michael Clayton for a 51-yard field pass.

After Elam's second field goal of the game (50-yards) gave Denver a 13-7 lead, the Buccaneers mounted a 62-yard drive which culminated in a Martin Gramatica field goal from 28 yards out, cutting the score to 13-10 at halftime.

On their first possession of the second half, the Buccaneers drove down to the Denver 16-yard line, but Denver's defense stepped up, and held Tampa Bay to a 30-yard Gramatica field goal that knotted the game at 13.

In the fourth quarter, however, the Broncos showed their dominance, as they constructed an 84-yard drive that chewed up 6:32 on the clock, and resulted in a 23-yard field goal by Elam, which proved to be the game-winner.

Tampa Bay's Jameel White returned the ensuing kickoff 44-yards to the Bucs' 45-yard line, but the Denver's defense once again took control. Middlebrooks knocked down a Johnson pass, attempt to wide receiver Tim Brown on 3rd-and-3, forcing Tampa Bay to punt. Denver's offense then insured the win as they killed over seven minutes of the clock, before giving Tampa Bay the ball with just three seconds left in the game. Denver limited the Buccaneers to just 7 yards of total offense in the fourth quarter, and dominated the time of possession (13:20 to 1:40).

In his return to Tampa Bay, Lynch put in a solid effort, delivering several punishing hits and recording seven tackles and two passes defended. Rookie linebacker D.J. Williams aided the solid defensive effort, leading the team with nine tackles.

After a slow start—just 12 yards rushing in the first-half—Quentin Griffin finished strong with 66 yards, including 48 coming in the fourth quarter.

Running back Reuben Droughns rumbled for 193 rushing yards and Ashley Lelie caught a key fourth-quarter touchdown pass to help the Broncos start 4-1 for the third straight year, with a 20-17 win over the NFC Defending Champion Carolina Panthers before a crowd of 75,072 at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

Droughns—making his first career start at running back in place of the injured Quentin Griffin—proved there would be no drop-off in production, when on the first Denver run led to a Jason Elam 32-yard field goal.

After the Broncos defense forced a Carolina punt, an eight-play, 62-yard drive yielded another Elam field goal, this time from 33-yards out to give his team an early 6-0 lead in the first quarter.

The Panthers would take the lead in the second quarter on a 26-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Jake Delhomme to wide receiver Kenny Colbert. But, after John Kasay booted a 53-yard field goal, increasing Carolina's lead to 10-6, the Broncos drove 76 yards in seven plays and regained the lead with a touchdown. Quarterback Jake Plummer hit Droughns on a 5-yard pass, and Denver took a 13-10 lead.

On the Broncos' first drive of the second half, the team was poised to score after driving down to the Carolina 1-yard line, but Plummer threw an interception to defensive end Julius Peppers on 4th-and-goal. Peppers returned the pick 101 yards and was brought down at the 3-yard-line by Rod Smith. The Panthers would score on a one-yard run by Delhomme to give his team a 17-13 lead after the longest non-scoring interception return in NFL history by Peppers.

Despite the setback, Plummer took charge on the team's first possession of the fourth quarter, and on 3-and-7 from Carolina's 57-yard line, Plummer fired a pass in to the end zone for Lelie, who jumped and made an acrobatic grab for what would prove to be the game-winning score.

Carolina had a chance to tie the game at 20 with a 42-yard field goal attempt, but a false start penalty on Rich Tyski followed by an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on Matt Willing for throwing the flag at the referee, pushed the Panthers out of field goal range forcing them to punt. The Broncos got the ball back with 6:42 remaining and sustained a drive which ran out the clock. The drive was highlighted by a key 14-yard reception by rookie receiver Darius Watts, converting a key 3rd-and-3.

Droughns' 193 yards on the ground was the ninth best rushing total in franchise history, and the most by a Broncos back in his starting debut at the position.

With Elam's second field goal of the game, he became the 16th player in NFL history to hit 300 career field goals, and the fastest ever to reach the feat, needing only 177 games (John Carney held the previous record at 188 games).

The Broncos dominated on both sides of the ball to improve to 5-1 on the season with a 31-3 victory over rival Oakland in front of 62,507 at the Network Associates Coliseum.

Quarterback Jake Plummer tossed three touchdowns and Reuben Droughins rushed for 176 yards on 38 carries to pace the Denver offense attack while the Broncos' top-ranked defense shut down the Raiders, limiting them to just 145 total yards. The Raiders scored first with a 35-yard Sebastian Janikowski field goal, which was set up after linebacker Marques Anderson intercepted a Jake Plummer pass early in the first quarter.

The Broncos responded quickly on the ensuing drive as Plummer found tight end Jeb Putzier in the end zone for a 12-yard score to give his team a 7-3 lead.

Denver wasted no time after getting the ball back at the start of the second quarter as they put together a seven-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 10-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to tight end Dwayne Carswell.

Plummer threw his third touchdown pass of the first half, a 31-yard strike to wide receiver Ashley Leite, with 4:03 remaining in the second quarter to give Denver a commanding 21-3 advantage.

After Jason Elam booted a 33-yard field goal increasing the Broncos lead in the third quarter, Droughins capped off the scoring with a 4-yard touchdown run, the second rushing touchdown of his career.

Plummer finished the day 11-of-20 passing for 190 yards, three touchdowns and a 106.2 passer rating, while Putzier led all receivers with three receptions for 52 yards and a touchdown in the game.

The victory, Denver's fourth consecutive of the season, also marked Denver's fourth straight win over the Raiders and bumped Mike Shanahan's record to 15-4 overall against Oakland.

The Broncos suffered their second loss of the season at the hands of the Cincinnati Bengals, 23-10, before a national audience on ABC's *Monday Night Football* and a record crowd of 65,806 at Paul Brown Stadium.

The Bengals struck first in the opening quarter when quarterback Carson Palmer found a wide open Chad Johnson for a 50-yard touchdown pass. He got so open after cornerback Champ Bailey tripped while in man coverage, freeing up the receiver on the play. The Broncos' defense held strong in the first half despite falling behind early as they stuffed Bengals running back Rudi Johnson on a 4th-and-1 attempt on Denver's 5-yard line. Cincinnati drove into the red zone once again on their next possession, but Bailey picked off a Palmer pass intended for Johnson at the 4-yard line to halt the drive.

Unfortunately, Denver's offense was unable to capitalize on the turnover, giving the ball back to the Bengals with an interception of their own, by former Broncos cornerback DeShaun O'Neal. Cincinnati made Denver pay for the turnover, as kicker Shayne Graham booted a 53-yard field goal to give the Bengals a 10-0 lead in the second quarter.

On their next drive, the Broncos capped off an eight-play, 72-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to wide receiver Rod Smith, narrowing the Bengals' lead to 10-7.

In waning moments of the first half, running back Reuben Droughins coughed the ball up, and Cincinnati would capitalize, with a 34-yard Graham field goal to take a 13-7 advantage into the locker room.

A 29-yard field goal by kicker Jason Eam brought the Broncos to within three points in the third quarter (13-10), but Johnson's 36-yard touchdown run two drives later gave the Bengals a 20-10 lead.

Graham hit a 35-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to round out scoring, which was set up by Plummer's second interception of the game.

For the third consecutive week, Droughins eclipsed the century mark in rushing yards, racking up 110 on 24 carries (4.7). Plummer finished the game 23 of 40 passing for 221 yards and a touchdown, but threw two interceptions.

Smith—who caught five passes for 50 yards—eclipsed the 9,000 career receiving yardage mark on his second catch of the game, becoming 31st player in NFL history to achieve this mark.

Despite a record-setting day offensively for the Broncos, the Atlanta Falcons rallied from an early 14-3 deficit to top Denver, 41-28, in front of 75,083 fans at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

The Broncos jumped out to a 7-0 lead on the game's first drive, as quarterback Jake Plummer found tight end Patrick Hape for a one-yard touchdown. After Atlanta's Jay Feely kicked a 24-yard field goal, Denver needed just one play on the ensuing drive to reach pay dirt as Plummer connected with Rod Smith for an 80-yard touchdown, the longest reception of the veteran receiver's career. The pass also tied Plummer's career-long.

The Falcons would narrow Denver's lead to 14-10 on a 21-yard touchdown run by T.J. Duckett, and after Plummer was intercepted on a tipped pass by Patrick Kerney, Vick led his team down field for a 34-yard strike to Peerless Price in the end zone to put Atlanta ahead, 17-14. Plummer's second interception, on the next drive, would yield a 43-yard field goal by Feely near the end of the first half, and a 20-14 lead.

On Atlanta's first possession of the third quarter, Broncos linbacker Al Wilson sacked Vick on a third-and-5, but the play was negated by a defensive holding call on cornerback Lemmy Walls. The drive was extended, and the Falcons capitalized with Warrick Dunn's 5-yard touchdown run, giving Atlanta a 27-14 advantage.

Following a 25-yard touchdown pass from Vick to Price to start of the fourth quarter (34-14), the Broncos closed the gap as Plummer tossed a 7-yard touchdown pass to Darius Watts. Denver had a chance to make it a one-touchdown game on its next possession, as they drove to Atlanta's 7-yard line, but Watts could not handle a Plummer pass in the end zone on fourth down, ending the Broncos hopes of a comeback.

Plummer finished the day by completing 31-of-55 passes for a career-high and Broncos' record 499 yards passing and tied his personal best with four touchdown passes, but threw three interceptions. Smith also set a career high with 208 yards receiving on nine receptions, which ranks as the franchise's second-best single game output (214 by Shannon Sharpe vs. Kansas City 10/20/02).

- He ranks third in the AFC (tied for 7th in NFL) with 2,506 passing yards and ranks third in the AFC (8th in NFL) with 196 completions.
- In only 10 games this season, Plummer has set a single-season career high in touchdown passes with 21 (he previously threw 18 touchdowns in 2001 and 2002 with the Cardinals).
- His 21 touchdown passes rank second in the AFC (4th in NFL).
- Plummer became only the second quarterback in Broncos history (Craig Morton in 1981) to throw eight touchdowns in a two-game span with four scoring passes vs. Hou. (11/7) and vs. Atl. (10/31).
- His four touchdown passes vs. Hou. (11/7) tied a career high and marked his fourth-career four-touchdown game to help him achieve a single-game career-best 137.8 passer rating.
- In throwing for 499 yards vs. Atl. (10/31), Plummer posted the ninth-highest single-game yardage total in NFL history and the highest single-game total in Broncos history.
- His 499 passing yards vs. Atl. (10/31) marked the highest single-game passing total of any quarterback this season.
- His 80-yard touchdown strike to Rod Smith vs. Atl. (10/31) tied for the longest completion of his career (he also threw an 80-yd TD pass at St. Louis 12/15/02).
- Plummer's come-from-behind win vs. Car. (10/10) was his 25th career game-winning or game-tying scoring drive in the fourth quarter or overtime. Of those 25, 19 are "pure" comeback victories, which comprise the highest total of any NFL quarterback since 1995.
- Including this season's totals, Plummer is 16-5 (76.2%) as a Broncos starter (2003-present) during the regular season, marking the third-highest winning percentage of any NFL quarterback during that period (Tom Brady, 22-3, 88.0% and Donovan McNabb, 21-5, 81.8%).
- He threw three touchdowns in the first half vs. Hou. (11/7), marking the fourth time in his career he has accomplished that feat in a half (1st half at Oak. 10/17/04, 1st half at S.D. 9/14/03 and 2nd half vs. Det. 11/18/01).
- Plummer was voted an offensive co-captain by his teammates, joining receiver Rod Smith in that role.

2004 Regular Season:

Plummer's creativity behind center has resulted in several miraculous performances this season as he has completed 196-of-331 passes (59.2%) for 2,506 yards with 21 touchdowns and 10 interceptions in starting all 10 games. **An offensive co-captain for the Broncos, Plummer ranks third in the AFC (tied for 7th in NFL) in passing yards and ranks third in the AFC (8th in NFL) in completions.** His touchdown total, a single-season career high, ranks second in the AFC (4th in NFL). He was extremely efficient in Denver's game at N.O. (11/21) and finished the day throwing for two touchdown passes, which moved him ahead of Steve Ramsey for seventh place on the Broncos' all-time touchdown passes list (35), and 224 yards on 19-of-29 (65.5%) passing. His play resulted in a 111.9 passer rating, which was his second consecutive game with a passer rating more than 100.0, and a Denver score on its first four possessions to give it a 20-0 first-quarter lead. Against the Saints, he tossed back-to-back passes of 30 or more yards (33 and 37 yds.) on a first-quarter drive to Ashley Lelie with the latter strike a touchdown pass. He concluded Denver's scoring when he connected with fullback Kyle Johnson in stride for a 19-yard score that earned him his seventh multiple-touchdown game this season. **Plummer became only the second quarterback in Broncos history (Craig Morton in 1981) to throw eight touchdowns in a two-game span** with stellar outings vs. Hou. (11/7) and vs. Atl. (10/31). In throwing for four touchdowns and 234 yards in a 16-of-24 performance vs. Hou. (11/7), **Plummer set a single-game career best with a 137.8 passer rating.** He connected with four different Denver players on his scoring passes,

including a second-quarter strike to Rod Smith that moved the receiver into first place all-time in touchdowns by a Bronco. Plummer made a brilliant read on Smith's record-setting touchdown as he pump faked, scampered toward the line of scrimmage and found a wide open Smith in the left corner of the end zone. He also connected with Smith on a 9-yard pass in the second quarter to give Smith more receptions than any other player in franchise history. **He posted the ninth-highest single-game yardage mark in NFL history and set a franchise record with 499 passing yards** on 31-of-55 passing (56.3%) with four touchdowns and three interceptions vs. Atl. (10/31). His four touchdowns against the Falcons tied a career high and were spread out to four different receivers on scoring drives that were all 69 yards or longer, including an 80-yard TD strike to Rod Smith in the first quarter that tied for the longest completion of his career (he also threw an 80-yd. TD pass at St. Louis 12/15/02). Additionally, he moved ahead of Steve DeBerg for eighth place on the Broncos' all-time passing yards list against the Falcons. In Denver's lone Monday night appearance and 100th-career start at Cin. (10/25), Plummer completed 23-of-40 passes for 221 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. He moved into ninth place on the Broncos' all-time passing yardage list (ahead of Micky Slaughter) and passed Steve DeBerg for eighth place on the franchise's all-time completions list against the Bengals. He rolled to his right and found Rod Smith for a 3-yard score in the second quarter, marking the Broncos' only touchdown of the game in Cincinnati. He threw three touchdowns, all of which occurred in the first half, at Dak. (10/17) in passing for 190 yards on 11-of-20 passing with one interception to lead the Broncos' offense to 31 unanswered points. **Plummer led the Broncos to a 28-point win against the Raiders, the largest margin of victory in a road game against the Raiders in franchise history.** His performance at Oakland was his seventh career game with three or more touchdowns, and it marked the third contest in which he threw for three scores in a half. Plummer connected on two of his scoring passes to tight ends while also finding wide receiver Ashley Lelie for a 31-yard score. After throwing a pair of third-quarter interceptions vs. Car. (10/10), Plummer bounced back by directing the Broncos to his 19th-career comeback victory against the Panthers when his 39-yard touchdown pass in the corner of the end zone to Ashley Lelie capped off an 87-yard drive early in the final period. **His comeback against the Panthers marked his 25th game-winning or game-tying scoring drive in the fourth quarter or overtime.** He finished the game against the Panthers with 226 yards on 17-of-29 passing with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He guided Denver to a win at T.B. (10/3) with 138 yards on 13-of-30 passing with one touchdown and no interceptions. Plummer fooled the Buccaneers' defense on a bootleg before throwing a 5-yard score for Denver's lone touchdown. He efficiently managed Denver's offense in the fourth quarter against the Buccaneers as the Broncos held onto the ball for 13:20 in the final period, **ensuring Plummer of his 24th game-winning or game-tying scoring drive in the fourth quarter or overtime.** Plummer threw for a season-high 294 yards and two touchdowns on 25-of-36 passing (69.4%) vs. S.D. (9/26). His 294 passing yards were the most he's had in a game since Nov. 18, 2001, vs. Detroit. He threw a clutch 33-yard touchdown strike to wide receiver Ashley Lelie on fourth-and-9 in the third quarter with the Chargers trailing by only 3. **In the second quarter against the Chargers, he moved into 10th place on the Broncos' all-time passing yards list, ahead of John McCormick.** He threw for a then-season-high 250 yards on 23-of-39 passing with no touchdowns or interceptions at Jac. (9/19) while also scrambling for 24 yards on the ground. He hit wide receiver Ashley Lelie in stride for a 39-yard gain on the Broncos' 10-play, 76-yard drive at the end of the second half that set up Denver's second field goal of the game. Plummer directed the Broncos to a win in their season opener vs. K.C. (9/12) by completing 18-of-29 passes (with completions to eight different receivers) for a game-high 230 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He connected with WR Ashley Lelie for a 58-yard completion in the third quarter and also proved to be a threat on the ground, setting a career-high with eight rushes. Plummer led a pivotal 13-play, 87-yard touchdown drive late in the game that ate up 7:10 and resulted in a 2-yard touchdown pass to seal Denver's win. **The win was his 23rd career game-winning or game-tying fourth-quarter scoring drive in the fourth quarter or overtime.**

2004 Regular Season: Bell is steadily developing during his rookie season and has rushed 14 times for 57 yards (4.1 avg.) through eight games as a backup. He also recently has begun to show his ability on special teams, making four tackles on coverage units. He made a team-high three special teams tackles at N.O. (11/21) in a game that did not see him record a rushing statistic. He chased down Saints kick returner Michael Lewis on a second-quarter return during which Lewis used his elusiveness to gain 26 yards before Bell corralled him. Bell competed on special teams vs. Hou. (11/7). He was inactive for Denver's game vs. Atl. (10/31) with a hamstring injury suffered a week earlier. While he did not record a rush at Cin. (10/25) on Monday Night Football, the rookie contributed on special teams against the Bengals. Bell saw the most action he's seen all year at Oak. (10/17) by rushing six times for 25 yards (4.2 avg.). He was a factor on special teams against the Raiders, making the first tackle of his career on that unit. All of his yards against the Raiders came in relief of starter Reuben Droughns in the fourth quarter, including a 13-yard scamper around the left side on third-and-5. In Denver's comeback win vs. Car. (10/10), both of Bell's carries came in the first quarter to give the back a total of five yards for the game. At T.B. (10/3), Bell returned from the rib injury that kept him out of Denver's previous game to play on special teams only against the Buccaneers. He was inactive vs. S.D. In 10 games (9 starts), **Droughns leads the Broncos in rushing with 844 yards on 174 carries (4.9 avg.) with two touchdowns** while catching 23 passes for 167 yards (7.3 avg.) with a score. While only starting six games at running back, he already ranks eighth in the AFC in rushing. **Droughns is one of two players (Seattle's Shaun Alexander) in the NFL to rush for more than 150 yards on three or more occasions. He owns three of the top 12 rushing performances in the NFL this season (193 yds. vs. Car. 10/10, 176 yds. at Oak. 10/17 and 166 yds. at N.O. 11/21).** He has accounted for a team-high 56 first downs (46 rushing, 10 receiving) to rank fourth in the AFC (5th in NFL). Droughns was Denver's primary kick returner for its first five games and ranks fourth in the AFC (8th in NFL) in return average (25.2 avg.) with 13 returns for 327 yards. His production on special teams **earned him AFC Special Teams Player of the Month honors for September to mark the first time a Broncos kick return garnered that award.** Droughns' success on special teams extends to punt and kick coverage, where he has made four tackles to tie for fifth on the team. He recorded the longest run of his career on the Broncos' first play from scrimmage at N.O. (11/21) when he took off around the left side on a 51-yard touchdown run as part of the 166 yards he gained on 28 carries (5.9 avg.). Droughns, who also caught two passes for 25 yards against the Saints (12.5 avg.), was difficult to contain in the first half as he gained 106 yards (10.6 avg.) by halftime. He put up solid numbers vs. Hou. (11/7) by picking up 120 yards on 29 carries (4.1 avg.). Against the Texans, he gained nearly 40 yards each quarter in one of the most consistent performances of his career. While having a quiet day rushing the ball vs. Atl. (10/31) in only gaining 49 yards on 15 carries (3.3 avg.), Droughns posted a career-high six receptions and 63 yards receiving (10.5 avg.) against the Falcons. Most of his action against Atlanta came on the Broncos' opening drive of the game as he rushed five times for 17 yards and caught an 11-yard pass to help Denver score a touchdown on its first possession. He eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the third consecutive game at Cin. (10/25) on Monday Night Football, rushing for 110 yards on 24 carries (4.6 avg.). He also tied a career high with four receptions for 20 yards (5.0 avg.) against the Bengals. Droughns, who rushed for 49 yards in the second quarter and gained five yards or more on 10 of his final 12 rushes before halftime against the Bengals, did not carry the ball in the fourth quarter as the Broncos' attempted to rally from a 10-point deficit. He set a franchise record for most carries in a non-overtime game at Oak. (10/17) with 38 rushes for 176 yards (4.6 avg.) with one touchdown to earn **FedEx Ground NFL Player of the Week honors. His 38 carries in a game are the most by a running back in the NFL this season.** Droughns had 82 yards in the second quarter against the Raiders, including four runs of more than 10 yards, to help him record the first 100-yard half of his career (103 total yards). With regular starter Quentin Griffin inactive vs. Car. (10/10) with an ankle injury, Droughns took advantage of his first start at tailback as a Bronco by rushing for 193 yards on 30 carries (6.4 avg.) to mark the **highest rushing total by a Denver player in his first start at running back and the ninth-highest rushing total by a Broncos back in the regular season (10th in any game).** He registered most of his yards in bruising fashion, and it took several Panthers to bring him down on a 15-yard third-down run in the second quarter that set up his 5-yard receiving touchdown, which was his first score this season. **His career rushing day marked the second-highest single-game rushing output by an NFL back through Week 7.** Droughns also caught a career-high four passes for 18 yards while totaling 10 of the Broncos' 23 first downs (8 rushing, 2 receiving) against the Panthers. In addition to returning two kicks for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) at T.B. (10/3), he was used in short-yardage situations as well as on one-back sets and gained a season-high 20 yards on eight carries (2.5 avg.). He pulled Buccaneers defensive back Dwight Smith with him to pick up a tough third-and-1 with Denver at its 19-yard line late in a close game. Droughns gained a career-high 137 yards on four returns (34.3 avg.) vs. S.D. (9/26). All four of his returns that day went for 20 or more yards, including a 48-yarder. He also had a team-high three special teams tackles against San Diego. He returned two kicks for 49 yards (24.5 avg.) at Jac. (9/19) while catching his first pass of the year. His 2-yard reception converted a crucial third-and-1 in the third quarter with Denver trailing by 1. In the Broncos' season opener vs. K.C. (9/12), Droughns started at fullback, clearing the way for Quentin Griffin's franchise opening-day record 156 yards, and he was a major contributor on special teams despite battling leg cramps. **He returned two kicks for 58 yards (29.0 avg.) to lead all NFL Wk. 1 players in return yardage.** Droughns began Denver's first possession of the season with a 32-yard return.

- Griffin set a franchise record for most rushing yards in a season-opener with a career and game-high 156 yards on 23 carries vs. K.C. (9/12).
- He served as the Broncos' primary kick returner for two games, returning four kicks for 52 yards (13.0 avg.).

2004 Regular Season:

Griffin showed flashes of big-play ability in six games (four starts) at running back **before he was placed on injured reserve Oct. 27 with a torn ACL in his right knee, which was repaired Nov. 9.** Before the injury, he collected 311 yards on 85 carries (3.7 avg.) with two touchdowns while catching 10 passes for 68 yards (6.8 avg.) with a score. The elusive Griffin was used as the Broncos' primary kick returner for two games and gained 52 yards returning four kicks (13.0 avg.) He suffered a torn ACL in his right knee returning a kick on the opening kickoff of the second half at Cin. (10/25) on *Monday Night Football* and did not return. Although he did not record a rush against Cincinnati, Griffin returned three kickoffs for 33 yards (11.0 avg.), including a 21-yard return in the second quarter that set up Denver's lone touchdown drive, before injuring his knee. Back in the lineup after missing the previous week with an ankle injury, Griffin totaled four carries for 16 yards (4.0 avg.) at Oak. (10/17). He returned the first kickoff of his career against the Raiders, taking a first-quarter kick 19 yards to put the Broncos in excellent field position to begin their first touchdown drive of the game. He was inactive vs. Car. (10/10) with an ankle injury. The second-year back picked up 66 yards on 21 carries (3.1 avg.) at T.B. (10/3), including 44 fourth-quarter yards, while catching a 15-yard pass. Griffin broke free for a 12-yard run in the fourth quarter that put Denver in

position for the field goal that proved to be the game winner. He struggled with the Chargers' 3-4 defense vs. S.D. (9/26) and was held to a season-low seven yards on 12 carries (0.6 avg). One of his three catches against the Chargers went for 22 yards on a swing pass and moved Denver into scoring range early in the second quarter, setting up a field goal. He also had a key block on a Chargers blitz in the third quarter, clearing the way for a 16-yard Jake Plummer completion on a touchdown drive. At Jac. (9/19), the Jaguars' stingy run defense limited Griffin to 66 yards rushing on 25 carries (2.6 avg.), but his five catches for 29 yards (5.8 avg.) were a career high and more than any Jaguars receiver totaled. He was unable to secure Jake Plummer's handoff with the Broncos in position for a game-winning field goal with less than a minute in the game, allowing the Jaguars to end Denver's comeback attempt. Griffin enjoyed a record-setting day vs. K.C. (9/12) as **he set a franchise record for most rushing yards in a season opener with a career and game-high 156 yards on 23 carries (6.8 avg.) and scored the first three touchdowns (two rush, one reception) of his career.** His opening-weekend numbers ranked at the top of several offensive categories, including rushing yards (156 – second in NFL), first downs (eight – tied for third in the league), scoring (18 points – tied for first in the league) and total yards from scrimmage (157 – tied for third in the AFC). **The 156 yards he totaled on the ground are the 10th-highest single-game rushing total gained this season.** Griffin scored on 25 and 47-yard touchdown runs against the Chiefs, with the latter run coming in the third quarter with the score tied at 17, and he added a 1-yard touchdown catch for the first scoring reception of his career.

Hearst has provided Denver depth at running back in four games, rushing 10 times for 31 yards (3.1 avg.) and catching a 5-yard pass. When Broncos kneeled on the ball to run out the clock in a win at N.O. (11/21), Hearst recorded his only snaps that day on offense. He saw his most extensive action of the season vs. Hou. (11/7), rushing five times for 13 yards (2.6 avg.). His carries against the Texans were his first rushing attempts in more than a month. His 3-yard run for a first down late in the second quarter against Houston occurred on the play before Jake Plummer's 40-yard touchdown pass to Ashley Lelie. Although active, he did not play vs. Atl. 2004 Regular Season:

Johnson has embraced the team's primary fullback role with Reuben Droughns' emergence at halfback, and he has played in all 10 of the Broncos' games (2 starts). Statistically, his biggest contributions this season have come as a pass catcher who has recorded five receptions for 96 yards (19.2 avg.) with two touchdowns. He also has been a solid contributor on special teams, making six tackles on kickoff and punt coverage to rank third on the Broncos. In his second career start at **N.O. (11/21)**, he used his speed to turn a short catch into a 19-yard score early in the fourth quarter. He also served as a lead blocker for Reuben Droughns, helping the back gain 166 yards. Johnson had a career day vs. **Hou. (11/7)**, setting personal bests with three receptions for 46 yards (15.3 avg.), including a 23-yard touchdown reception for his first career score. Johnson briefly played at fullback at **T.B. (10/3)**, including an appearance on the Broncos' fourth-quarter scoring drive that set up Denver's field goal that proved to be the game winner. Additionally, he made his first career tackle on special teams against the Buccaneers. He saw one play at fullback and played substantially on special teams vs. **S.D. (9/26)**. At **Jac. (9/19)**, Johnson played on special teams only. He saw most of his action on special teams vs. **K.C. (9/12)** in Denver's season opener while also filling in sparingly at fullback. He had a key block on a 32-yard kick return by Roc Alexander in the third quarter against the Chiefs.

2004 Regular Season:

Jackson has emerged as an option at receiver for the Broncos, playing in all 10 games and catching eight passes for 73 yards (9.1 avg.). He also has made a difference on special teams by collecting four tackles on kickoff and punt coverage that tie for the fifth-highest total on the team. He did not record a catch at **N.O. (11/21)** but did compete on special teams. Jackson played receiver vs. **Hou. (11/7)** as well as special teams, and he drew a 15-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on a second-quarter punt return that set up Denver's third touchdown of the game. Jackson was tangled up on the ground with the Texans' Jonathan Wells but did not retaliate against Wells' aggressive play, forcing the penalty. Although he was held without a catch vs. **Atl. (10/31)**, he caught Falcons punt returner Allen Rossum from behind for a tackle to stop a 39-yard third-quarter return. Jackson enjoyed a career game on *Monday Night Football* at **Cin. (10/25)**, setting career highs in receptions (4) and receiving yards (33) to total an 8.3 yards-per-reception average. **His four receptions against the Bengals equaled his total reception output for his seven career games played up to that point.** Jackson did not have a catch against the Bengals until the fourth quarter when he made several clutch receptions, including back-to-back 8-yard grabs with Denver looking to mount a comeback. At **Oak. (10/17)** in front of many of the fans who supported him when he played at nearby Menlo College, Jackson appeared on offense but did not make a catch. He caught a pass in a game for the third time this season vs. **Car. (10/10)** with a 6-yard reception in the third quarter. His lone catch at **T.B. His yards-per-catch average ranks sixth in the AFC (7th in NFL) among eligible receivers. **All six of Lelie's touchdown receptions have been longer than 30 yards (37, 40, 35, 31, 39 and 33 yds.), and he leads the NFL in that statistic. Additionally, his six touchdown receptions of more than 30 yards ranks as the second-highest single-season total in franchise history (Anthony Miller had 10 in 1995).** He came up with his two biggest receptions on back-to-back plays in the first quarter at N.O. (11/21) by catching a 33-yard pass from Jake Plummer before hauling in a 37-yard touchdown. He finished the Broncos' game against the Saints with three receptions for 79 yards (26.3 avg.) and a touchdown. Lelie hauled in his fifth touchdown catch of the season longer than 30 yards vs. Hou. (11/7) with a 40-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter, and he finished the game with a team-high four catches and 81 yards receiving (20.3 avg.). One of his biggest plays vs. Houston was not a catch but rather a 36-yard pass interference call he drew on Texans cornerback Aaron Glenn in the first quarter that helped Denver set up its first touchdown of the game. He recorded his second consecutive six-catch game vs. Atl. (10/31) as he collected a season-high 94 receiving yards, including a 35-yard touchdown catch. He turned in a big fourth quarter against the Falcons by collecting 54 receiving yards on a single drive (13, 6 and 35-yard catches) that ended with his touchdown reception. On *Monday Night Football* at Cin. (10/25), Lelie had a team-high six catches for 82 yards. He hauled in a 35-yard pass in the third quarter that put the Broncos inside Cincinnati's 20-yard line to set up a field goal, which trimmed the Bengals' lead to 3. He came down with a 31-yard touchdown in the second quarter at Oak. (10/17) on his way to making two catches for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) against the Raiders. On third down in the fourth quarter vs. Car. (10/10) with the Broncos trailing by four, Lelie made a 39-yard, over-the-shoulder, touchdown catch in the corner of the end zone that proved to be the game winner, **marking the third consecutive week that he was involved in the game-changing play.** He added another catch against the Panthers to total 52 yards on two catches (26.0 avg.). Although he only caught one pass for three yards at T.B. (10/3), his effort in going after a fourth-quarter pass helped result in a 37-yard pass interference call that put Denver in position to make a field goal that proved to be the game winner. Lelie pulled down a spectacular 33-yard touchdown grab, which proved to be the game-winner, over the head of Chargers cornerback Quentin Jammer on fourth-and-9 in the third quarter vs. S.D. (9/26) as part of a four-catch, 67-yard (16.8 avg.) effort vs. the Chargers. He recorded his first rushing statistics of the season that day, rushing twice on reverses for six yards (3.0 avg.). He caught three passes for 53 yards (17.7 avg.) at Jac. (9/19) in a performance highlighted by a 39-yard catch that moved the Broncos down to Jacksonville's 6-yard line and set up a field goal right before the half. He also made a tough 8-yard catch on a third down with Denver driving at the end of the game. Lelie hauled in a 58-yard strike from Jake Plummer vs. K.C. (9/12) to begin a Denver series in the third quarter on his way to recording 88 yards receiving on four catches (22.0 avg.) against the Chiefs. The 58-yard catch was the second-longest reception on opening weekend in the NFL. **The 58-yard reception stands as Denver's longest play from scrimmage this year.** With the score tied at 24, his 22-yard catch to begin the fourth quarter set up a field goal that eventually proved to be the game winner. Lelie also had a key block on Quentin Griffin's 25-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

2004 Regular Season:

He leads the Broncos with 47 receptions and 663 receiving yards (14.1 avg.) and has four touchdowns through 10 games (10 starts). He ranks 11th in the AFC in receiving yards while tying for 11th in the AFC in receptions. **Smith, in his 10th NFL season, was selected by his teammates as an offensive co-captain for the Broncos, joining quarterback Jake Plummer in that role.** In addition to being Jake Plummer's go-to receiver, Smith is the team leader in punt returns, collecting 164 yards on 14 returns (11.7 avg.). At N.O. (11/21), Smith tallied three receptions for 26 yards (8.7 avg.), which all came in the second quarter, while gaining 36 yards on three punt returns (12.0 avg.). **He became the Broncos' all-time leader in receptions and touchdowns vs. Hou. (11/7)** with three catches for 29 yards (9.7 avg.), including a 13-yard touchdown in the second quarter in which Jake Plummer found the receiver wide open in the left corner of the end zone. He entered the game two catches behind former tight end Shannon Sharpe for the franchise record and tied with him in touchdowns as a Bronco. With a career-high 208 receiving yards vs. Atl. (10/31), **Smith posted the second most receiving yards in a game in franchise history and joined Shannon Sharpe as the only two Broncos to go over the 200-yard mark receiving.** Additionally, his 208 yards receiving mark the highest single-game receiving output in the NFL this season. He caught a game-high nine passes against the Falcons, including an 80-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter that tied him with Shannon Sharpe for most career touchdowns in franchise history (55) as well as set a regular-season career long. Smith's consistency against the Falcons was evident as **he became the first Bronco and the fourth player in the last 10 years to record 100 or more yards receiving in each half** (107 yds. in the first half, 101 yds. in the second half). He turned in another solid outing on *Monday Night Football* at Cin. (10/25) with five catches for 50 yards (10.0 avg.). He caught his second touchdown of the season in the second quarter on a 3-yard pass. **He eclipsed 9,000 career receiving yards against the Bengals, becoming one of 31 players to accomplish that feat.** Additionally, he passed Ozzie Newsome for 23rd on the NFL's all-time receptions list against the Bengals. He extended his franchise-record streak of recording at least one reception to 82 games at Oak. (10/17) with a 24-yard grab, his lone catch, on third down in the first quarter to move the Broncos inside Oakland's 15-yard line and set up a touchdown one play later. He also converted a third down with a 14-yard run in the third quarter. In starting against the Raiders, **Smith moved past Haven Moses for most games played (142) by a receiver in team history.** Smith led or tied for the team high in receptions for the fifth consecutive game vs. Car. (10/10) with four catches for a team-high 60 yards (15.0 avg.). **His hustle was exemplified by running nearly 100 yards in an effort to chase down Panthers defensive end Julius Peppers,** who intercepted a Jake Plummer pass and took it back 97 yards before getting tangled up with Smith at the Broncos' 3-yard line. He had a team-high four catches for 32 yards (8.0 avg.) at T.B. (10/3). Smith's 11-yard reception moved Denver inside the Buccaneers' 25-yard line on their lone touchdown drive. He caught his first touchdown of the season vs. S.D. (9/26) and led Denver in receiving yards (75 yards on five catches) for the third consecutive game. Smith jump-started Denver's offense in the first quarter with a 32-yard catch, which occurred three plays before his 16-yard touchdown. **With the score against the Chargers, Smith passed Shannon Sharpe for seventh place on the Broncos-all-time scoring list with 338 points.** He had game highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (83) for a 13.8 average at Jac. (9/19). His 34-yard grab midway through the second quarter put Denver into Jaguars territory and set up its first points of the game on a field goal. He recorded a game-high seven receptions for 76 yards (10.9 avg.) vs. K.C. (9/12) in Denver's season opener while serving as the Broncos' sole punt returner with four returns for 55 yards (13.8 avg.), including a 30-yard return that was the longest in the NFL that week. **His punt-return yardage total in Wk. 1 was the best in the NFL while his seven catches in the opening week rank third in the NFL.** He caught a pass on the Broncos' first four possessions against the Chiefs.

- Watts is on pace for 37 catches, which would mark the fourth-best rookie receiving output in Broncos history.

2004 Regular Season:

Watts has made strides as Denver's third receiver during his rookie season, appearing in 10 games (1 start) and totaling 23 catches for 276 yards (12.0 avg.) with a touchdown while adding five rushes for 33 yards (6.6 avg.). **He leads all AFC rookies in receptions (6th in NFL) while also ranking second in the conference among rookies in receiving yards (6th in NFL).** He caught a 12-yard pass, his only reception of the game, from Jake Plummer for a first down at N.O. (11/21) on a second-half touchdown drive. Watts kept his streak of recording at least one catch in every game alive vs. Hou. (11/7) with a 5-yard reception in the fourth quarter. He also took a reverse against the Texans in the third quarter, running four yards around the left side to set up a touchdown pass two plays later. In a breakout game vs. Atl. (10/31), he made a career-high seven receptions for a personal-best 86 yards (12.3 avg.), including a 7-yard catch that marked the first touchdown of his career. He made major contributions in the fourth quarter against the Falcons by recording six grabs for 78 yards in the final period, including three catches for 41 yards on a drive. He showed great concentration in getting both feet inbounds on his first-career touchdown reception during the Broncos' comeback attempt against Atlanta. Watts came up big for the Broncos on *Monday Night Football* at Cin. (10/25) by tying a then-career high with four catches for 36 yards (9.0 avg.) while also gaining a first down on a 10-yard reverse in the first quarter. He used his speed to turn up field to make a 19-yard reception in the second quarter against the Bengals to set up Denver's lone touchdown. Watts' only catch at Oak. He was used in several different formations, including split wide, against the Saints. His two-catch, 19-yard (11.1 avg.) game vs. **Hou. (11/7)** was highlighted by a 15-yard reception during an efficient touchdown drive that took place with less than 1:30 left in the first half. He did not make a catch in a start vs. **Atl. 2004 Regular Season:

Lynch has brought veteran instincts and stability to the Broncos as their starting free safety, placing seventh on the team with 43 tackles (34 solo) while also notching five pass breakups. While still recovering from a bruised sacrum at **N.O. (11/21)**, the veteran played sparingly against the Saints but managed to record three tackles (all solo). He missed his first game of the season vs. **Hou. (11/7)** with a bruised sacrum (an injury near his tailbone) that he suffered in the previous game against the Falcons. He was forced out of Denver's game vs. **Atl. (10/31)** after suffering a bruised sacrum at 12:03 of the second quarter. Before the injury, Lynch made two tackles (both solo), including a head-on stop of Falcons running back T.J. Duckett, who is more than 30 pounds heavier than him. At **Cin. (10/25)** on *Monday Night Football*, he made six tackles (5 solo) for the second consecutive game. In one of the Broncos' finest defensive series of the season in which they forced the Bengals to lose 11 yards on three plays in the second quarter while they were inside the Denver 25-yard line, Lynch tackled Bengals running back Rudi Johnson for a 5-yard loss. **Lynch went over 1,000 tackles for his career** with six tackles (5 solo) at **Oak. (10/17)**. He also forced a fumble on Raiders receiver Joey Porter at the Denver 8-yard line late in the first half, which was recovered by Kenoy Kennedy, while also helping to limit Oakland to only 114 total passing yards. He moved within one tackle of 1000 career stops with a tackle vs. **Car. (10/10)** in the Broncos' comeback win. **In an emotional return to Tampa Bay (10/3), where he played his first 11 NFL seasons, Lynch turned in an exceptional game against his former teammates with seven tackles (6 solo) and a team-high two pass breakups.** Lynch, who received a standing ovation from Buccaneers fans during starting introductions, had one of the game's most important plays when he slipped past the Buccaneers' offensive line on a third-and-2 in

the fourth quarter of a close game, stopping fullback Mike Alstott for a 2-yard loss. He frequently was used on blitzes vs. **S.D. (9/26)** and recorded four tackles (3 solo) and a pass breakup against the Chargers. Lynch disrupted an intended deep post pattern in the fourth quarter when he rushed in from the corner to hit Drew Brees as the quarterback was releasing the ball. He recorded a game-high eight tackles (5 solo) at **Jac. (9/19)** and broke up a pass in **helping limit Jaguars quarterback Byron Leftwich to only 120 yards passing.** He also **played special teams against the Jaguars for the first time in two years, making a tackle on a third-quarter kickoff.** He made his Broncos debut vs. **K.C. (9/12)** and made six tackles (five solo) to lead Denver defensive backs in that category while breaking up a pass. He had a big hit on Chiefs WR Dante Hall to break up a pass although the play resulted in a penalty.

Elam had a busy first quarter at **N.O. (11/21)**, connecting on 48 and 34-yard field goals in his

only attempts of the game. He drilled a 52-yard kick in the first quarter vs. **Hou. (11/7)**, which marked his second conversion from longer than 50 yards this season. Elam did not attempt a field goal for the first time this season vs. **Atl. (10/31)** but did connect on all four extra-point attempts to extend his scoring streak to 180 games. At **Cin. (10/25)** on *Monday Night Football*, he moved past Fred Cox for 18th place all-time on the NFL's scoring list with a 29-yard field goal and an extra point. His 49-yard field-goal attempt against the Bengals was wide left, marking his first miss in four weeks. He moved into a tie for 18th place (Fred Cox) on the NFL's all-time scoring list with a 33-yard field goal and four extra points at **Oak. (10/17)**. With two field goals (32 and 33 yards) in the first quarter vs. **Car. (10/10)**, **Elam notched his 300th career field goal faster than any other kicker in NFL history and is one of only 16 players in NFL history with 300 field goals.** Elam helped Denver overcome a stingy Buccaneers defense at **T.B. (10/3)** by hitting 3-of-3 field goals that day. His 50-yarder in the second quarter against the Buccaneers was his longest field goal this season, and he added a clutch fourth-quarter 23-yarder to secure the win. Against the Buccaneers, Elam hit two 49+ yard field goals (50 and 49 yds.) in a game for the first time in his career. **His play against the Buccaneers earned the kicker AFC Special Teams Player of the Week, marking the fourth time in his career he has won that award.** Against the Chargers in Denver's game vs. **S.D. (9/26)**, he drilled two field goals, a 22 and 23-yarder, before hitting a 43-yarder in the fourth quarter to extend Denver's lead to two possessions. His sole miss of the season came at **Jac. (9/19)** when his 51-yard attempt into a stiff wind late in the third quarter fell short. He was successful on his two other attempts at Jacksonville, a 44-yard kick that bounced off the left upright before clearing the bar and a 22-yarder, to account for Denver's only points that game. Elam had a strong opening to the 2004 season vs. **K.C. (9/12)** by connecting on 43 and 45-yard field goals and all four extra points. **He scored 10 points in Wk. 1, which tied for the top mark in the NFL.** His 45-yarder with 13:26 remaining in the fourth quarter against the Chiefs broke a 24-24 tie and proved to be the eventual game winner.

2004 Regular Season:

Knorr has been an asset to Denver's special teams unit, punting 42 times for 1,789 yards (42.6 avg.) with 10 punts inside the 20 in the Broncos' 10 games. His punting average ranks seventh in the AFC. **Knorr has handled all of Denver's kickoffs to total 15 touchbacks, which leads the NFL.** At **N.O. (11/21)**, he pinned a season-high three punts inside the Saints' 20-yard line and posted his highest net punting average in several weeks with a 39.5 net avg. on six punts for 245 yards (40.8 avg.). **He was shaken up on a fourth-quarter punt return against the Saints after getting hit in his left knee, but he did not miss a punt.** Knorr punted for 207 yards on five punts (41.4 avg.) and placed two punts inside the 20-yard line vs. **Hou. (11/7)**. Additionally, his placement of punts helped limit the Texans to -6 yards returning. Knorr also had three touchbacks on kickoffs against the Texans. He placed two punts inside the 20-yard line, including a third-quarter punt downed at the 3-yard line, vs. **Atl. (10/31)** to total three punts for 111 yards (37.0 avg.). Knorr surrendered only a 12-yard return against the Falcons, marking the fourth time this season he has allowed one or fewer returns to an opponent. He also recorded one touchback on a first-quarter kickoff against the Falcons. On *Monday Night Football* at **Cin. (10/25)**, Knorr punted five times for 205 yards

(41.0 avg.) to help Denver's punt-coverage unit surrender only 25 yards on three returns. He had a relatively quiet day punting at **Oak. (10/17)**, punting only twice for 64 yards (32.0 avg.) and not giving up a return. He posted four touchbacks vs. **Car. (10/10)** while punting three times for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 53-yard punt early in the second quarter. Knorr placed a season-high two punts inside the 20-yard line at **T.B. (10/3)** while punting five times for 189 yards (37.8 avg.) and allowing only one return for two yards. In Denver's game vs. **S.D. (9/26)**, Knorr recorded a career-best punting average of 53.0 on four punts for 212 yards. He twisted his right ankle when a Chargers defender collided with him on a third-quarter punt, which was ruled a penalty and ultimately led to a Denver touchdown several plays later. He punted seven times for 290 yards at **Jac. (9/19)** for a 41.4 average, positioned one punt inside the 20-yard line, while adding a touchback on kickoffs. He also helped make a touchdown-saving tackle on Jaguars returner Jermaine Lewis on a 50-yard return in the first quarter. Knorr was named **AFC Special Teams Player of the Week** after punting twice for 113 yards (56.5 avg.) vs. **K.C. (9/12)** and drilling six touchbacks while handling all kickoffs. **His six touchbacks were the highest total for a Broncos punter since 1983 and ranked first in the NFL during Wk. 1 (No other kicker had more than one touchback in Wk. 1).** He limited dangerous Chiefs punt returner Dante Hall to only two returns (a punt for 26 yards and a kick for 17 yards).

Marco Coleman joined the Broncos (3/11) as an unrestricted free agent from Philadelphia and will add depth to Denver's defensive line. In 184 career games (169 starts), Coleman has 656 tackles (468 solo), 62 sacks for -410 yards, 17 passes defended, 20 forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. An experienced defensive lineman, he was voted to the Pro Bowl in 2000 when he made 12 sacks. Entering his 13th year in the NFL, he has played for Miami (1992-95), San Diego (1996-98), Washington (1999-2001), Jacksonville (2002) and Philadelphia (2003). Originally drafted in first round (12th overall) by Miami in the 1992 NFL Draft, he has missed just eight games in 12 seasons. Coleman has started all 16 games in seven seasons and appeared in 16 games nine of 12 seasons. He played right defensive end in his first eight seasons and left end the last four years. Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year in 1992 by *Sports Illustrated* and led San Diego's defensive linemen in tackles three consecutive seasons (1996-98). He has also appeared in nine postseason games, with 41 tackles (33 solo), three sacks and two forced fumbles.

2003: Coleman signed with Philadelphia on Sept. 5, replacing Derrick Burgess, who was placed on injured reserve. He played in 13 games, primarily as a backup defensive end, and posted 10 tackles (5 solo), a half sack and one quarterback pressure. Coleman made three tackles at Buffalo (9/28) and picked up the half sack in the season finale at Washington (12/27). He was a reserve in both of the Eagles' playoff games, where he made three tackles (all solo).

2002: Coleman signed with Jacksonville on June 19 and started all 16 games at left defensive end where he ranked 12th on team with 54 tackles (27 solo), adding five sacks, one forced fumble, one tackle for loss and five quarterback pressures. He led the team's defensive ends in tackles and was one of just six players to start every game on defense. Coleman picked up his first sack as a Jaguar on Oct. 6 vs. Philadelphia (of Donovan McNabb) and notched a sack of Chris Redman on Oct. 20 at Baltimore. He posted a season-high 10 tackles on Nov. 17 at Houston and made two sacks on Dec. 1 vs. Pittsburgh (of Kordell Stewart), marking first multi-sack game since 2000. Coleman tallied his fifth sack of the season Dec. 15 at Cincinnati (of Jon Kitna) and forced a fumble on the play.

2001: Coleman started 12 games in his final season with Washington and missed four games due to a right elbow injury. He collected 55 tackles (41 solo), 4.5 sacks and three forced fumbles. In Week 2 at Green Bay, he made six tackles but suffered a dislocated right elbow in the third quarter and left the game. He was inactive for the next four games, marking the first time in his career that he missed more than one game in a season. Coleman returned to the lineup Oct. 28 vs. N.Y. Giants and made three tackles. Against Seattle (11/4), he posted four tackles, one sack and one forced fumble, and two weeks later at Denver, made five tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. On Dec. 16 vs. Philadelphia, Coleman made six tackles, a half-sack and had one pass defended that led to an interception. He made five tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass deflection on Dec. 30 at New Orleans, and added four tackles and a sack in the season finale vs. Arizona (1/6).

2000: Coleman enjoyed his finest season as a pro when he made a career-high 12 sacks and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl. His sack total topped his previous career-high of 6.5 in 1995 and 1999, and he finished the season tied for eighth in NFL in sacks. Coleman made 62 tackles (42 solo), which ranked eighth on team, and added three passes defended and two forced fumbles. He started all 16 games for fourth consecutive season and played left defensive end for first time after eight years as a right end (switch made after Redskins signed Bruce Smith). Coleman recorded at least a half-sack in each of the first six games and was named the NFC Defensive Player of the Week after an 11-tackle, three-sack game vs. Tampa Bay in Week 5. Those three sacks tied his single-game career-high set

10/25/92 vs. Indianapolis, and his 11 tackles were a season-high. He posted 2.5 sacks in a season-opening win over Carolina. Against Philadelphia in Week 6, he sacked quarterback Donovan McNabb and forced a fumble on game's second play. He netted a half-sack in Week 11 at St. Louis, and again sacked McNabb in Week 12, forcing another fumble. Coleman tallied six tackles in Week 13 vs. N.Y. Giants, posted six tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Dallas and four tackles in Week 14 at Pittsburgh.

1999: Coleman signed with Washington as an unrestricted free agent on June 3 and started all 16 games at right end, finishing first on team in QB pressures (44), second in sacks (6.5) and tied for first in forced fumbles (three). He ranked eighth with 65 tackles (42 solo) and nine tackles for loss, while also posting a recovered a fumble and returned it 42 yards for his first career touchdown (Nov. 21 vs. N.Y. Giants). In Week 2 vs. N.Y. Giants, he had four tackles, two pressures and a forced fumble, and followed that up with five tackles and two QB pressures in the Redskins' 27-20 win over N.Y. Jets in Week 3. Coleman posted seven quarterback pressures in Week 4 vs. Carolina, and eight pressures, 1.5 sacks, four tackles and three assists in Week 7 vs. Chicago. In Week 9 vs. Philadelphia, he suffered a strained cervical spine and left game but came back to start the next week vs. N.Y. Giants and made three solo tackles, two assists, one sack, one tackle for loss and a recovered fumble that he returned 42 yards for a touchdown and his first career score. Coleman had four tackles in Washington's NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Detroit and eight tackles in the NFL Divisional Playoff Game at Tampa Bay.

1998: Coleman led a San Diego defense, which claimed the league's No. 1 defensive ranking, that allowed only 263 yards and 71.3 yards rushing per game. He led the team's defensive linemen in tackles for the third consecutive season with 51, in 16 starts for the Chargers. Coleman added 3.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries. He collected a season-high nine tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Seattle.

1997: Coleman, who started all 16 games, led all Chargers defensive linemen in tackles for a second consecutive season (48). He added two sacks, one interception (the only one of his career) and forced a team-high three fumbles. Coleman recorded a season-high five tackles, a half-sack and his first career interception at New Orleans in Week 2, and posted five tackles in each game against Kansas City (Week 7 and Week 15).

1996: In his first season with San Diego after being signed as an unrestricted free agent, Coleman made 42 tackles, four sacks and one forced fumble in 15 starts. He posted a season-high six tackles and one sack in the Chargers' Week 6 Monday night game vs. Oakland.

1995: In 16 starts on the season for Miami, Coleman ranked seventh on team with 65 tackles and second with 6.5 sacks. He had a season-high nine tackles and added a sack vs. Saints (10/15), and set a postseason career-high with 11 tackles vs. Buffalo in the AFC Wild Card Playoff game (12/30).

1994: Coleman started all 16 games for the Dolphins and finished the year with 66 tackles, six sacks, four forced fumbles and three passes defended, including five or more tackles in eight games. He opened the season with eight tackles and a sack vs. New England. Coleman posted eight tackles, two sacks (tied a team playoff record) and one forced fumble at San Diego in an AFC Divisional Playoff game (1/8).

1993: Coleman, who started 15 games for Miami, made 54 tackles, 5.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and one pass defended. He had a season-high eight tackles and recorded a sack vs. Bills (9/26). After he fractured his hand vs. Washington (10/4), Coleman was inactive the next week vs. Cleveland. He returned to the lineup vs. Indianapolis (10/24) and made two tackles, and he made two tackles and 1.5 sacks vs. New England (11/21).

1992: Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year by *Sports Illustrated* and Defensive Rookie of the Year by *Football News* after finishing the season with Miami with 84 tackles, six sacks and one forced fumble. His six sacks were the third-highest single-season total for a Dolphin rookie. He made 15 starts (16 played), started the season at outside linebacker before moving to right defensive end for the final 12 games. Coleman posted 13 tackles and three sacks vs. Indianapolis at his new position and followed that with a six-tackle, two sack performance vs. N.Y. Jets. He was the first Dolphins rookie to have back-to-back games with two sacks. Against Buffalo (11/16), he tallied 11 tackles, and made five tackles and one sack vs. Buffalo in the AFC Championship Game. He joined the Dolphins as the team's first-round selection (12th overall) in the draft.

COLLEGE: Coleman finished his career at Georgia Tech as the school's all-time leader with 28 sacks despite playing just three years, and earned All-ACC honors his junior year, playing in 11 games while tallying 67 tackles, 10 sacks and one fumble recovery. He helped lead the school to a share of the national championship as a sophomore in 1990 by making 81 tackles and 13 sacks. Coleman was named second-team All-America by the *Sporting News* and was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week after a 12-tackle, five-sack performance vs. Maryland. As a redshirt freshman, he started all season at outside linebacker posting 63 tackles and five sacks.

PERSONAL: Coleman attended Patterson Co-Operative High School in Dayton, Ohio, where he was an all-area linebacker. As a senior, he made 84 tackles, 31 sacks, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and blocked an extra point. He lettered three times in football and once in track. Coleman performed a cameo role opposite actor Jim Carrey in the movie *Ace Ventura: Pet Detective*. Marco Darrrell Coleman is married (Katrina) and has three children, Kabrione, Kennedy and Kenneth. Born Dec. 18, 1969, in Dayton, Ohio, he resides in both Atlanta and Jacksonville.

DEFENSIVE TACKLE

Ellis Johnson, an accomplished defensive tackle who led all NFL interior linemen in sacks last season, joined the Broncos on Sept. 20, 2004, in a trade with Atlanta for an undisclosed draft choice. In 136 career games (89 starts), Johnson has made 532 tackles (273 solo) and recorded 48 sacks (-315 yds.), highlighted by his eight sacks in 2003 that tied a personal best. He has eight multiple-sack games during his nine years in the NFL spent with the Colts (1995-01) and Falcons (2002-03). A durable veteran who has missed only eight games in his career, Johnson should add to an already potent Denver defense by providing an inside pass-rushing threat on the Broncos' defensive line. He spent the previous two seasons with the Falcons, where he was a vital member of their defensive unit. He played in 32 games (5 starts) for Atlanta and totaled 118 tackles (65 solo) with 15 sacks (-107 yds.) from 2002-03 after the team signed him as a free agent Sept. 1, 2002. Johnson spent his first seven seasons in the NFL with the Colts and started every game he played during a five-year span from 1997-2001 (76 games). The Colts' leader in sacks in 1998 with eight (-34 yds.), Johnson's sack total that year also was a personal best and complemented his 75 tackles (48 solo). That season came before a strong 1999 Johnson in the first round (15th overall) of the 1995 NFL draft out of Florida, and he played in all 16 regular-season games as a rookie (2 starts), totaling 4.5 sacks (-26 yds.), while seeing action in three Indianapolis playoff games (1 start) that year. At Florida, Johnson was a three-year starter and totaled 165 tackles (112 solo), 17.5 sacks (-134 yds.), six forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 44 games

(26 starts) during four seasons with the Gators. His 36.5 career tackles for loss rank 10th all-time in Florida history. He was named National Defensive Player of the Year by CNM as a senior in addition to being tabbed a first-team All-Southeastern Conference selection and earning honorable mention All-American honors from *The Sporting News*.

2003: Johnson played in 16 games (3 starts) in his second season with the Falcons, collecting 64 tackles (35 solo) and eight sacks (-49 yds.). His eight sacks led all interior linemen in the NFL and tied his personal best, which he set in 1998 with the Colts. He had a pair of two-sack games with his first of the season coming vs. New Orleans (10/19) when he pulled down Saints quarterback Aaron Brooks twice for nine yards to post five tackles. A little over a month later at Houston (11/30), two of his seven total tackles were sacks (-9 yds.) to mark the eighth multiple-sack game of Johnson's career. During the Falcons' game at Carolina (9/28), he tied for the lead among Atlanta defensive linemen with seven tackles (6 solo). He had a strong game vs. Washington (9/14) with five tackles (4 solo) and a sack.

2002: Johnson was signed by the Falcons as a free agent on Sept. 1 after the Colts waived him Aug. 28. Playing in a new defensive system, he finished the year with 54 tackles (30 solo), seven sacks (-58 yds.) and one forced fumble in 16 games (2 starts). His seven sacks were second most by a Falcons player and were supplemented by 13 quarterback pressures. In Atlanta's upset win at Green Bay (1/4/03) in an NFC Wild Card Game, Johnson tackled Packers running back Ahman Green for a 4-yard loss on fourth down with Green Bay threatening to score in the second quarter. He combined for four tackles (3 solo) during the Falcons' two playoff games. He had one sack (-6 yds.), six tackles and a season-high three quarterback pressures at Minnesota (12/1). At Carolina (11/24), he added two sacks (-17 yds.). Johnson came off the bench vs. Baltimore (11/3) and enjoyed a strong game for the Falcons as he collected six tackles, one sack (-10 yds.) and one quarterback pressure.

2001: Johnson started all 16 games at right defensive tackle for the Colts to mark the third time in his career and the third time in the last four seasons that he has started 16 games. He registered 61 tackles (25 solo), 3.5 sacks (-38.5 yds.), two batted passes and one forced fumble in his final year in Indianapolis. Johnson showed consistency during his seventh NFL season by making at least four tackles in 11 games. He had a strong game vs. Denver (1/6/02) with one sack (-7 yds.) and four tackles against the Broncos. During the Colts' game vs. Atlanta (12/16), he collected six tackles and 1.5 sacks (-17.5 yds.). In a game at New Orleans (11/18), Johnson made his first sack of the season for a 14-yard loss and totaled three tackles. He made two stops vs. New England (10/21). Johnson had several strong performances in September, making five tackles vs. Buffalo (9/23) and four tackles at N.Y. Jets (9/9).

2000: Johnson played in 13 games (13 starts) at right defensive tackle and made 58 tackles (25 solo) with five sacks (-25 yds.), one interception and one forced fumble. He was inactive for three games (vs. Detroit (10/29), at Chicago (11/5) and vs. N.Y. Jets (11/12)) with a knee injury. He started in the Colts' AFC Wild Card Game at Miami (12/30) and recorded six tackles (3 solo) and one sack, his first ever in the playoffs, that went for -4.5 yards. The Colts played vs. Miami (11/26) a month before their playoff showdown with the Dolphins, and Johnson turned in an equally impressive game that day with five tackles and one sack (0 yds.). A week earlier at Green Bay (11/19), he produced four tackles, one sack and the second interception of his career against the Packers. When the Colts visited Seattle (10/15), he came through with three tackles, one sack and a forced fumble. He posted back-to-back five-tackle games at Buffalo (10/1) and at New England (10/8). Johnson was a dominating presence on the defensive line vs. Oakland (9/10) with seven tackles.

1999: Johnson started all 16 games at right defensive tackle, totaling 76 tackles (34 solo) and 7.5 sacks (-46.5 yds.) while recovering one fumble and breaking up three passes. His sack total in 1999 was the second-highest total among Colts defenders. Johnson started in the Colts' AFC Divisional Playoff Game vs. Tennessee (1/16/00), making four tackles (1 solo). While visiting the Giants (11/14), he turned in a strong showing with seven tackles (3 solo) and two sacks (-11 yds.). Johnson's season-high in tackles came when he had 10 stops vs. Kansas City (11/7). Two weeks earlier, Johnson made six tackles and two sacks (the third multiple-sack game of his career) vs. Cincinnati (10/24). He added five tackles, including one sack, at N.Y. Jets (10/17). The sack against the Jets came on the game's final play to seal the win for the Colts. In a game at San Diego (9/26), Johnson totaled six tackles and half a sack (-3.5 yds.).

1998: Johnson posted the most complete season of his career and was one of seven Colts to start all 16 games. His 75 tackles (48 solo) were fifth most on the team, and his eight sacks (-34 yds.) were a team and career high. Additionally, he registered one forced fumble and three pass breakups for the Colts. Johnson totaled the second multiple-sack game of his career vs. Carolina (12/27) with two sacks (-9 yds.) to go along with nine tackles and his lone forced fumble of the season. He posted back-to-back games with a sack at Seattle (12/20) and vs. Cincinnati (12/13). In a performance vs. San Diego (10/4), he created havoc on the defensive line with seven tackles (5 solo). His season-high in tackles came vs. New Orleans (9/27) with 10 stops and one sack against the Saints.
