## BRONCOS SET FOR SHOWDOWN AGAINST AFC-WEST LEADING CHARGERS IN SAN DIEGO

On a frigid, snowy night in Denver, the Broncos dropped a tough division battle to Oakland, 25-24, at INVESCO Field at Mile High. Despite Denver racking up 367 total yards and running back Reuben Droughns' sixth 100-yard game (102 on 28 carries) of the season, Denver was unable to hold off the Raiders, who came back from an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit. Denver jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the second quarter, but Oakland scored late in the first half to pull to within three. Oakland took a 13-10 lead in the third quarter, and Denver scored twice in the first two minutes of the fourth quarter to build a 24-13 lead. Oakland roared back with two unanswered touchdowns taking a 25-24 lead, the second of which coming with 1:49 to play. Denver still had a chance to win the game, but kicker Jason Elam's 43-yard field goal attempt with 31 seconds left was blocked by tackle Langston Walker.

In Week 13, the Broncos take to the road for a huge AFC West division game against the first-place Chargers on Sunday, Dec. 5. Kickoff for the game is set for 1:05 p.m. (PST) at Qualcomm Stadium. Denver—who trails San Diego by a game in the AFC West—can move into first place with a win, and will hold the tiebreaker over the Chargers, having won the first meeting 23-13 at INVESCO Field at Mile High earlier this season.

## RADIO/TELEVISION at SAN DIEGO

The Broncos and Chargers game will be broadcast nationally on CBS-TV and locally on KCNC-TV (Channel 4). **Jim Nantz** will provide the play-by-play, and joining him in the booth will be **Phil Simms** doing the color commentary. **Bonnie Bernstein** will be on the sidelines.

For the 35th consecutive year, KOA radio (850) is the flagship station for the Denver Broncos radio network, and every game this season will be broadcast. **Dave Logan** and **Scott Hastings** will provide the play-by-play and color commentary respectively, with **Alan Roach** on the sidelines. The Broncos radio network extends to nine states, and the KOA pregame show, hosted by **Mike Rice**, begins two hours prior to kickoff.

The game will also be broadcast in Spanish on KBNO radio (1280). **Milo Sanchez** will do the play-by-play, with **Luke Sandoval** adding color commentary.

Westwood One/CBS Radio will provide a national radio broadcast. The team includes **Harry Kalas** with the call and **Jack Ham** by his side.

**THE SERIES vs. SAN DIEGO**

The Broncos and the Chargers have met 89 times in the regular season, with Denver holding a **50-38-1 (.567)** edge. Overall, the Broncos are **33-11-1 (.744)** at home vs. San Diego, including Denver's 23-13 win earlier this season in Week 3. But on the road, Denver is **17-27 (.386)**. With the win earlier this year, the Broncos have won 12 of the last 15 meetings in the series. Under Head Coach Mike Shanahan, the Broncos are **17-5 (.773)** against the Chargers, including **11-1 (.917)** at home and **6-4 (.600)** on the road.

• **CB CHAMP BAILEY**

Tallied six tackles (5 solo) and broke up three passes vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Intercepted a pass (-5 yds.), recovered a fumble and made four tackles (all solo) in the season-opener at S.D. 9/9/01 for the Redskins.

• **TE DWAYNE CARSWELL**

Caught five passes for 54 yds. (10.8) at S.D. 12/1/02 for the Broncos and had back-to-back three catch, one-touchdown games (10/8/00 at S.D. and 11/19/00 vs. S.D.) against the Chargers for the Broncos. In 18 career games (12 starts) vs. S.D., totaled 25 receptions for 209 yds. (8.4 avg.) and three touchdowns.

• **RB REUBEN DROUHNIS**

Made two catches for 26 yds. (13.0 avg.) and a touchdown at S.D. 12/1/02 for the Broncos while also catching a 12-yd. touchdown pass at S.D. 9/14/03. Returned three kicks for 58 yds. (19.3 avg.), including a long of 27 yds., 12/1/02 at S.D. In five career games (2 starts) vs. S.D., totaled seven catches for 57 yds. (8.1 avg.) and two touchdowns.

• **DE MARCO COLEMAN**

Tied for a team-high nine tackles (8 solo) vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Tied a Dolphins postseason record with two sacks (-12 yds.) at S.D. 1/8/95 in an AFC Divisional Playoff Game while making eight tackles (7 solo) and forcing a fumble. Recorded a sack (-12 yds.) at S.D. 11/5/95 for the Dolphins. In six career games (6 starts) vs. S.D., has 22 tackles (19 solo), three sacks (-24 yds.) and one forced fumble.

• **K JASON ELAM**

Went 3-for-3 on field-goal attempts, including a 43-yarder, vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Connected on 4-of-4 field-goal attempts, including a 55-yarder and two 40+-yd attempts, at S.D. 11/7/99. In 23 career games vs. S.D., converted 41-of-51 (80.1%) field-goal attempts, highlighted by a 7-for-8 mark on attempts from greater than 50 yds. out, and all 66 extra-point attempts.

• **S NICK FERGUSON**

Started at free safety vs. S.D. 11/16/03 for the Broncos, making five tackles (all solo) and collecting the first safety of his career (-13 yds.) on Doug Flutie.

• **DE REGGIE HAYWARD**

Pulled down Drew Brees for a 7-yd. sack in a four-tackle (3 solo) game vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Forced and recovered a fumble while adding a sack (-1 yd.) vs. S.D. 11/16/03.

• **RB GARRISON HEARST**

Ran for 87 yds. on 22 carries (4.0) and caught two passes for five yds. vs. S.D. 11/23/97 for the 49ers. Collected 66 rushing yds. on 12 carries (5.5 avg.) and caught three passes for 22 yds. (7.3 avg.) at S.D. 11/17/02. In five career games (3 starts) vs. S.D., rushed 55 times for 200 yds. (3.6 avg.) and has 10 receptions for 54 yds. (5.4 avg.).

• **CB KELLY HERNDON**

Added six tackles (5 solo) and three pass breakups vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Made four tackles (3 solo) at S.D. 9/14/03 for the Broncos. Also intercepted a pass (-16 yds.) and defended two passes vs. S.D. 11/16/03.

• **S KENOY KENNEDY**

Posted 10 tackles (7 solo) at S.D. (12/1) for the Broncos. Totaled 22 tackles (7 solo) in seven games (six starts) vs. S.D.

• **WR ASHLEY LELIE**

Hauled in four catches for 67 yds., including a 33-yd. touchdown, vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Caught two passes for 57 yds. (28.5 avg.), including a 48-yd. grab. vs. S.D. 11/16/03 while also rushing twice for 20 yds. (10.0 avg.) that game for the Broncos. In five career games (2 starts) vs. S.D., caught 11 passes for 186 yds. (16.9 avg.) with one touchdown.

• **S JOHN LYNCH**

Recorded four tackles (3 solo) and a pass breakup vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Intercepted a pass (25 yds.) and made five stops at S.D. 11/17/96 for the Buccaneers.

• **TE JEB PUTZIER**

Caught a career-high five passes for a career-best 66 yds. (13.2 avg.), including a 24-yd. reception vs. S.D. 9/26/04.

• **QB JAKE PLUMMER**

Threw two touchdowns and completed 25-of-36 passes for 294 yds. vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Completed 23-of-34 passes for 253 yds., three touchdowns and one interception vs. S.D. 11/16/03 for the Broncos. Threw three touchdowns for a 129.5 passer rating at S.D. 9/14/03. In six career games (6 starts) vs. S.D., completed 112-of-191 passes for 1,385 yds., 11 touchdowns and five interceptions.

• **P MICAH KNORR**

Placed three of four punts inside the 20-yd. line and had a 42.5 avg. vs. S.D. 9/22/01 for the Cowboys.

• **DE TREVOR PRYCE**

Had three sacks (-17 yds.) with seven tackles (5 solo) at S.D. 10/8/00 for the Broncos. In 14 games (14 starts) vs. S.D., registered 36 tackles (23 solo) and eight sacks (-52 yds.).

• **WR ROD SMITH**

Made five catches for 75 yds. (15.0 avg.) with a score vs. S.D. 9/26/04. Produced two double-digit reception games vs. S.D. (11 catches for 187 yds. (17.0 avg.) and one touchdown vs. S.D. 11/19/00 and 10 catches for 84 yds. (8.4 avg.) 11/16/03 vs. S.D.). In 18 career games (15 starts) vs. S.D., registered 95 receptions for 1,185 yds. ### THE LAST TIME

#### WEEK 3: at DENVER 23, SAN DIEGO 13 (INVESCO FIELD AT MILE HIGH, 9/26/04)

A stingy defensive effort and a 294-yard passing day by quarterback Jake Plummer helped the Broncos improve to 2-1 with a 23-13 victory over the San Diego Chargers before a crowd of 74,533 at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

Denver scored first on its second drive of the game, as Plummer connected with wide receiver Rod Smith for a 16-yard touchdown to cap off a six-play, 72-yard drive to give the Broncos a 7-0 lead.

Holding on to a 10-3 lead early in the second quarter, the Broncos forced a fumble after safety Kenoy Kennedy sacked San Diego quarterback Drew Brees and defensive tackle Mario Fatafehi scooped up the ball on the Chargers' 36-yard line. Fatafehi's 8-yard return to the Chargers' 28-yard line helped set up an eventual 23-yard Jason Elam field goal to give Denver a 13-3 lead.

In the second half, a Quentin Griffin fumble on Denver's second play of the third quarter yielded a seven-play, 36-yard drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by Brees to close the gap to 13-10.

On the ensuing drive, the Chargers forced the Broncos to punt, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave Denver the ball on San Diego's 34-yard line. After the Chargers' defense forced Denver into another 4th-down situation, the Broncos opted to go for it, and the result was a 33-yard touchdown strike from Plummer to wide receiver Ashley Lelie to give the Broncos a 20-10 advantage.

Elam's 43-yard field goal on the Broncos' second drive of the fourth quarter gave Denver a 23-13 lead they would hold on to.

The Broncos kept San Diego star running back LaDainian Tomlinson in check for most of the contest, limiting the All-Pro to just 60 yards rushing, his lowest rushing output in his last 15 games.

Smith led all receivers with five catches for 75 yards while Plummer completed 25 of 36 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 112.5.

## WEEK 12: OAKLAND 25, at DENVER 24 (INVESCO FIELD AT MILE HIGH, 11/28/04)

On a snowy night at INVESCO Field at Mile High, Oakland rallied from an 11-point deficit in the fourth quarter to send the Broncos to a 25-24 defeat in front of a national-television audience on ESPN's Sunday Night Football and 75,936 fans.

The Broncos had a chance to win the game after Jake Plummer drove his team downfield in the final minutes of the contest, but a 43-yard Jason Elam field goal attempt was blocked by tackle Langston Walker to seal the victory for Oakland.

Ahead 3-0 in the second quarter, Plummer found Rod Smith deep for an 85-yard touchdown pass, giving Denver a 10-0 lead. It marked the eighth-longest pass play in Broncos history, and set career-highs in yardage for both players.

Oakland rebounded quickly as Doug Gabriel returned the kickoff to the Raiders 49-yard line, setting up a 42-yard touchdown pass from Kerry Collins to wide receiver Jerry Porter with just 23 seconds remaining in the half.

Oakland capitalized off a Reuben Droughns fumble at the start of the second half with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Collins to Porter, and took a 13-10 lead. Denver regained control of the game in the fourth quarter, as Plummer found wide receiver Ashley Lelie for a 57-yard strike which set up a Droughns 3-yard touchdown run, putting the Broncos ahead 17-13.

The Broncos upped their lead on Oakland's next drive, as defensive tackle Monsanto Pope tipped a Collins pass at the line of scrimmage which was intercepted by Ellis Johnson, who returned it 32 yards for the score.

With the Broncos holding a 24-13 advantage with six minutes remaining in the game, the Raiders mounted a comeback beginning with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Collins to Ronald Curry, bringing Oakland within five after missing a two-point conversion attempt.

After a 63-yard pass from Collins to Curry brought the Raiders to the Denver 10-yard line, they would take the lead on Porter's third touchdown reception of the game, a five-yard pass from Collins on 4th-and-goal from the 5-yard line with 1:49 left to play in the game.

Down by one, Plummer completed passes of 16, 14, and 12 yards to set up a 43-yard field goal attempt by Elam, but Oakland's Langston Walker batted down the kick to end Denver's comeback hopes.

Droughns finished the game with 102 yards rushing on 28 attempts, his sixth 100-yard game in the past seven, while Plummer completed 14-of-23 passes for 245 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

## HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN MONDAY QUOTES

### Injury report after Sunday's game

"Lenny Walls dislocated his shoulder. He'll have surgery on that shoulder. He'll be out for the remainder of the season. Exactly when that surgery will be, I'm not sure at this time. Reuben Droughns had a few stitches in his left hand; I think five, after the game. He'll be alright. Other than that we have some bumps and bruises, nothing that should keep anybody out."

### On the status of DT Luther Elliss

"I really don't know. We'll get a chance to see how he's feeling on Wednesday and I'll give you a little bit of an update then."

### On if Roc Alexander will replace Walls on the depth chart

"Roc, obviously had been dressing anyhow. He will be, besides Willie (Middlebrooks), the next defensive back."

### On the play of CB Lenny Walls before his injury

"Lenny was really playing well. He came back off his dislocated shoulder, and the last couple weeks he's been playing at a very high level. It's disappointing to lose a guy that playing at that level. I have a lot of confidence in the other players. They will come in and, I'm sure, do a good job. Anytime a guy has had a dislocated shoulder and it pops out three different times, the doctors recommend you go back in there and have surgery so (the dislocation) doesn't happen again."

### On the status of DE Trevor Pryce

"Same thing. He'll see the doctor, probably some time this week again, to get another update."

### On if Sunday's loss was more difficult to take than others

"Yeah, it does. Anytime you lose it's pretty tough. But when you lose and you have an opportunity to put the game away so many times, it's difficult. What you do is go over those scenarios with the team, which the coaches are doing right now."

**On the 63-yard reception made by Raiders WR Ronald Curry**

"It was a missed assignment. (The Raiders) went to a different motion and we didn't have somebody in the middle of the field at that time. That's why the (receiver) was wide open."

**On the key to the Chargers turnaround this season**

"You just know that they are playing really well when you look at their stats offensively and defensively. At home they are scoring 37 points a game. That's pretty impressive. Take a look at their third-down situations, they have been very good. In the red zone they have been good. They have had balance in the running game and the passing game. (Drew Brees) is playing at a very high level. Twenty-one touchdowns, I believe, and three interceptions. That's impressive. He is a heady kid; he's always been very sharp. He's playing with a lot of confidence, and he's got a good supporting cast around him. Obviously he's got a running back and receivers and obviously (Antonio Gates) is playing at a very high level. Defensively, I don't know where they are at right now, I didn't look at their stats today, but they are in the top two or three in rush defense. Anytime a team stops the run, you have a chance for good things to happen. They are very well coordinated, (they have) good special teams, and it's one of the reasons they have the record that they have."

**On how he believes his team will respond against San Diego**

"Hopefully we will respond well. We know we have a big task against an excellent football team. Our football team understands what is at stake. We have to have a great week of preparation, we have to play well. Our football team is a veteran team, a smart team, and they understand what is at stake."

**On the play of CB Champ Bailey against Oakland**

"I thought the play right before the half was an unbelievable play. (Jerry Porter) does a corner-post and John Lynch goes back to the middle of the field, and Champ is really playing outside leverage and trying to help the safety. I think (Kerry Collins) looked at the (play development) and was going to throw the post route, and he just kind of takes it out and throws it over (Porter's) head. Champ's hand was right there, it was just a great play. Great execution and, Jerry Porter, that was a fantastic catch. Not many receivers make that catch. That's one of those things that happens, and that's why (the cornerback) is on an island. The other situation with 3rd-and-1, that was a big play. Champ can't do it all. That (play) was man-free. There is a free safety in the middle of the field, and you have to play your outside leverage. I thought (Champ) did a great job making the tackle. The other situation was a slant route on the goal line, or a skinny route on man-free. You have to play outside leverage and you have to play help. It was just like the Cincinnati game. The corner was playing zone coverage and the free safety takes the crossing route, and the (quarterback) throws a post route. When Champ makes the tackle everybody thinks (the receiver) is Champ's man. There are a lot of things that go into defenses. What you are asking is that guys make plays. Champ will be the first one to say that anytime a guy catches a pass, he's disappointed. There is a scheme that is involved, but I don't really get involved in that too often. I just let them go in one ear and out the other. (Champ) is probably disappointed that the one

touchdown pass went over his head, and obviously disappointed on that slant route. That is life in the big lanes. We are going to isolate him a lot on the (opponents) best receiver and sometimes they are going to make some plays."

**On the potential game-winning field goal against Oakland**

"Well, why would it have anything to do with Jason? You've got to understand football isn't all about a kicker. There's 10 other guys there. The snap was high, but I thought Micah did a good job getting it down. We had too much penetration inside. We did a great job the whole day against penetration. They had too much penetration. They were 4-yards deep. So, we go back and take a look at the things. You know, on special teams we did some good things. But our field goal protection, that wasn't one of the things we did well. Credit the Raiders, they got the penetration and they got their hands up. There's nothing Jason could've done in a scenario like that. I was pretty impressed that he did get a good foot on it, especially with how the snap was. Micah did a good job getting it down in some tough conditions. I think if it wasn't blocked it would've been good."

**On if the loss was a "total team collapse"**

"I wouldn't call it a total team collapse. But what you do is you look at the opportunities you had to put the game away and I think what you mean there is we had opportunities to put it away on offense, defense and special teams. We did some good things during the game but we gave some big plays up at the wrong time on defense. Offensively, all we've got to do is get a first down or a couple drives. Or when we do move the ball down the field on the last drive, we've got to execute on special teams. So, when you look at those things, you know there's so many scenarios that we could've put the team away and we didn't. So now you go back and look at yourself and toughen yourself. It's the same thing you do in all of the season. Especially, things like you said, with one or more different scenarios you could've won the football game."

**On the success of TE Antonio Gates**

"You take the big plays San Diego has been making, it's a combination of a lot of good players. Wide receivers are playing exceptionally well, the quarterback is making the right reads obviously. (Gates) is coming down with some big plays. He looks like a wide receiver out there."

**On how much he new about Gates before signing with San Diego**

"Zero. In fact, I asked about him. I said, 'Where did he play?' They said he played basketball. So, to be honest with you, I didn't know anything about him. But San Diego sure did a great job getting him."

**On whether or not the fumble credited to Jake Plummer was really the fault of running back Reuben Droughns**

"Well, you never know for sure, but it looked like Reuben had the ball and just took off. I don't know if it slid through him or what. The bottom line is we had the ball in pretty good field position. Especially in those conditions, you don't like to give the ball up. When you have the ball down there, you have to score points."



**BRONCOS HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN**

Mike Shanahan in 2004 completes a full decade as head coach of the Denver Broncos, and that decade of measurement against the game's all-time coaches places him among the pro football elite. After the team's 23-13 win over San Diego (9/26), he joined the exclusive club of head coaches to post 100 wins in the first 10 seasons with one club.

No head coach in the NFL has won more games than Mike Shanahan's 105 victories since the start of the 1995 season. Those 105 wins by Shanahan include seven straight in the playoffs (he is the only coach to have produced seven playoff wins in two years) during the 1997 and 1998 World Championship seasons, years in which he firmly established himself among the game's sideline greats. His postseason percentage of .700, on a 7-3 record, is second only to Vince Lombardi (9-1, .900) among coaches with more than five playoff victories.

Under Shanahan's guidance, Denver has: Posted the most wins in pro football history in a two-year period (33 in 1997-98); posted the most wins in pro football history in a three-year period (46 in 1996-98); won the most postseason games ever in a two-year period (seven, 1997-98); won 18 straight games over 1997-98 to tie the all-time NFL record for consecutive wins; been undefeated for three straight regular seasons at home (1996-98), just the second team ever to do so; and posted a 22-2 record in its last 24 games during the back-to-back title years.

He produced consecutive Super Bowl titles, three straight 13-plus win seasons (including postseason), and two AFC West titles from 1996-98. Shanahan led Denver to a 14-2 regular season mark and a 3-0 postseason mark in 1998, taking the Broncos back to the victorious Super Bowl glory they experienced in 1997. In his third season with the Broncos in 1997, Shanahan not only led the Broncos back to the Super Bowl for the first time in eight years, but he directed them to their first ever Super Bowl victory. Only Red Miller (1st year) in 1977 got a Broncos' team to the Super Bowl faster than Shanahan did.

In his 10<sup>th</sup> year with Denver, he has fashioned a franchise-record regular season home mark of **60-18 (.769)**, a regular season mark of **98-57 (.632)**, and an overall mark of **105-60 (.636)**. His NFL record as a head coach in regular season play is **106-69 (.606)** and his overall record is **113-72 (.611)**.

Over the last 12 years (ninth in Denver and the previous three in San Francisco) Mike Shanahan's offenses have finished number one in the NFL four times, second twice and third twice; in two of those campaigns Denver was just 17 yards and 83 yards short of the number one spot.

In 1998 the defending world champions stormed to their second straight title with an offense that scored 501 points and finished third in the NFL in total yards, while the defense had another spectacular postseason, allowing just 25 points and two touchdowns while sparking a remarkable 13-1 turnover ratio in the playoffs.

In 1997 he directed a Denver offense that scored a total of 583 points (29.2 per game) during the entire 1997 season, the fifth highest total in NFL history and the second highest total in AFC history for a combined regular and postseason. Of course, in 1998 Shanahan's Broncos topped that mark by producing 596 regular and postseason points. The all-time high of 636 points came from the 1994 World Champion San Francisco 49ers, for whom Shanahan was the offensive coordinator.

He led his team to a 12-4 regular season record in 1997, marking the first time in franchise history that the team won 12 or more games in back-to-back seasons.

During his NFL career, Shanahan has been a part of teams that have played in nine conference Championship Games, in addition to his six Super Bowl appearances (three victories), five with Denver and Super Bowl XXIX with San Francisco. In his 26 seasons as a pro and college coach, Shanahan's teams have participated in postseason or bowl games 21 times. Shanahan is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University, and also has a master's degree from that institution.

**CHARGERS HEAD COACH MARTY SCHOTTENHEIMER**

Marty Schottenheimer is in his third season as head coach of the San Diego Chargers. This is Schottenheimer's fourth stint as an NFL head coach, having previously guided the Cleveland Browns (1984-88), Kansas City Chiefs (1989-1998) and most recently the Washington Redskins (2001). Schottenheimer has compiled a record of 165-113-1 in regular season action.

The 60-year-old Schottenheimer has led his teams to the playoffs 11 times, more than any other active NFL coach. Since 1960, only four coaches have done it more; Don Shula (19), Tom Landry (18), Chuck Noll (12) and Bud Grant (12). All four have been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Schottenheimer is tied for fifth in league history with 11 playoff appearances.

From 1986-1997 as head coach of the Browns and Chiefs, Schottenheimer led his teams to 12 straight winning seasons and 10 trips to the playoffs. He led six of his teams to division titles, including the Browns in 1985, '86 and '87, and the Chiefs in 1993, '95 and '97. Including the playoffs, Schottenheimer has a combined record of 170-124-1 (.578) as an NFL head coach.



Prior to coaching the Redskins in 2001, Schottenheimer worked for two years (1999-2000) as an NFL analyst for ESPN.

From 1989-1998 Schottenheimer spent 10 seasons as head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs. During his tenure, the Chiefs posted a 101-58-1 regular-season record for a .634 winning percentage, which was the second highest in the NFL during that time span.

Prior to his successful stint in Kansas City, Schottenheimer spent four and a half seasons as the head coach of the Cleveland Browns from 1984 to 1988. During the four full seasons (1985-88) in which he was head coach of the Browns, Schottenheimer produced four playoff berths, three AFC Central titles, and two AFC Championship game appearances.

Schottenheimer's coaching career started with the Portland Storm of the World Football League in 1974. He began that season as one of the team's linebackers, but a shoulder injury ended his playing career and he remained with the team as an assistant coach, tutoring the Storm's linebackers.

In 1975, he landed his first NFL coaching job as the linebackers coach for the New York Giants. He was brought on board by Bill Arnsparger, the Chargers' defensive coordinator during their Super Bowl season in 1994, who returned to San Diego in 2002 as the team's Associate Head Coach-Defense. After two seasons (1975-76) as linebackers coach, Schottenheimer was named the Giants' defensive coordinator.

After one season (1977) as the Giants' defensive coordinator, Schottenheimer became the linebackers coach for the Detroit Lions for two seasons (1978-79). In 1980, he took over as the defensive coordinator for the Cleveland Browns. Schottenheimer became Cleveland's head coach midway through the 1984 season, taking over for Sam Rutigliano on Oct. 22, 1984 after the Browns had a 1-7 start. He went on to lead the Browns to a 4-4 record in the remaining eight games during his first half-season as an NFL head coach.

Born on September 23, 1943 in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania, Schottenheimer and his wife, Pat, have two children, Kristen (Feb. 17, 1970) and Brian (Oct. 16, 1973), and one grandchild, Brandon (April 20, 2001).

## BRONCOS CHAMPIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

The Denver Broncos honored their nominees for the Walter Payton Man of the Year 2004 awards at a private dinner on Thursday, Nov. 18. Jake Plummer, John Lynch, Rod Smith and Al Wilson were chosen and their community work was presented to a committee that chose Rod Smith as the organization's overall award winner. The NFL will announce the 2004 Walter Payton Man of the Year at the Super Bowl.

Williams is on pace to record 100 tackles, and if he regains the team lead, would make him only the second rookie ever to lead the Broncos in tackles and mark the first time in 32 years that such a feat has occurred. The last time a rookie led Denver in tackles was in 1972 when linebacker Tom Graham, a fourth-round draft choice from Oregon, tied for a team-high 91 tackles.

**HOLDING THE OPPONENTS AT BAY**

The Broncos have held seven of their 10 opponents under 20 points this season. Under Head Coach Shanahan, they are 66-15 (.815) when they hold their opponents under 20 points. In addition, the club is 44-3 (.936) when holding the opponent to 15 points or less, including six of 10 teams this year. Also, in that time the Broncos have only lost once when holding the opponent to 10 points or less. Below is a list of the 31 games in which Denver's defense has held the opponent to 10 points or under since 1995, (20-0 home and 10-1 on the road).

The Broncos won their season opener for the fourth straight year by defeating division rival Kansas City, 34-24, in front of 75,939 fans at INVESCO Field at Mile High and a national television audience on ESPN's Sunday Night Football. Second-year running back Quentin Griffin, in just his second career start, led the Broncos charge with three touchdowns (2 rush, 1 rec) and 156 yards rushing on 23 carries, setting a new franchise record for rushing yards in a season opener. Kansas City jumped on Denver early after running back Priest Holmes' 2-yard touchdown run completed an eight-play, 80-yard drive on the game's opening drive.

After a quarterback field goal by Jason Elam narrowed the gap for the Broncos, Denver took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter when quarterback Jake Plummer hit Griffin for a 1-yard touchdown. The Broncos defense stuffed the Chiefs once again to regain the ball, setting the stage for Griffin's second touchdown—a 25-yard scamper in which the tailback slashed through several defenders en route to the end zone.

Denver opened the second half with a 17-7 lead, but the Chiefs quickly got back in the game after capitalizing on two Broncos turnovers. Plummer's first pass of the half was intercepted by Kansas City linebacker Monty Beisel, setting up a 50-yard field goal by Lawrenceynes. On the Broncos' next possession, a solid Kansas City pass rush on third down forced Plummer to erratically weave the ball in the air and right into the hands of linebacker Shawn Barber (deep in Broncos' territory). The Chiefs took advantage when Holmes scored his second touchdown of the contest on a 4-yard run tying the score at 17-7.

Griffin stepped up once again on Denver's next drive, as he burst up the middle for a 47-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career. Holmes' day was not finished, however, as he tied the game on a 33-yard touchdown run, his third of the game, to knot the score at 24-24.

Elam helped the Broncos regain the lead after he booted a 45-yard field goal, and on the Kansas City's next possession, Denver's defense forced the Chiefs to punt. The Broncos responded with a 13-play, 87-yard drive that burned 7:10 on the clock and was capped by a 2-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to tight end Patrick Hape, securing the win for the Broncos.

Denver's offense amassed 413 total yards, including 202 on the ground. Defensive back Champ Bailey was solid in his Broncos debut, notching his 19th career interception in the second quarter and also doubled up as a wide receiver, catching one pass for 11 yards.

A stingy defensive effort and a 294-yard passing day by quarterback Jake Plummer helped the Broncos improve to 2-1 with a 23-13 victory over the San Diego Chargers before a crowd of 74,533 at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

Denver scored first on its second drive of the game, as Plummer connected with wide receiver Rod Smith for a 16-yard touchdown to cap off a six-play, 72-yard drive to give the Broncos a 7-0 lead.

Holding on to a 10-3 lead early in the second quarter, the Broncos forced a fumble after safety Keny Kennedy sacked San Diego quarterback Drew Brees and defensive tackle Mario Fatatehi scooped up the ball on the Chargers' 36-yard line. Fatatehi's 8-yard return to the Chargers' 29-yard line helped set up an eventual 23-yard Jason Elam field goal to give Denver a 13-3 lead.

In the second half, a Quentin Griffin fumble on Denver's second play of the third quarter yielded a seven-play, 36-yard drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by Brees to close the gap to 13-10.

On the ensuing drive, the Chargers forced the Broncos to punt, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave Denver new life and the ball on San Diego's 34-yard line. After the Chargers' defense forced Denver into another 4th-down situation, the Broncos opted to go for it, and the result was a 33-yard touchdown strike from Plummer to wide receiver Ashley Lelie to give the Broncos a 20-10 advantage. Elam's 43-yard field goal on the Broncos' second drive of the fourth quarter gave Denver a 23-13 lead they would hold on to.

The Broncos kept San Diego star running back LaDainian Tomlinson in check for most of the contest, limiting the All-Pro to just 60 yards rushing, his lowest rushing output in his last 15 games.

Smith led all receivers with five catches for 75 yards while Plummer completed 25 of 36 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 112.5.

The Broncos suffered their second loss of the season at the hands of the Cincinnati Bengals, 23-10, before a national audience on ABC's *Monday Night Football* and a record crowd of 65,806 at Paul Brown Stadium.

The Bengals struck first in the opening quarter when quarterback Carson Palmer found a wide open Chad Johnson for a 50-yard touchdown pass. He got so open after cornerback Champ Bailey tripped while in man coverage, freeing up the receiver on the play. The Broncos' defense held strong in the first half despite falling behind early as they stuffed Bengals running back Rudi Johnson on a 4th-and-1 attempt on Denver's 5-yard line. Cincinnati drove into the red zone once again on their next possession, but Bailey picked off a Palmer pass intended for Johnson at the 4-yard line to halt the drive.

Unfortunately, Denver's offense was unable to capitalize on the turnover, giving the ball back to the Bengals with an interception of their own, by former Broncos cornerback DeShaun O'Neal. Cincinnati made Denver pay for the turnover, as kicker Shayne Graham booted a 53-yard field goal to give the Bengals a 10-0 lead in the second quarter.

On their next drive, the Broncos capped off an eight-play, 72-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to wide receiver Rod Smith, narrowing the Bengals lead to 10-7.

In waning moments of the first half, running back Reuben Droughns coughed the ball up, and Cincinnati would capitalize, with a 34-yard Graham field goal to take a 13-7 advantage into the locker room.

A 29-yard field goal by kicker Jason Eam brought the Broncos to within three points in the third quarter (13-10), but Johnson's 36-yard touchdown run two drives later gave the Bengals a 20-10 lead.

Graham hit a 35-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to round out scoring, which was set up by Plummer's second interception of the game.

For the third consecutive week, Droughns eclipsed the century mark in rushing yards, racking up 110 on 24 carries (4.7). Plummer finished the game 23 of 40 passing for 221 yards and a touchdown, but threw two interceptions.

Smith—who caught five passes for 50 yards—eclipsed the 9,000 career receiving yardage mark on his second catch of the game, becoming 31st player in NFL history to achieve this mark.

Despite a record-setting day offensively for the Broncos, the Atlanta Falcons rallied from an early 14-3 deficit to top Denver, 41-28, in front of 75,083 fans at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

The Broncos jumped out to a 7-0 lead on the game's first drive, as quarterback Jake Plummer found tight end Patrick Hape for a one-yard touchdown. After Atlanta's Jay Feely kicked a 24-yard field goal, Denver needed just one play on the ensuing drive to reach pay dirt as Plummer connected with Rod Smith for an 80-yard touchdown, the longest reception of the veteran receiver's career.

The Falcons would narrow Denver's lead to 14-10 on a 21-yard touchdown run by T.J. Duckett, and after Plummer was intercepted on a tipped pass by Patrick Kerney, Vick led his team down field for a 34-yard strike to Peerless Price in the end zone to put Atlanta ahead, 17-14. Plummer's second interception, on the next drive, would yield a 43-yard field goal by Feely near the end of the first half, and a 26-14 lead.

On Atlanta's first possession of the third quarter, Broncos linebacker Al Wilson socked Vick on a third-and-5, but the play was negated by a defensive holding call on cornerback Lenny Walls. The drive was extended, and the Falcons capitalized with Warrick Dunn's 5-yard touchdown run, giving Atlanta a 27-14 advantage.

Following a 25-yard touchdown pass from Vick to Price to start of the fourth quarter (34-14), the Broncos closed the gap as Plummer tossed a 7-yard touchdown pass to Darius Watts. Denver had a chance to make it a one-touchdown game on its next possession, as they drove to Atlanta's 7-yard line, but Watts could not handle a Plummer pass in the end zone on fourth down, ending the Broncos' hopes of a comeback.

Plummer finished the day by completing 31-of-55 passes for a career-high and Broncos' record 499 yards passing and tied his personal best with four touchdown passes, but threw three interceptions. Smith also set a career high with 208 yards receiving on nine receptions, which ranks as the franchise's second-best single game output (214 by Shannon Sharpe vs. Kansas City 10/20/02).

Quarterback Jake Plummer tossed four touchdown passes for the second straight game to lead the Broncos past the Houston Texans, 31-13, before a crowd of 74,292 at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

Aside from snapping a two-game skid and improving to 6-3 on the season, the game also had historic relevance for the Broncos, as veteran wide receiver Rod Smith became Denver's all-time leader in career receptions and touchdown receptions. In the first quarter, the Broncos capped off a 99-yard scoring drive with a 34-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to tight end Jeb Putzier, his second-career touchdown.

Denver's defense held strong on the Texans' next possession, stopping David Carr's quarterback sneak on 4th-and-inches at the 50-yard-line. After the Broncos took over, Smith caught a 9-yard pass giving him 676 on his career, which moved him ahead of former tight end Shannon Sharpe for first on the all-time franchise list. Denver would capitalize on the drive, when Jason Elam hit a 52-yard field goal to give the Broncos a 10-0 lead.

On their next possession, the Broncos were pinned back on their own 16-yard line when Houston's Antwan Peek blocked a Micah Knorr punt which was recovered by Jonathan Wells and advanced to the Denver 1-yard line. Houston pulled to within 3 points (10-7) after Dominick Davis scored on a 1-yard run.

Denver responded quickly, however, as Plummer rolled out on a bootleg and found wide receiver Ashley Lelie deep for a 40-yard score, giving the Broncos a 17-7 lead.

After the Broncos defense forced Houston to punt, an unnecessary roughness penalty on the Texans gave Denver the ball at Houston's 47-yard line. Plummer led the Broncos to another touchdown late in the first half, on a 13-yard touchdown pass to Smith, and the Broncos had a 24-7 lead. It was the 56th touchdown reception of Smith's career, besting the previous Broncos record of 55 also set by Sharpe.

Denver would increase its lead in the third quarter on a 23-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to fullback Kyle Johnson. The Texans added a late touchdown in the fourth quarter on Davis' second scoring run to close out the scoring.

Running back Reuben Droughins notched his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season as he ran for 120 yards on 29 carries, and Plummer completed 16 of 24 passes for 234 yards, four touchdowns, and a season-high 137.8 passer rating.

The Broncos raced out to a 20-0 first quarter lead and never looked back en route to a 34-13 victory over the New Orleans Saints before a crowd of 64,900 at the Louisiana Superdome.

Denver, which improved to 7-3 on the season, wasted no time jumping on the Saints' defense as running back Reuben Droughins busted out for a 51-yard touchdown run on the team's first offensive play of the game. After the defense forced New Orleans to punt, the Broncos offense needed just three plays to score as quarterback Jake Plummer found wide receiver Ashley Lelie for a 37-yard touchdown pass, increasing the lead to 14-0. Jason Elam kicked field goals of 48 and 34 yards to cap off scoring in the 20-0 first quarter for Denver.

Kicker John Carney got New Orleans on the scoreboard with a 24-yard field goal in the second quarter, and on the Saints' next possession, on 3rd-and-8, Denver's defense put pressure on Saints quarterback Aaron Brooks, forcing a wild throw right into the hands of linebacker Al Wilson, who returned the ball 7 yards for a touchdown. It was Denver's first defensive touchdown of the season and the first interception return for a touchdown in Wilson's career.

A 30-yard touchdown pass from Brooks to wide receiver Dante Stallworth and another field goal by Carney brought New Orleans to within 14 points (27-13) at halftime.

The Broncos capped a 12-play, 76-yard scoring drive early in the fourth quarter with a 19-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to fullback Kyle Johnson, his second touchdown reception of the season, to give Denver a commanding 34-13 advantage.

The Saints threatened to score on the next drive moving down to the Denver 7-yard line, but Broncos cornerback Champ Bailey made an acrobatic diving interception in the end zone on 4th-and-2 to deny the Saints another score. The Saints were again poised to reach the end zone near the end of the fourth quarter, but defensive end Reggie Hayward grabbed Denver's season-high third interception of the game and returned it 76 yards before being brought down at the 5-yard line, ending any threat of a comeback. Droughins rushed for 166 yards rushing on 28 carries, marking his fifth 100-yard rushing game in six starts this season. Plummer completed 19-of-29 passes for 224 yards and two touchdowns and a passer rating of 111.9.

On a snowy, frigid evening at INVESCO Field at Mile High, Oakland rallied from an 11-point deficit in the fourth quarter to send the Broncos to a 25-24 defeat in front of a national-television audience on ESPN's *Sunday Night Football* and 75,936 fans. The Broncos had a chance to win the game after Jake Plummer drove his team downfield in the final minutes of the contest, but a 43-yard Jason Elam field goal attempt was blocked by tackle Langston Walker to seal the victory for Oakland.

Ahead 3-0 in the second quarter, Plummer found wide receiver Rod Smith deep for an 85-yard touchdown pass, giving Denver a 10-0 lead. It marked the eighth-longest pass play in Broncos history, and set career-highs in yardage for both players. Oakland rebounded quickly as Doug Gabriel returned the kickoff to the Raiders 49-yard line, setting up a 42-yard touchdown pass from Kerry Collins to wide receiver Jerry Porter with just 23 seconds remaining in the half.

Oakland capitalized off a Reuben Droughins fumble at the start of the second half with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Collins to Porter, and took a 13-10 lead. Denver regained control of the game in the fourth quarter, as Plummer found wide receiver Ashley Lelie for a 57-yard strike which set up a Droughins 3-yard touchdown run, putting the Broncos ahead 17-13. The Broncos upped their lead on Oakland's next drive, as defensive tackle Monsanto Pope tipped a Collins pass at the line of scrimmage which was intercepted by Ellis Johnson, who returned it 32 yards for the score.

With the Broncos holding a 24-13 advantage with six minutes remaining in the game, the Raiders mounted a comeback beginning with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Collins to Ronald Curry, bringing Oakland within five after missing a two-point conversion attempt.

After a 63-yard pass from Collins to Curry brought the Raiders to the Denver 10-yard line, they would take the lead on Porter's third touchdown reception of the game, a five-yard pass from Collins on 4th-and-goal from the 5-yard line with 1:49 left to play in the game.

Down by one, Plummer completed passes of 16, 14, and 12 yards to set up a 43-yard field goal attempt by Elam, but Oakland's Langston Walker batted down the kick to end Denver's comeback hopes.

Droughins finished the game with 102 yards rushing on 28 attempts, his sixth 100-yard game in the past seven, while Plummer completed 14-of-23 passes for 245 yards with a touchdown and an interception.

- He ranks third in the AFC (6<sup>th</sup> in NFL) with 2,751 passing yards and ranks fifth in the AFC (10<sup>th</sup> in NFL) with 210 completions.
- In only 11 games this season, Plummer has set a single-season career high in touchdown passes with 22 (he previously threw 18 touchdowns in 2001 and 2002 with the Cardinals).
- His 22 touchdown passes rank second in the AFC (4<sup>th</sup> in NFL).
- Plummer became only the second quarterback in Broncos history (Craig Morton in 1981) to throw eight touchdowns in a two-game span with four scoring passes vs. Hou. (11/7) and vs. Atl. (10/31).
- His four touchdown passes vs. Hou. (11/7) tied a career high and marked his fourth career four-touchdown game to help him achieve a single-game career-best 137.8 passer rating.
- In throwing for 499 yards vs. Atl. (10/31), Plummer posted the ninth-highest single-game yardage total in NFL history and the highest single-game total in Broncos history.
- His 499 passing yards vs. Atl. (10/31) marked the highest single-game passing total of any quarterback this season.

Plummer's creativity behind center has resulted in several miraculous performances this season as he has completed 210-of-354 passes (59.3%) for 2,751 yards with 22 touchdowns and 11 interceptions in starting all 11 games. **An offensive co-captain for the Broncos, Plummer ranks third in the AFC (6<sup>th</sup> in NFL) in passing yards and ranks fifth in the AFC (10<sup>th</sup> in NFL) in completions.** His touchdown total, a single-season career high, ranks second in the AFC (4<sup>th</sup> in NFL). In snowy, frigid conditions vs. Oak. (11/28), he completed a career-long 85-yard touchdown pass, the eighth-longest passing play in team history, to Rod Smith in the second quarter and finished the game 14-of-23 (60.9%) for 245 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Plummer also connected with Ashley Lelie on a 57-yard pass late against the Raiders, which moved Denver to the Oakland 3-yard line and set up a touchdown run on the next play. He was extremely efficient in Denver's game at N.O. (11/21) and finished the day throwing for two touchdown passes, which moved him ahead of Steve Ramsey for seventh place on the Broncos' all-time touchdown passes list (35), and 224 yards on 19-of-29 (65.5%) passing. His play resulted in a 111.9 passer rating, which was his second consecutive game with a passer rating more than 100.0, and a Denver score on its first four possessions to give it a 20-0 first-quarter lead. Against the Saints, he tossed back-to-back passes of 30 or more yards (33 and 37 yds.) on a first-quarter drive to Ashley Lelie with the latter strike a touchdown pass. He concluded Denver's scoring when he connected with fullback Kyle Johnson in stride for a 19-yard score that earned him his seventh multiple-

touchdown game this season. **Plummer became only the second quarterback in Broncos history (Craig Morton in 1981) to throw eight touchdowns in a two-game span** with stellar outings vs. Hou. (11/7) and vs. Atl. (10/31). In throwing for four touchdowns and 234 yards in a 16-of-24 performance vs. Hou. (11/7), **Plummer set a single-game career best with a 137.8 passer rating.** He connected with four different Denver players on his scoring passes, including a second-quarter strike to Rod Smith that moved the receiver into first place all-time in touchdowns by a Bronco. Plummer made a brilliant read on Smith's record-setting touchdown as he pump faked, scampered toward the line of scrimmage and found a wide open Smith in the left corner of the end zone. He also connected with Smith on a 9-yard pass in the second quarter to give Smith more receptions than any other player in franchise history. **He posted the ninth-highest single-game yardage mark in NFL history and set a franchise record with 499 passing yards** on 31-of-55 passing (56.3%) with four touchdowns and three interceptions vs. Atl. (10/31). His four touchdowns against the Falcons tied a career high and were spread out to four different receivers on scoring drives that were all 69 yards or longer, including an 80-yard TD strike to Rod Smith in the first quarter that tied for the longest completion of his career (he also threw an 80-yd. TD pass at St. Louis 12/15/02). Additionally, he moved ahead of Steve DeBerg for eighth place on the Broncos' all-time passing yards list against the Falcons. In Denver's lone Monday night appearance and 100<sup>th</sup>-career start at Cin. (10/25), Plummer completed 23-of-40 passes for 221 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. He moved into ninth place on the Broncos' all-time passing yardage list (ahead of Micky Slaughter) and passed Steve DeBerg for eighth place on the franchise's all-time completions list against the Bengals. He rolled to his right and found Rod Smith for a 3-yard score in the second quarter, marking the Broncos' only touchdown of the game in Cincinnati. He threw three touchdowns, all of which occurred in the first half, at Dak. (10/17) in passing for 190 yards on 11-of-20 passing with one interception to lead the Broncos' offense to 31 unanswered points. **Plummer led the Broncos to a 28-point win against the Raiders, the largest margin of victory in a road game against the Raiders in franchise history.** His performance at Oakland was his seventh career game with three or more touchdowns, and it marked the third contest in which he threw for three scores in a half. Plummer connected on two of his scoring passes to tight ends while also finding wide receiver Ashley Lelie for a 31-yard score. After throwing a pair of third-quarter interceptions vs. Car. (10/10), Plummer bounced back by directing the Broncos to his 19<sup>th</sup>-career comeback victory against the Panthers when his 39-yard touchdown pass in the corner of the end zone to Ashley Lelie capped off an 87-yard drive early in the final period. **His comeback against the Panthers marked his 25<sup>th</sup> game-winning or game-tying scoring drive in the fourth quarter or overtime.** He finished the game against the Panthers with 226 yards on 17-of-29 passing with two touchdowns and two interceptions. He guided Denver to a win at T.B. (10/3) with 138 yards on 13-of-30 passing with one touchdown and no interceptions. Plummer fooled the Buccaneers' defense on a bootleg before throwing a 5-yard score for Denver's lone touchdown. He efficiently managed Denver's offense in the fourth quarter against the Buccaneers as the Broncos held onto the ball for 13:20 in the final period, **ensuring Plummer of his 24<sup>th</sup> game-winning or game-tying scoring drive in the fourth quarter or overtime.** Plummer threw for a season-high 294 yards and two touchdowns on 25-of-36 passing (69.4%) vs. S.D. (9/26). His 294 passing yards were the most he had in a game since Nov. 18, 2001, vs. Detroit. He threw a clutch 33-yard touchdown strike to wide receiver Ashley Lelie on fourth-and-9 in the third quarter with the Chargers trailing by only 3. **In the second quarter against the Chargers, he moved into 10<sup>th</sup> place on the Broncos' all-time passing yards list, ahead of John McCormick.** He threw for a then-season-high 250 yards on 23-of-39 passing with no touchdowns or interceptions at Jac. (9/19) while also scrambling for 24 yards on the ground. He hit wide receiver Ashley Lelie in stride for a 39-yard gain on the Broncos' 10-play, 76-yard drive at the end of the second half that set up Denver's second field goal of the game. Plummer directed the Broncos to a win in their season opener vs. K.C. (9/12) by completing 18-of-29 passes (with completions to eight different receivers) for a game-high 230 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He connected with WR Ashley Lelie for a 58-yard completion in the third quarter and also proved to be a threat on the ground, setting a career-high with eight rushes. Plummer led a pivotal 13-play, 87-yard touchdown drive late in the game that ate up 7:10 and resulted in a 2-yard touchdown pass to seal Denver's win. **The win was his 23<sup>rd</sup> career game-winning or game-tying fourth-quarter scoring drive in the fourth quarter or overtime.**

**2004 Regular Season:** Bell is steadily developing during his rookie season and has rushed 14 times for 57 yards (4.1 avg.) through nine games as a backup. He also recently has begun to show his ability on special teams, making four tackles on coverage units to tie for eighth on the Broncos in that category. Bell saw action on special teams only vs. **Oak. (11/28)**. He made a team-high three special teams tackles at **N.O. (11/21)** in a game that did not see him record a rushing statistic. He chased down Saints kick returner Michael Lewis on a second-quarter return during which Lewis used his elusiveness to gain 26 yards before Bell corralled him. Bell competed on special teams vs. **Hou. (11/7)**. He was inactive for Denver's game vs. **Atl. (10/31)** with a hamstring injury suffered a week earlier. While he did not record a rush at **Cin. (10/25)** on *Monday Night Football*, the rookie contributed on special teams against the Bengals. Bell saw the most action he's seen all year at **Oak. (10/17)** by rushing six times for 25 yards (4.2 avg.). He was a factor on special teams against the Raiders, making the first tackle of his career on that unit. All of his yards against the Raiders came in relief of starter Reuben Droughns in the fourth quarter, including a 13-yard scamper around the left side on third-and-5. In Denver's comeback win vs. **Car. (10/10)**, both of Bell's carries came in the first quarter to give the back a total of five yards for the game. At **T.B. (10/3)**, Bell returned from the rib injury that kept him out of Denver's previous game to play on special teams only against the Buccaneers. He was inactive vs. **S.D. (9/26)** with a rib injury that he suffered in practice leading up to the game. In Denver's game at **Jac. In 11 games (10 starts), **Droughns leads the Broncos in rushing with 946 yards on 202 carries (4.7 avg.) with three touchdowns** while catching 24 passes for 162 yards (6.8 avg.) with a score. While only starting seven games at running back, he already ranks fifth in the AFC (7<sup>th</sup> in NFL) in rushing. **He owns three of the top 13 rushing performances in the NFL this season (193 yds. vs. Car. 10/10, 176 yds. at Oak. 10/17 and 166 yds. at N.O. 11/21).** He has accounted for a team-high 61 first downs (51 rushing, 10 receiving) to tie for fourth in the AFC (tied for 5<sup>th</sup> in NFL). Droughns was Denver's primary kick returner for its first five games and has a 25.2 avg. on 13 returns for 327 yards. His production on special teams **earned him AFC Special Teams Player of the Month honors for September to mark the first time a Broncos kick return garnered that award.** Droughns' success on special teams extends to punt and kick coverage, where he has made four tackles to tie for eighth on the team. In snowy, frigid conditions vs. **Oak. (11/28)**, Droughns eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the sixth time in his last seven games with 102 yards on 28 carries (3.6 avg.) with a touchdown, a 3-yard score early in the fourth quarter. He recorded the longest run of his career on the Broncos' first play from scrimmage at **N.O. (11/21)** when he took off around the left side on a 51-yard touchdown run as part of the 166 yards he gained on 28 carries (5.9 avg.). Droughns, who also caught two passes for 25 yards against the Saints (12.5 avg.), was difficult to contain in the first half as he gained 106 yards (10.6 avg.) by halftime. He put up solid numbers vs. **Hou. (11/7)** by picking up 120 yards on 29 carries (4.1 avg.). Against the Texans, he gained nearly 40 yards each quarter in one of the most consistent performances of his career. While having a quiet day rushing the ball vs. **Atl. (10/31)** in only gaining 49 yards on 15 carries (3.3 avg.), Droughns posted a career-high six receptions and 63 yards receiving (10.5 avg.) against the Falcons. Most of his action against Atlanta came on the Broncos' opening drive of the game as he rushed five times for 17 yards and caught an 11-yard pass to help Denver score a touchdown on its first possession. He eclipsed the 100-yard mark for the third consecutive game at **Cin. (10/25)** on *Monday Night Football*, rushing for 110 yards on 24 carries (4.6 avg.). He also tied a career high with four receptions for 20 yards (5.0 avg.) against the Bengals. Droughns, who rushed for 49 yards in the second quarter and gained five yards or more on 10 of his final 12 rushes before halftime against the Bengals, did not carry the ball in the fourth quarter as the Broncos' attempted to rally from a 10-point deficit. He set a franchise record for most carries in a non-overtime game at **Oak. (10/17)** with 38 rushes for 176 yards (4.6 avg.) with one touchdown to earn **FedEx Ground NFL Player of the Week honors. His 38 carries in a game are the most by a running back in the NFL this season.** Droughns had 82 yards in the second quarter against the Raiders, including four runs of more than 10 yards, to help him record the first 100-yard half of his career (103 total yards). With regular starter Quentin Griffin inactive vs. **Car. (10/10)** with an ankle injury, Droughns took advantage of his first start at tailback as a Bronco by rushing for 193 yards on 30 carries (6.4 avg.) to mark the **highest rushing total by a Denver player in his first start at running back and the ninth-highest rushing total by a Broncos back in the regular season (10<sup>th</sup> in any game).** He registered most of his yards in bruising fashion, and it took several Panthers to bring him down on a 15-yard third-down run in the second quarter that set up his 5-yard receiving touchdown, which was his first score this season. **His career rushing day marked the second-highest single-game rushing output by an NFL back through Week 7.** Droughns also caught a career-high four passes for 18 yards while totaling 10 of the Broncos' 23 first downs (8 rushing, 2 receiving) against the Panthers. In addition to returning two kicks for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) at **T.B. (10/3)**, he was used in short-yardage situations as well as on one-back sets and gained a season-high 20 yards on eight carries (2.5 avg.). He pulled Buccaneers defensive back Dwight Smith with him to pick up a tough third-and-1 with Denver at its 19-yard line late in a close game. Droughns gained a career-high 137 yards on four returns (34.3 avg.) vs. **S.D. (9/26)**. All four of his returns that day went for 20 or more yards, including a 48-yarder. He also had a team-high three special teams tackles against San Diego.

Griffin showed flashes of big-play ability in six games (four starts) at running back **before he was placed on injured reserve Oct. 27 with a torn ACL in his right knee, which was repaired Nov. 9.** Before the injury, he collected 311 yards on 85 carries (3.7 avg.) with two touchdowns while catching 10 passes for 68 yards (6.8 avg.) with a score. The elusive Griffin was used as the Broncos' primary kick returner for two games and gained 52 yards returning four kicks (13.0 avg.) He suffered a torn ACL in his right knee returning a kick on the opening kickoff of the second half at **Cin. (10/25)** on *Monday Night Football* and did not return. Although he did not record a rush against Cincinnati, Griffin returned three kickoffs for 33 yards (11.0 avg.), including a 21-yard return in the second quarter that set up Denver's lone

touchdown drive, before injuring his knee. Back in the lineup after missing the previous week with an ankle injury, Griffin totaled four carries for 16 yards (4.0 avg.) at **Oak. (10/17)**. He returned the first kickoff of his career against the Raiders, taking a first-quarter kick 19 yards to put the Broncos in excellent field position to begin their first touchdown drive of the game. He was inactive vs. **Car. (10/10)** with an ankle injury. The second-year back picked up 66 yards on 21 carries (3.1 avg.) at **T.B. (10/3)**, including 44 fourth-quarter yards, while catching a 15-yard pass. Griffin broke free for a 12-yard run in the fourth quarter that put Denver in position for the field goal that proved to be the game winner. He struggled with the Chargers' 3-4 defense vs. **S.D. (9/26)** and was held to a season-low seven yards on 12 carries (0.6 avg.). One of his three catches against the Chargers went for 22 yards on a swing pass and moved Denver into scoring range early in the second quarter, setting up a field goal. He also had a key block on a Chargers blitz in the third quarter, clearing the way for a 16-yard Jake Plummer completion on a touchdown drive. At **Jac. (9/19)**, the Jaguars' stingy run defense limited Griffin to 66 yards rushing on 25 carries (2.6 avg.), but his five catches for 29 yards (5.8 avg.) were a career high and more than any Jaguars receiver totaled. He was unable to secure Jake Plummer's handoff with the Broncos in position for a game-winning field goal with less than a minute in the game, allowing the Jaguars to end Denver's comeback attempt. Griffin enjoyed a record-setting day vs. **K.C. (9/12)** as **he set a franchise record for most rushing yards in a season opener with a career and game-high 156 yards on 23 carries (6.8 avg.) and scored the first three touchdowns (two rush, one reception) of his career.** His opening-weekend numbers ranked at the top of several offensive categories, including rushing yards (156 — second in NFL), first downs (eight — tied for third in the league), scoring (18 points — tied for first in the league) and total yards from scrimmage (157 — tied for third in the AFC). **The 156 yards he totaled on the ground are the 10th-highest single-game rushing total gained this season.** Griffin scored on 25 and 47-yard touchdown runs against the Chiefs, with the latter run coming in the third quarter with the score tied at 17, and he added a 1-yard touchdown catch for the first scoring reception of his career.

### 2004 Regular Season:

Hearst has provided Denver depth at running back in five games, rushing 11 times for 33 yards (3.0 avg.) and catching a 5-yard pass. He ran once for two yards vs. **Oak. (11/28)**, giving starter Reuben Droughns a quick rest in the second quarter. When the Broncos kneeled on the ball to run out the clock in a win at **N.O. (11/21)**, Hearst recorded his only snaps that day on offense. He saw his most extensive action of the season vs. **Hou. (11/7)**, rushing five times for 13 yards (2.6 avg.). His carries against the Texans were his first rushing attempts in more than a month. His 3-yard run for a first down late in the second quarter against Houston occurred on the play before Jake Plummer's 40-yard touchdown pass to Ashley Lelie. ### 2004 Regular Season:

Johnson has become a reliable pass-catcher and lead blocker at the fullback position, playing in all 11 of the Broncos' games (2 starts). Statistically, his biggest contributions this season have come as a pass catcher who has tallied seven receptions for 104 yards (14.9 avg.) with two touchdowns. **He also has been a solid contributor on special teams, making seven tackles on kickoff and punt coverage to tie for third on the Broncos.** Johnson hauled in two second-quarter passes to record eight yards (4.0 avg.) receiving vs. **Oak. (11/28)**, and he added a stop on special teams. In his second career start at **N.O. (11/21)**, he used his speed to turn a short catch into a 19-yard score early in the fourth quarter. He also served as a lead blocker for Reuben Droughns, helping the back gain 166 yards. Johnson had a career day vs. **Hou. (10/25)** on *Monday Night Football* and was involved in Denver's special teams effort, tackling Bengals return man Kenny Watson on a third-quarter kickoff. He played special teams only at **Oak. (10/17)**. With Reuben Droughns starting at running back vs. **Car. (10/10)**, Johnson replaced Droughns as the team's primary fullback against the Panthers but did not start because Denver opened the game in a three-wide receiver set, and he helped block for Droughns as he recorded the ninth-highest single-game rushing total (193 yds.) in franchise history. **He made a 31-yard catch, the first of his career,** on a quick pass from Jake Plummer over the middle in the first quarter that moved the Broncos into Carolina territory on their drive that resulted in their second field goal of the game. Johnson briefly played at fullback at **T.B. (10/3)**, including an appearance on the Broncos' fourth-quarter scoring drive that set up Denver's field goal that proved to be the game winner. Additionally, he made his first career tackle on special teams against the Buccaneers. He saw one play at fullback and played substantially on special teams vs. **S.D. (9/26)**. At **Jac. (9/19)**, Johnson played on special teams only. He saw most of his action on special teams vs. **K.C. (9/12)** in Denver's season opener while also filling in sparingly at fullback. He had a key block on a 32-yard kick return by Roc Alexander in the third quarter against the Chiefs.

### 2004 Regular Season:

Jackson has emerged as an option at receiver for the Broncos, playing in all 11 games and catching eight passes for 73 yards (9.1 avg.). **He also has made a difference on special teams by collecting six tackles on kickoff and punt coverage that tie for the fifth-highest total on the team.** He did not record a catch vs. **Oak. (11/28)** or at **N.O. (11/21)** but did compete on special teams. In the late-November game against the Raiders, he tied for the team-high with two special teams tackles. Jackson played receiver vs. **Hou. (11/7)** as well as special teams, and he drew a 15-yard unnecessary roughness penalty on a second-quarter punt return that set up Denver's third touchdown of the game. Jackson was tangled up on the ground with the Texans' Jonathan Wells but did not retaliate against Wells' aggressive play, forcing the penalty. Although he was held without a catch vs. **Atl. (10/31)**, he caught Falcons punt returner Allen Rossum from behind for a tackle to stop a 39-yard third-quarter return. Jackson enjoyed a career game on *Monday Night Football* at **Cin. (10/25)**, setting career highs in receptions (4) and receiving yards (33) to total an 8.3 yards-per-reception average. **His four receptions against the Bengals equaled his total reception output for his seven career games played up to that point.** Jackson did not have a catch against the Bengals until the fourth quarter when he made several clutch receptions, including back-to-back 8-yard grabs with Denver looking to mount a comeback. At **Oak. (10/17)** in front of many of the fans who supported him when he played at nearby Menlo College, Jackson appeared on offense but did not make a catch. He caught a pass in a game for the third time this season vs. **Car. (10/10)** with a 6-yard reception in the third quarter. His lone catch at **T.B. (10/3)**, a 9-yarder along the sideline, occurred during a crucial fourth-quarter drive that set up a Denver field goal that proved to be the game winner. Jackson appeared at wide receiver in a few situations vs. **S.D. (9/26)** while also playing on special teams, making two tackles on that unit. He made the first two catches of his career at **Jac. (9/19)** during the Broncos' final drive of the game. **The first catch of his career was a 5-yard grab just before the two-minute warning, and he followed that up with a 20-yard reception (the longest catch on that drive) that put Denver in scoring position.** He saw the majority of his playing time vs. **K.C. (9/12)** on special teams and had limited duty on offense, where he did not make a catch.

## 2004 Regular Season:

Lelie's size and ability to get down the field have given the Broncos' offense a deep threat this season, and he has made several big plays in crucial situations on the way to leading the team in yards-per-catch average (18.6 avg.) while ranking second on the team with 39 receptions and 724 receiving yards. His yards-per-catch average ranks third in the NFL among eligible receivers. **All six of Lelie's touchdown receptions have been longer than 30 yards (37, 40, 35, 31, 39 and 33 yds.), and he leads the NFL in that statistic. Additionally, his six touchdown receptions of more than 30 yards ranks as the second-highest single-season total in franchise history (Anthony Miller had 10 in 1995).** In snowy, frigid conditions vs. Oak. (11/28), Lelie led Denver in receptions with four catches for 80 yards (20.0 avg.). The majority of his yards against the Raiders came on a 57-yard, fourth-quarter catch in which he pulled in the ball and stumbled to the ground before gaining an additional 10 yards to the Oakland 3-yard line, setting up a touchdown run on the next play. He came up with his two biggest receptions on back-to-back plays in the first quarter at N.O. (11/21) by catching a 33-yard pass from Jake Plummer before hauling in a 37-yard touchdown. He finished the Broncos' game against the Saints with three receptions for 79 yards (26.3 avg.) and a touchdown. Lelie hauled in his fifth touchdown catch of the season longer than 30 yards vs. Hou. (11/7) with a 40-yard touchdown reception in the second quarter, and he finished the game with a team-high four catches and 81 yards receiving (20.3 avg.). One of his biggest plays vs. Houston was not a catch but rather a 36-yard pass interference call he drew on Texans cornerback Aaron Glenn in the first quarter that helped Denver set up its first touchdown of the game. He recorded his second consecutive six-catch game vs. Atl. (10/31) as he collected a season-high 94 receiving yards, including a 35-yard touchdown catch. He turned in a big fourth quarter against the Falcons by collecting 54 receiving yards on a single drive (13, 6 and 35-yard catches) that ended with his touchdown reception. On *Monday Night Football* at Cin. (10/25), Lelie had a team-high six catches for 82 yards. He hauled in a 35-yard pass in the third quarter that put the Broncos inside Cincinnati's 20-yard line to set up a field goal, which trimmed the Bengals' lead to 3. He came down with a 31-yard touchdown in the second quarter at Oak. (10/17) on his way to making two catches for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) against the Raiders. On third down in the fourth quarter vs. Car. (10/10) with the Broncos trailing by four, Lelie made a 39-yard, over-the-shoulder, touchdown catch in the corner of the end zone that proved to be the game winner, **marking the third consecutive week that he was involved in the game-changing play.** He added another catch against the Panthers to total 52 yards on two catches (26.0 avg.). Although he only caught one pass for three yards at T.B. (10/3), his effort in going after a fourth-quarter pass helped result in a 37-yard pass interference call that put Denver in position to make a field goal that proved to be the game winner. Lelie pulled down a spectacular 33-yard touchdown grab, which proved to be the

game-winner, over the head of Chargers cornerback Quentin Jammer on fourth-and-9 in the third quarter vs. S.D. (9/26) as part of a four-catch, 67-yard (16.8 avg.) effort vs. the Chargers. He recorded his first rushing statistics of the season that day, rushing twice on reverses for six yards (3.0 avg.). He caught three passes for 53 yards (17.7 avg.) at Jac. (9/19) in a performance highlighted by a 39-yard catch that moved the Broncos down to Jacksonville's 6-yard line and set up a field goal right before the half. He also made a tough 8-yard catch on a third down with Denver driving at the end of the game. Lelie hauled in a 58-yard strike from Jake Plummer vs. K.C. (9/12) to begin a Denver series in the third quarter on his way to recording 88 yards receiving on four catches (22.0 avg.) against the Chiefs. The 58-yard catch was the second-longest reception on opening weekend in the NFL. **The 58-yard reception stands as Denver's longest play from scrimmage this year.** With the score tied at 24, his 22-yard catch to begin the fourth quarter set up a field goal that eventually proved to be the game winner. Lelie also had a key block on Quentin Griffin's 25-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

In his first NFL season, Luke is becoming more comfortable in his role as one of the Broncos' primary punt returners, and he has totaled nine returns for 90 yards (10.0 avg.) with a long of 21 yards in five games played (three special teams only). He also has gained 35 yards on two kick returns (17.5 avg.) and totaled one reception for 12 yards. Luke's first NFL catch, a 12-yard reception, came in a crucial situation with a little more than a minute remaining in the fourth quarter vs. Oak. - Smith became the Broncos' franchise leader in receptions (682) and touchdown catches (57) as he passed Shannon Sharpe in both categories with three catches for 29 yards (9.7 avg.) and one touchdown vs. Hou. (11/7).
- Smith's team-high 762 receiving yards rank 10<sup>th</sup> in the AFC while his 49 receptions also lead the Broncos and tie for 13<sup>th</sup> in the AFC.
- His 15.6 yard-per-reception average is his best since 2000 (16.0 avg.) and third best since he became a starter in 1997.
- He hauled in a career-long 85-yard touchdown vs. Oak. (11/28) that marked the eighth-longest passing play in team history despite the snowy conditions.

He ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in the AFC in receiving yards while tying for 13<sup>th</sup> in the AFC in receptions. **Smith, in his 10<sup>th</sup> NFL season, was selected by his teammates as an offensive co-captain for the Broncos, joining quarterback Jake Plummer in that role.** In addition to being Jake Plummer's go-to receiver, he leads the Broncos and ranks fourth in the AFC (7<sup>th</sup> in NFL) in punt-return average with an 11.1 avg. on 15 returns for 166 yards. In snowy, frigid conditions vs. Oak. (11/28), **he beat Raiders free safety Ray Buchanan for a career-long 85-yard touchdown reception that marked the eighth-longest passing play in team history** on the way to finishing the game with two catches for 99 yards (49.5 avg.). At N.O. (11/21), Smith tallied three receptions for 26 yards (8.7 avg.), which all came in the second quarter, while gaining 36 yards on three punt returns (12.0 avg.). **He became the Broncos' all-time leader in receptions and touchdowns vs. Hou. (11/7)** with three catches for 29 yards (9.7 avg.), including a 13-yard touchdown in the second quarter in which Jake Plummer found the receiver wide open in the left corner of the end zone. Smith's consistency against the Falcons was evident **as he became the first Bronco and the fourth player in the last 10 years to record 100 or more yards receiving in each half** (107 yds. in the first half, 101 yds. in the second half). He turned in another solid outing on *Monday Night Football* at Cin. (10/25) with five catches for 50 yards (10.0 avg.). He caught his second touchdown of the season in the second quarter on a 3-yard pass. **He eclipsed 9,000 career receiving yards against the Bengals, becoming one of 31 players to accomplish that feat.** Additionally, he passed Ozzie Newsome for 23<sup>rd</sup> on the NFL's all-time receptions list against the Bengals. He extended his franchise-record streak of recording at least one reception to 82 games at Oak. (10/17) with a 24-yard grab, his lone catch, on third down in the first quarter to move the Broncos inside Oakland's 15-yard line and set up a touchdown one play later. He also converted a third down with a 14-yard run in the third quarter. In starting against the Raiders, **Smith moved past Haven Moses for most games played (142) by a receiver in team history.** Smith led or tied for the team high in receptions for the fifth consecutive game vs. Car. (10/10) with four catches for a team-high 60 yards (15.0 avg.). **His hustle was exemplified by running nearly 100 yards in an effort to chase down Panthers defensive end Julius Peppers,** who intercepted a Jake Plummer pass and took it back 97 yards before

getting tangled up with Smith at the Broncos' 3-yard line. He had a team-high four catches for 32 yards (8.0 avg.) at T.B. (10/3). Smith's 11-yard reception moved Denver inside the Buccaneers' 25-yard line on their lone touchdown drive. He caught his first touchdown of the season vs. S.D. (9/26) and led Denver in receiving yards (75 yards on five catches) for the third consecutive game. Smith jump-started Denver's offense in the first quarter with a 32-yard catch, which occurred three plays before his 16-yard touchdown. **With the score against the Chargers, Smith passed Shannon Sharpe for seventh place on the Broncos-all-time scoring list with 338 points.** He had game highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (83) for a 13.8 average at Jac. (9/19). His 34-yard grab midway through the second quarter put Denver into Jaguars territory and set up its first points of the game on a field goal. He recorded a game-high seven receptions for 76 yards (10.9 avg.) vs. K.C. (9/12) in Denver's season opener while serving as the Broncos' sole punt returner with four returns for 55 yards (13.8 avg.), including a 30-yard return that was the longest in the NFL that week. **His punt-return yardage total in Wk. 1 was the best in the NFL while his seven catches in the opening week rank third in the NFL.** He caught a pass on the Broncos' first four possessions against the Chiefs.

He also took a reverse against the Texans in the third quarter, running four yards around the left side to set up a touchdown pass two plays later. In a breakout game vs. **Atl. (10/31)**, he made a career-high seven receptions for a personal-best 86 yards (12.3 avg.), including a 7-yard catch that marked the first touchdown of his career. He made major contributions in the fourth quarter against the Falcons by recording six grabs for 78 yards in the final period, including three catches for 41 yards on a drive. He showed great concentration in getting both feet inbounds on his first-career touchdown reception during the Broncos' comeback attempt against Atlanta. Watts came up big for the Broncos on *Monday Night Football* at **Cin. (10/25)** by tying a then-career high with four catches for 36 yards (9.0 avg.) while also gaining a first down on a 10-yard reverse in the first quarter. Carswell has readjusted to playing tight end after spending training camp as an offensive lineman, appearing in 10 of the Broncos' games (9 starts) and making 18 catches for 166 yards (9.2 avg.) with one touchdown. The veteran also has played as an H-back in certain formations this season. Carswell made a 6-yard catch, his only reception, vs. **Oak. (11/28)**, on a second-half Broncos touchdown drive. He was given most of the fourth quarter off against the Raiders and was replaced on the line by Cooper Carlisle. In his 100<sup>th</sup> career game, Neil played a role in Reuben Droughns' 193-yard rushing day vs. **Car. (10/10)** that ranked as the ninth-highest single-game rushing total by a Bronco in franchise history during the regular season. ### 2004 Regular Season:

Coleman has shown no signs of slowing down in his 13<sup>th</sup> NFL season, starting all 11 Denver games to mark his first starting action since 2002. **The veteran has totaled 39 tackles (25 solo) on the year, which is the second-highest total among Broncos defensive linemen**, one sack (-3 yds.) and one pass breakup. ### 2004 Regular Season:

Wilson has anchored the Broncos' defense through 11 games (11 starts) this season and is the undisputed emotional leader of the unit. **Selected as a Broncos co-defensive captain by his teammates, Wilson has a team-high 76 tackles (48 solo)** while also making one sack (-10 yds.), intercepting a pass for a touchdown (7 yds.) breaking up three passes and forcing a fumble. Wilson tallied eight tackles (5 solo) vs. **Oak. (11/28)**, including a bone-jarring stop on running back Tyrone Wheatley on a 4<sup>th</sup>-and-1 in the first quarter. At **N.O. Alexander recently has been looked to as an option at kick returner, recording 14 returns for 306 yards (21.9 avg.). **He's been a spark plug on kick/punt coverage, making eight tackles for the second-highest total on the Broncos**, and he has posted one defensive tackle. Additionally, he recorded one fumble recovery while defending a kick return. He gained 85 yards on four kick returns (21.3 avg.) vs. **Oak. (11/28)** and protected the ball despite the snowy, frigid conditions on the field. Alexander scooped up the first fumble recovery of his career at **N.O. (11/21)** on a first-quarter kick return by Michael Lewis, who had the ball jarred free by Terry Pierce. (11/28)**, he made 1-of-2 field goals. He connected on a 32-yard attempt in the second quarter against the Raiders, but a potential game-tying 43-yard field goal with less than a minute remaining in the fourth quarter was blocked, marking the first time since Nov. 5, 2001, that an Elam field-goal attempt had been blocked. Elam had a busy first quarter at **N.O. (11/21)**, connecting on 48 and 34-yard field goals in his only attempts of the game. He drilled a 52-yard kick in the first quarter vs. **Hou. (11/7)**, which marked his second conversion from longer than 50 yards this season. Elam did not attempt a field goal for the first time this season vs. **Atl. (10/31)** but did connect on all four extra-point attempts to extend his scoring streak to 180 games. At **Cin. (10/25)** on *Monday Night Football*, he moved past Fred Cox for 18<sup>th</sup> place all-time on the NFL's scoring list with a 29-yard field goal and an extra point. His 49-yard field-goal attempt against the Bengals was wide left, marking his first miss in four weeks. He moved into a tie for 18<sup>th</sup> place (Fred Cox) on the NFL's all-time scoring list with a 33-yard field goal and four extra points at **Oak. (10/17)**. With two field goals (32 and 33 yards) in the first quarter vs. **Car. (10/10)**, **Elam notched his 300<sup>th</sup> career field goal faster than any other kicker in NFL history and is one of only 16 players in NFL history with 300 field goals.** Elam helped Denver overcome a stingy Buccaneers defense at **T.B. (10/3)** by hitting 3-of-3 field goals that day. His 50-yarder in the second quarter against the Buccaneers was his longest field goal this season, and he added a clutch fourth-quarter 23-yarder to secure the win. Against the Buccaneers, Elam hit two 49+-yard field goals (50 and 49 yds.) in a game for the first time in his career. **His play against the Buccaneers earned the kicker AFC Special Teams Player of the Week, marking the fourth time in his career he has won that award.** Against the Chargers in Denver's game vs. **S.D. (9/26)**, he drilled two field goals, a 22 and 23-yarder, before hitting a 43-yarder in the fourth quarter to extend Denver's lead to

two possessions. His sole miss of the season came at **Jac. (9/19)** when his 51-yard attempt into a stiff wind late in the third quarter fell short. He was successful on his two other attempts at Jacksonville, a 44-yard kick that bounced off the left upright before clearing the bar and a 22-yarder, to account for Denver's only points that game. Elam had a strong opening to the 2004 season vs. **K.C. (9/12)** by connecting on 43 and 45-yard field goals and all four extra points. **He scored 10 points in Wk. 1, which tied for the top mark in the NFL.** His 45-yarder with 13:26 remaining in the fourth quarter against the Chiefs broke a 24-24 tie and proved to be the eventual game winner.

### 2004 Regular Season:

Knorr has been an asset to Denver's special teams unit, punting 49 times for 2,041 yards (41.7 avg.) with 12 punts inside the 20 in the Broncos' 11 games. His punting average ranks seventh in the AFC. **Knorr has handled all of Denver's kickoffs to total 15 touchbacks, which leads the NFL.** In snowy conditions vs. **Oak. (11/28)**, Knorr punted seven times for 252 yards (36.0), including three punts inside the Raiders' 20-yard line. At **N.O. (11/21)**, he pinned a season-high three punts inside the Saints' 20-yard line and posted his highest net punting average in several weeks with a 39.5 net avg. on six punts for 245 yards (40.8 avg.). **He was shaken up on a fourth-quarter punt return against the Saints after getting hit in his left knee, but he did not miss a punt.** Knorr punted for 207 yards on five punts (41.4 avg.) and placed two punts inside the 20-yard line vs. **Hou. (11/7)**. Additionally, his placement of punts helped limit the Texans to -6 yards returning. Knorr also had three touchbacks on kickoffs against the Texans. He placed two punts inside the 20-yard line, including a third-quarter punt downed at the 3-yard line, vs. **Atl. (10/31)** to total three punts for 111 yards (37.0 avg.). Knorr surrendered only a 12-yard return against the Falcons, marking the fourth time this season he has allowed one or fewer returns to an opponent. He also recorded one touchback on a first-quarter kickoff against the Falcons. On **Monday Night Football** at **Cin. (10/25)**, Knorr punted five times for 205 yards (41.0 avg.) to help Denver's punt-coverage unit surrender only 25 yards on three returns. He had a relatively quiet day punting at **Oak. (10/17)**, punting only twice for 64 yards (32.0 avg.) and not giving up a return. He posted four touchbacks vs. **Car. (10/10)** while punting three times for 153 yards (51.0 avg.), including a 53-yard punt early in the second quarter. Knorr placed a season-high two punts inside the 20-yard line at **T.B. (10/3)** while punting five times for 189 yards (37.8 avg.) and allowing only one return for two yards. In Denver's game vs. **S.D. (9/26)**, Knorr recorded a career-best punting average of 53.0 on four punts for 212 yards. He twisted his right ankle when a Chargers defender collided with him on a third-quarter punt, which was ruled a penalty and ultimately led to a Denver touchdown several plays later. He punted seven times for 290 yards at **Jac. (9/19)** for a 41.4 average, positioned one punt inside the 20-yard line, while adding a touchback on kickoffs. He also helped make a touchdown-saving tackle on Jaguars returner Jermaine Lewis on a 50-yard return in the first quarter. Knorr was named **AFC Special Teams Player of the Week** after punting twice for 113 yards (56.5 avg.) vs. **K.C. (9/12)** and drilling six touchbacks while handling all kickoffs. **His six touchbacks were the highest total for a Broncos punter since 1983 and ranked first in the NFL during Wk. 1 (No other kicker had more than one**

**touchback in Wk. 1).** He limited dangerous Chiefs punt returner Dante Hall to only two returns (a punt for 26 yards and a kick for 17 yards).

## DEFENSIVE END

**M**arco Coleman joined the Broncos (3/11) as an unrestricted free agent from Philadelphia and will add depth to Denver's defensive line. In 184 career games (169 starts), Coleman has 656 tackles (468 solo), 62 sacks for -410 yards, 17 passes defended, 20 forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. An experienced defensive lineman, he was voted to the Pro Bowl in 2000 when he made 12 sacks. Entering his 13th year in the NFL, he has played for Miami (1992-95), San Diego (1996-98), Washington (1999-2001), Jacksonville (2002) and Philadelphia (2003). Originally drafted in first round (12th overall) by Miami in the 1992 NFL Draft, he has missed just eight games in 12 seasons. Coleman has started all 16 games in seven seasons and appeared in 16 games nine of 12 seasons. He played right defensive end in his first eight seasons and left end the last four years. Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year in 1992 by *Sports Illustrated* and led San Diego's defensive linemen in tackles three consecutive seasons (1996-98). He has also appeared in nine postseason games, with 41 tackles (33 solo), three sacks and two forced fumbles.

**2003:** Coleman signed with Philadelphia on Sept. 5, replacing Derrick Burgess, who was placed on injured reserve. He played in 13 games, primarily as a backup defensive end, and posted 10 tackles (5 solo), a half sack and one quarterback pressure. Coleman made three tackles at Buffalo (9/28) and picked up the half sack in the season finale at Washington (12/27). He was a reserve in both of the Eagles' playoff games, where he made three tackles (all solo).

**2002:** Coleman signed with Jacksonville on June 19 and started all 16 games at left defensive end where he ranked 12th on team with 54 tackles (27 solo), adding five sacks, one forced fumble, one tackle for loss and five quarterback pressures. He led the team's defensive ends in tackles and was one of just six players to start every game on defense. Coleman picked up his first sack as a Jaguar on Oct. 6 vs. Philadelphia (of Donovan McNabb) and notched a sack of Chris Redman on Oct. 20 at Baltimore. He posted a season-high 10 tackles on Nov. 17 at Houston and made two sacks on Dec. 1 vs. Pittsburgh (of Kordell Stewart), marking first multi-sack game since 2000. Coleman tallied his fifth sack of the season Dec. 15 at Cincinnati (of Jon Kitna) and forced a fumble on the play.

**2001:** Coleman started 12 games in his final season with Washington and missed four games due to a right elbow injury. He collected 55 tackles (41 solo), 4.5 sacks and three forced fumbles. In Week 2 at Green Bay, he made six tackles but suffered a dislocated right elbow in the third quarter and left the game. He was inactive for the next four games, marking the first time in his career that he missed more than one game in a season. Coleman returned to the lineup Oct. 28 vs. N.Y. Giants and made three tackles. Against Seattle (11/4), he posted four tackles, one sack and one forced fumble, and two weeks later at Denver, made five tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. On Dec. 16 vs. Philadelphia, Coleman made six tackles, a half-sack and had one pass defended that led to an interception. He made five tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass deflection on Dec. 30 at New Orleans, and added four tackles and a sack in the season finale vs. Arizona (1/6).

**2000:** Coleman enjoyed his finest season as a pro when he made a career-high 12 sacks and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl. His sack total topped his previous career-high of 6.5 in 1995 and 1999, and he finished the season tied for eighth in NFL in sacks. Coleman made 62 tackles (42 solo), which ranked eighth on team, and added three passes defended and two forced fumbles. He started all 16 games for fourth consecutive season and played left defensive end for first time after eight years as a right end (switch made after Redskins signed Bruce Smith). Coleman recorded at least a half-sack in each of the first six games and was named the NFC Defensive Player of the Week after an 11-tackle, three-sack game vs. Tampa Bay in Week 5. Those three sacks tied his single-game career-high set

10/25/92 vs. Indianapolis, and his 11 tackles were a season-high. He posted 2.5 sacks in a season-opening win over Carolina. Against Philadelphia in Week 6, he sacked quarterback Donovan McNabb and forced a fumble on game's second play. He netted a half-sack in Week 11 at St. Louis, and again sacked McNabb in Week 12, forcing another fumble. Coleman tallied six tackles in Week 13 vs. N.Y. Giants, posted six tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Dallas and four tackles in Week 14 at Pittsburgh.

**1999:** Coleman signed with Washington as an unrestricted free agent on June 3 and started all 16 games at right end, finishing first on team in QB pressures (44), second in sacks (6.5) and tied for first in forced fumbles (three). He ranked eighth with 65 tackles (42 solo) and nine tackles for loss, while also posting a recovered a fumble and returned it 42 yards for his first career touchdown (Nov. 21 vs. N.Y. Giants). In Week 2 vs. N.Y. Giants, he had four tackles, two pressures and a forced fumble, and followed that up with five tackles and two QB pressures in the Redskins' 27-20 win over N.Y. Jets in Week 3. Coleman posted seven quarterback pressures in Week 4 vs. Carolina, and eight pressures, 1.5 sacks, four tackles and three assists in Week 7 vs. Chicago. In Week 9 vs. Philadelphia, he suffered a strained cervical spine and left game but came back to start the next week vs. N.Y. Giants and made three solo tackles, two assists, one sack, one tackle for loss and a recovered fumble that he returned 42 yards for a touchdown and his first career score. Coleman had four tackles in Washington's NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Detroit and eight tackles in the NFL Divisional Playoff Game at Tampa Bay.

**1998:** Coleman led a San Diego defense, which claimed the league's No. 1 defensive ranking, that allowed only 263 yards and 71.3 yards rushing per game. He led the team's defensive linemen in tackles for the third consecutive season with 51, in 16 starts for the Chargers. Coleman added 3.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries. He collected a season-high nine tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Seattle.

**1997:** Coleman, who started all 16 games, led all Chargers defensive linemen in tackles for a second consecutive season (48). He added two sacks, one interception (the only one of his career) and forced a team-high three fumbles. Coleman recorded a season-high five tackles, a half-sack and his first career interception at New Orleans in Week 2, and posted five tackles in each game against Kansas City (Week 7 and Week 15).

**1996:** In his first season with San Diego after being signed as an unrestricted free agent, Coleman made 42 tackles, four sacks and one forced fumble in 15 starts. He posted a season-high six tackles and one sack in the Chargers' Week 6 Monday night game vs. Oakland.

**1995:** In 16 starts on the season for Miami, Coleman ranked seventh on team with 65 tackles and second with 6.5 sacks. He had a season-high nine tackles and added a sack vs. Saints (10/15), and set a postseason career-high with 11 tackles vs. Buffalo in the AFC Wild Card Playoff game (12/30).

**1994:** Coleman started all 16 games for the Dolphins and finished the year with 66 tackles, six sacks, four forced fumbles and three passes defended, including five or more tackles in eight games. He opened the season with eight tackles and a sack vs. New England. Coleman posted eight tackles, two sacks (tied a team playoff record) and one forced fumble at San Diego in an AFC Divisional Playoff game (1/8).

**1993:** Coleman, who started 15 games for Miami, made 54 tackles, 5.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and one pass defended. He had a season-high eight tackles and recorded a sack vs. Bills (9/26). After he fractured his hand vs. Washington (10/4), Coleman was inactive the next week vs. Cleveland. He returned to the lineup vs. Indianapolis (10/24) and made two tackles, and he made two tackles and 1.5 sacks vs. New England (11/21).

**1992:** Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year by *Sports Illustrated* and Defensive Rookie of the Year by *Football News* after finishing the season with Miami with 84 tackles, six sacks and one forced fumble. His six sacks were the third-highest single-season total for a Dolphin rookie. He made 15 starts (16 played), started the season at outside linebacker before moving to right defensive end for the final 12 games. Coleman posted 13 tackles and three sacks vs. Indianapolis at his new position and followed that with a six-tackle, two sack performance vs. N.Y. Jets. He was the first Dolphins rookie to have back-to-back games with two sacks. Against Buffalo (11/16), he tallied 11 tackles, and made five tackles and one sack vs. Buffalo in the AFC Championship Game. He joined the Dolphins as the team's first-round selection (12th overall) in the draft.

**COLLEGE:** Coleman finished his career at Georgia Tech as the school's all-time leader with 28 sacks despite playing just three years, and earned All-ACC honors his junior year, playing in 11 games while tallying 67 tackles, 10 sacks and one fumble recovery. He helped lead the school to a share of the national championship as a sophomore in 1990 by making 81 tackles and 13 sacks. Coleman was named second-team All-America by the *Sporting News* and was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week after a 12-tackle, five-sack performance vs. Maryland. As a redshirt freshman, he started all season at outside linebacker posting 63 tackles and five sacks.



**PERSONAL:** Coleman attended Patterson Co-Operative High School in Dayton, Ohio, where he was an all-area linebacker. As a senior, he made 84 tackles, 31 sacks, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and blocked an extra point. He lettered three times in football and once in track. Coleman performed a cameo role opposite actor Jim Carrey in the movie *Ace Ventura: Pet Detective*. Marco Darrrell Coleman is married (Katrina) and has three children, Kabrione, Kennedy and Kenneth. ### DEFENSIVE TACKLE

**E**llis Johnson, an accomplished defensive tackle who led all NFL interior linemen in sacks last season, joined the Broncos on Sept. 20, 2004, in a trade with Atlanta for an undisclosed draft choice. In 136 career games (89 starts), Johnson has made 532 tackles (273 solo) and recorded 48 sacks (-315 yds.), highlighted by his eight sacks in 2003 that tied a personal best. He has eight multiple-sack games during his nine years in the NFL spent with the Colts (1995-01) and Falcons (2002-03). A durable veteran who has missed only eight games in his career, Johnson should add to an already potent Denver defense by providing an inside pass-rushing threat on the Broncos' defensive line. He spent the previous two seasons with the Falcons, where he was a vital member of their defensive unit. He played in 32 games (5 starts) for Atlanta and totaled 118 tackles (65 solo) with 15 sacks (-107 yds.) from 2002-03 after the team signed him as a free agent Sept. 1, 2002. Johnson spent his first seven seasons in the NFL with the Colts and started every game he played during a five-year span from 1997-2001 (76 games). The Colts' leader in sacks in 1998 with eight (-34 yds.), Johnson's sack total that year also was a personal best and complemented his 75 tackles (48 solo). That season came before a strong 1999 campaign that saw him register 7.5 sacks (-46.5 yds.) and 76 tackles (34 solo). The Colts selected Johnson in the first round (15th overall) of the 1995 NFL draft out of Florida, and he played in all 16 regular-season games as a rookie (2 starts), totaling 4.5 sacks (-26 yds.), while seeing action in three Indianapolis playoff games (1 start) that year. At Florida, Johnson was a three-year starter and totaled 165 tackles (112 solo), 17.5 sacks (-134 yds.), six forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 44 games

(26 starts) during four seasons with the Gators. His 36.5 career tackles for loss rank 10th all-time in Florida history. He was named National Defensive Player of the Year by CNM as a senior in addition to being tabbed a first-team All-Southeastern Conference selection and earning honorable mention All-American honors from *The Sporting News*.

**2003:** Johnson played in 16 games (3 starts) in his second season with the Falcons, collecting 64 tackles (35 solo) and eight sacks (-49 yds.). His eight sacks led all interior linemen in the NFL and tied his personal best, which he set in 1998 with the Colts. He had a pair of two-sack games with his first of the season coming vs. New Orleans (10/19) when he pulled down Saints quarterback Aaron Brooks twice for nine yards to post five tackles. A little over a month later at Houston (11/30), two of his seven total tackles were sacks (-9 yds.) to mark the eighth multiple-sack game of Johnson's career. During the Falcons' game at Carolina (9/28), he tied for the lead among Atlanta defensive linemen with seven tackles (6 solo). He had a strong game vs. Washington (9/14) with five tackles (4 solo) and a sack.

**2002:** Johnson was signed by the Falcons as a free agent on Sept. 1 after the Colts waived him Aug. 28. Playing in a new defensive system, he finished the year with 54 tackles (30 solo), seven sacks (-58 yds.) and one forced fumble in 16 games (2 starts). His seven sacks were second most by a Falcons player and were supplemented by 13 quarterback pressures. In Atlanta's upset win at Green Bay (1/4/03) in an NFC Wild Card Game, Johnson tackled Packers running back Ahman Green for a 4-yard loss on fourth down with Green Bay threatening to score in the second quarter. He combined for four tackles (3 solo) during the Falcons' two playoff games. He had one sack (-6 yds.), six tackles and a season-high three quarterback pressures at Minnesota (12/7). At Carolina (11/24), he added two sacks (-17 yds.). Johnson came off the bench vs. Baltimore (11/3) and enjoyed a strong game for the Falcons as he collected six tackles, one sack (-10 yds.) and one quarterback pressure.

**2001:** Johnson started all 16 games at right defensive tackle for the Colts to mark the third time in his career and the third time in the last four seasons that he has started 16 games. He registered 61 tackles (25 solo), 3.5 sacks (-38.5 yds.), two batted passes and one forced fumble in his final year in Indianapolis. Johnson showed consistency during his seventh NFL season by making at least four tackles in 11 games. He had a strong game vs. Denver (1/6/02) with one sack (-7 yds.) and four tackles against the Broncos. During the Colts' game vs. Atlanta (12/16), he collected six tackles and 1.5 sacks (-17.5 yds.). In a game at New Orleans (11/18), Johnson made his first sack of the season for a 14-yard loss and totaled three tackles. He made two stops vs. New England (10/21). Johnson had several strong performances in September, making five tackles vs. Buffalo (9/23) and four tackles at N.Y. Jets (9/9).

**2000:** Johnson played in 13 games (13 starts) at right defensive tackle and made 58 tackles (25 solo) with five sacks (-25 yds.), one interception and one forced fumble. He was inactive for three games (vs. Detroit (10/29), at Chicago (11/5) and vs. N.Y. Jets (11/12)) with a knee injury. He started in the Colts' AFC Wild Card Game at Miami (12/30) and recorded six tackles (3 solo) and one sack, his first ever in the playoffs, that went for -4.5 yards. The Colts played vs. Miami (11/26) a month before their playoff showdown with the Dolphins, and Johnson turned in an equally impressive game that day with five tackles and one sack (0 yds.). A week earlier at Green Bay (11/19), he produced four tackles, one sack and the second interception of his career against the Packers. When the Colts visited Seattle (10/15), he came through with three tackles, one sack and a forced fumble. He posted back-to-back five-tackle games at Buffalo (10/1) and at New England (10/8). Johnson was a dominating presence on the defensive line vs. Oakland (9/10) with seven tackles.

**1999:** Johnson started all 16 games at right defensive tackle, totaling 76 tackles (34 solo) and 7.5 sacks (-46.5 yds.) while recovering one fumble and breaking up three passes. His sack total in 1999 was the second-highest total among Colts defenders. Johnson started in the Colts' AFC Divisional Playoff Game vs. Tennessee (1/16/00), making four tackles (1 solo). While visiting the Giants (11/14), he turned in a strong showing with seven tackles (3 solo) and two sacks (-11 yds.). Johnson's season-high in tackles came when he had 10 stops vs. Kansas City (11/7). Two weeks earlier, Johnson made six tackles and two sacks (the third multiple-sack game of his career) vs. Cincinnati (10/24). He added five tackles, including one sack, at N.Y. Jets (10/17). The sack against the Jets came on the game's final play to seal the win for the Colts. In a game at San Diego (9/26), Johnson totaled six tackles and half a sack (-3.5 yds.).

**1998:** Johnson posted the most complete season of his career and was one of seven Colts to start all 16 games. His 75 tackles (48 solo) were fifth most on the team, and his eight sacks (-34 yds.) were a team and career high. Additionally, he registered one forced fumble and three pass breakups for the Colts. Johnson totaled the second multiple-sack game of his career vs. Carolina (12/27) with two sacks (-9 yds.) to go along with nine tackles and his lone forced fumble of the season. He posted back-to-back games with a sack at Seattle (12/20) and vs. Cincinnati (12/13). In a performance vs. San Diego (10/4), he created havoc on the defensive line with seven tackles (5 solo). His season-high in tackles came vs. New Orleans (9/27) with 10 stops and one sack against the Saints.
