BRONCOS GEAR UP FOR TOUGH AFC ROAD CLASH AGAINST JACKSONVILLE SUNDAY

After knocking off AFC West rival Kansas City 34-24 in the season opener Sunday, the Broncos prepare to head out on the road for the first time in 2004. Denver travels to Jacksonville Sunday to face the Jaguars at ALLTEL Stadium, with the kickoff scheduled for 1 p.m. (EDT).

This will be the fourth regular season meeting between the teams, dating back to the Jaguars first year as an expansion team in 1995. Denver leads the series 2-1. The Broncos come into the game 1-0 after winning their season opener at home Sunday. Jacksonville shares the same record, after its 13-10 come-from-behind victory at Buffalo.

RADIO/TELEVISION vs. JACKSONVILLE

The Broncos/Jaguars game will be broadcast nationally on CBS-TV and locally on CBS-4 (KCNC-TV) in Denver. Kickoff for the game is 1 p.m. (EDT), and **Craig Bolerjack** will provide the play-by-play, with **Rich Baldinger** joining him in the booth.

For the 35th consecutive year, KOA radio (850) is the flagship station for the Denver Broncos radio network, and every game this season will be broadcast. **Dave Logan** and **Scott Hastings** will provide the play-by-play and color commentary respectively, with **Alan Roach** on the sidelines. The Broncos radio network extends to nine states, and the KOA pregame show, hosted by **Mike Rice**, begins two hours prior to kickoff.

The game will also be broadcast in Spanish on KBNO radio (1280). **Milo Sanchez** will do the play-by-play, with **Luke Sandoval** adding color commentary.

THE SERIES vs. JACKSONVILLE

Sunday's game will be the fourth regular-season meeting between the teams, since the Jaguars began play as an expansion team in 1995. Denver holds a 2-1 advantage, with both wins coming in Denver. In the Broncos' only trip to Jacksonville, the Jaguars came away with a 27-24 win in 1999. The series has seen two postseason meetings, with each team winning a game in Denver. Jacksonville upset the Broncos 30-27 in the AFC Divisional Game in 1996, but Denver avenged that loss the next year, with a 42-17 win in the 1997 AFC Wild Card Game.

**LAST TIME vs. JACKSONVILLE (12/13/99)
at JACKSONVILLE 27, DENVER 24**

The Broncos fell to 4-9 as they lost to Jacksonville for the first time in the regular season, dropping a 27-24 decision in front of 71,357 at ALLTEL Stadium and an ABC national television audience on *Monday Night Football*.

Mike Hollis' 23-yard field goal as time expired made the difference for Jacksonville, which moved to 12-1 on the season.

Denver jumped out to 14-0 advantage early in the second quarter, as Brian Griese hooked up with Rod Smith from 22 yards out, and then Olandis Gary bulled his way in from 1 yard out on Denver's next possession.

The Jaguars countered by scoring the game's next 17 points, all in the second quarter, on two James Stewart touchdown runs, sandwiched around a 49-yard Hollis field goal.

Denver tied the score at 17-17 in the third quarter on Jason Elam's 40-yard field goal, which was followed by a torrential downpour that stymied each team's offense for more than a quarter. Eight straight possessions resulted in three-and-out before Jacksonville struck with a three-play, 70-yard drive that culminated in a 38-yard Fred Taylor touchdown run with 2:35 remaining to lift the Jaguars to a 24-17 lead.

But the Broncos were not finished, answering with a five-play, 80-yard drive that tied the game at 24-24, courtesy of a 57-yard touchdown pass from Griese to Byron Chamberlain with 1:43

remaining. However, Mark Brunell led the Jaguars down the field with assistance from Taylor to set up the Hollis game-winner.

Defensive tackle Trevor Pryce registered three sacks for the Broncos, whose defense allowed just 265 yards of total offense—93 fewer than Denver's offensive total. The loss officially eliminated the Broncos from playoff contention for the first time since 1995.

- Edwards was also a teammate of Broncos defensive tackle Darius Holland with Cleveland during the 1999 and 2000 seasons.
- Holland briefly played on the same defense as Jaguars linebacker Greg Favors as a member of the Kansas City Chiefs in 1998.
- Holland and Broncos tackle Matt Lepsis were college teammates with Jaguars guard Chris Naeole at Colorado.
- Broncos offensive tackle George Foster and Jaguars linebacker Tony Gilbert, who both hail from Macon, Ga., played on rival squads in high school but joined forces as teammates at the University of Georgia. They graduated together in 2002 and are both in their second seasons in the NFL.
- Jaguars linebacker Tommy Hendricks and Broncos tailback Quentin Griffin were both born in Houston, Texas.
- Hendricks and Broncos offensive lineman Cornell Green were teammates with Miami in 2001.
- Green played with Jaguars tight end Todd Yoder at Tampa Bay from 2002-03.
- Yoder also played with Broncos tight end Patrick Hape (2000) and safety John Lynch (2000-03) with the Buccaneers.
- Broncos offensive lineman Cooper Carlisle and Jaguars linebacker Mike Peterson played their college ball together at Florida.
- Jaguars offensive tackle Ephraim Salaam spent the previous two seasons with the Broncos (2002-03).
- The Broncos' Mario Fatafehi, Reuben Droughns, Reggie Hayward and Raylee Johnson and the Jaguars' Ephraim Salaam were all born in Chicago, Ill.

- Jaguars defensive end Paul Spicer played with Broncos defensive tackle Luther Ellis with the Detroit Lions in 1999.
- Spicer was also a teammate of Broncos safety Nick Ferguson with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the Canadian Football League in 1998.
- Jaguars long snapper Joe Zelenka played with Broncos defensive end Marco Coleman in 2000 as a member of the Washington Redskins and with Broncos tailback Garrison Hearst while with San Francisco in 1999.

WEEK 1: at DENVER 34, KANSAS CITY 24 (INVESCO FIELD AT MILE HIGH, 9/12/04)

The Broncos won their season opener for the fourth straight year by defeating division rival Kansas City, 34-24, in front of 75,939 fans at INVESCO Field at Mile High and a national television audience on ESPN's Sunday Night Football.

Second-year running back Quentin Griffin, in just his second career start, led the Broncos charge with three touchdowns (2 rush, 1 rec.) and 156 yards rushing on 23 carries, setting a new franchise record for rushing yards in a season opener.

Kansas City jumped on Denver early after running back Priest Holmes' 2-yard touchdown run completed an eight-play, 80-yard drive on the game's opening drive.

After a 43-yard field goal by Jason Elam narrowed the gap for the Broncos, Denver took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter when quarterback Jake Plummer hit Griffin for a 1-yard touchdown. The Broncos defense stuffed the Chiefs once again to regain the ball, setting the stage for Griffin's second touchdown—a 25-yard scamper in which the tailback slashed through several defenders en route to the end zone.

Denver opened the second half with a 17-7 lead, but the Chiefs quickly got back in the game after capitalizing on two Broncos turnovers. Plummer's first pass of the half was intercepted by Kansas City linebacker Monty Beisel, setting up a 50-yard field goal by Lawrence Tynes. On the Broncos' next possession, a solid Kansas City pass rush on third down forced Plummer to errantly heave the ball in the air and right into the hands of linebacker Shawn Barber deep in Broncos' territory. The Chiefs took advantage when Holmes scored his second touchdown of the contest on a 4-yard run tying the score at 17.

Griffin stepped up once again on Denver's next drive, as he burst up the middle for a 47-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career. Holmes' day was not finished, however, as he tied the game on a 33-yard touchdown run, his third of the game, to knot the score at 24.

Elam helped the Broncos regain the lead after he booted a 45-yard field goal, and on the Kansas City's next possession, Denver's defense forced the Chiefs to punt. The Broncos responded with a 13-play, 87-yard drive that burned 7:10 on the clock and was capped by a 2-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to tight end Patrick Hape, securing the win for the Broncos.

Denver's offense amassed 413 total yards, including 202 on the ground. Defensive back Champ Bailey was solid in his Broncos debut, notching his 19th career interception in the second quarter and also doubled up as a wide receiver, catching one pass for 11 yards.

HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN MONDAY QUOTES

Injury report

"Lenny Walls has a shoulder dislocation. He had an MRI this morning. (Trainer) Steve (Antonopoulos) anticipates him being out four weeks or possibly sooner. Garrison Hearst has a mild ankle sprain. With ankles you really don't know until Wednesday when you practice. We'll have a better idea then. Ashley Lelie had a shoulder dislocation during the game but it popped back in, so he should be alright. Champ Bailey had five stitches (in his chin) after the game, so he's alright. Louis Green had a little shoulder bruise but he's OK. D.J. Williams has a minor ankle sprain, and he should be alright. (Patrick) Chukwurah, one of the reasons he didn't dress is because he had lower back pain, but he feels better. He should be able to practice Wednesday. Luther Elliss with his pec (pectoral) practiced Friday. We were a little hesitant about playing him for obvious reasons. He should be able to practice on Wednesday. Cornell Green practiced on Friday and hopefully we'll have him back at practice Wednesday as well."

On the disappointing nature of CB Lenny Walls suffering another injury after having ankle surgery early in training camp

"Obviously, it's very disappointing. Lenny has worked very hard to get back and all of a sudden he's got another setback. But, Lenny is tough enough to work through it. He's got a lot of rehab in the next month and hopefully we'll see him back a bit later. Hopefully it will be only two or three weeks. But with shoulders, you never know. Some of the other guys have to step up. We have depth in the secondary, so somebody has to step up and get it done."

On having depth at the cornerback position

"Kelly (Herndon) has been a starter last year so he has played well. He played both the inside and the outside positions. I have a lot of confidence in Kelly. Roc Alexander is a very fast cornerback. He's one of the fastest guys on the team. He's been very impressive right from the start not only as a cornerback but also on special teams. He adds another dimension there because he is so fast. Jeff Shoate has come in and played extremely well both in the nickel and at the corner position. So Jeff can come up now and obviously Lenny will move down."

On DT Trevor Pryce playing with back pain on Sunday

"It's a credit to Trevor that he did play. I got a call Sunday morning over at the house that said his lower back was really bothering him. Trevor was tough enough to play 40 plays during the game. If he didn't play, it would've been a different game plan for Kansas City. Him just being out there working through that type of pain is really a credit to Trevor. Obviously, his toughness and him playing through that pain for the betterment of the team—I'm really impressed with that. He's getting an epidural right now. Hopefully, that will alleviate any pain and he'll be able to practice on Wednesday."

On if teams will continue to throw away from Champ Bailey

"It's really hard to speak for other teams. I can't say what other teams are doing. There's a lot of great wide receivers out there and I'm sure he'll be challenged. But he played extremely well against Kansas City."

On his assessment of Quentin Griffin's performance Sunday

"He played extremely well. Anytime you average 6.8 yards per carry, that's not too bad. You'd say that's a pretty good afternoon or a pretty good evening. I was pleased for him to step up and play at the level that he did. It was really a credit to him. He's very dedicated, very focused, and hopefully he can keep playing at that level."

On comparisons between Griffin and Barry Sanders

"Not really. I don't try and make comparisons. We're trying to win football games. But he is a very unselfish player. We all know that a running back doesn't do it by himself. You have to have a great offensive line and our offensive line really stepped up and played exceptional. The wide receivers really got involved as well. You have to have your wide receivers blocking against a team like Kansas City because they play so well in the secondary. So, overall it was a good effort. There were some very positive things but there were some negatives too. You can't turn the football over three times and expect to win consistently so hopefully we'll get a little better in the turnover area."

On performance of RB Quentin Griffin

"As a running back you have to be able to pick up blitzes. Quentin did a great job of pass protection. You never know for sure how a running back is going to step up and block the linebackers and possibly the defensive tackles. He doesn't shy away from anything; he's a complete back and we love what he's doing."

On WR Ashley Lelie's shoulder

"I'm not sure what quarter (the shoulder) popped out in. Any time your shoulder pops out there is going to be pain when you pop it back in. He went out and played with it, and that was very impressive."

On the performance of CB/WR Champ Bailey

"He never looks like he's tired on the sidelines. He's always ready to go in on offense, and he's in there for all the defense – the nickel, the dime, the cornerback position – he'll take one play off and he's ready to go back in. He's got the mindset that's he's not that tired and he's ready to play offense after being on the field for 10 plays with the defense, and that's rare."

On if Bailey was out to prove that he was worth trading for

"I think it has nothing to do with the right decision. Champ Bailey is a competitor. He wants to do the best possible job he can in any given situation. He had no missed assignments in the three different positions we had him in, and that's a great compliment to what we have. He's a guy who knows how to play, and play hard and be a fierce competitor. He's got great athletic ability and he's really a first-class guy."

On releasing DT Darius Holland and status of LB Louis Green

"The injury to (Patrick) Chukwurah made us have to drop Darius (Holland) and move Louis (Green) up. Darius is back now and Louis Green is back on the practice squad. We had to bring Louis up for special teams and we needed another body. Darius understood what he had to do and so did Louis."

On the performance of P Micah Knorr

"He had six touchbacks and that has to be some kind of record. He had a great day. Micah played exceptionally well, and Jason Elam made a couple field goals. He's been very consistent

for us and that's what you have to have to beat a team like Kansas City. Dante Hall is an exceptional athlete and a big-time threat, so you need your punter to play well and the coverage to help."

BRONCOS HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN

Mike Shanahan in 2004 completes a full decade as head coach of the Denver Broncos, and that decade of measurement against the game's all-time coaches places him among the pro football elite. After Week 1, he needs just one win to join the exclusive club of head coaches to post 100 wins in the first 10 seasons with one club. The group that Mike Shanahan will join is listed below.

No head coach in the NFL has won more games than Mike Shanahan's 98 victories since the start of the 1995 season. Those 98 wins by Shanahan include seven straight in the playoffs (he is the only coach to have produced seven playoff wins in two years) during the 1997 and 1998 World Championship seasons, years in which he firmly established himself among the game's sideline greats. His postseason percentage of .700, on a 7-3 record, is second only to Vince Lombardi (9-1, .900) among coaches with more than five playoff victories.

Under Shanahan's guidance, Denver has: Posted the most wins in pro football history in a two-year period (33 in 1997-98); posted the most wins in pro football history in a three-year period (46 in 1996-98); won the most postseason games ever in a two-year period (seven, 1997-98); won 18 straight games over 1997-98 to tie the all-time NFL record for consecutive wins; been undefeated for three straight regular seasons at home (1996-98), just the second team ever to do so; and posted a 22-2 record in its last 24 games during the back-to-back title years.

He produced consecutive Super Bowl titles, three straight 13-plus win seasons (including postseason), and two AFC West titles from 1996-98. Shanahan led Denver to a 14-2 regular season mark and a 3-0 postseason mark in 1998, taking the Broncos back to the victorious Super Bowl glory they experienced in 1997. In his third season with the Broncos in 1997, Shanahan not only led the Broncos back to the Super Bowl for the first time in eight years, but he directed them to their first

ever Super Bowl victory. Only Red Miller (1st year) in 1977 got a Broncos' team to the Super Bowl faster than Shanahan did.

In his 10th year with Denver, he has fashioned a franchise-record regular season home mark of **57-16 (.780)**, a regular season mark of **92-53 (.634)**, and an overall mark of **99-56 (.639)**. His NFL record as a head coach in regular season play is **100-65 (.606)** and his overall record is **107-68 (.611)**.

Over the last 12 years (ninth in Denver and the previous three in San Francisco) Mike Shanahan's offenses have finished number one in the NFL four times, second twice and third twice; in two of those campaigns Denver was just 17 yards and 83 yards short of the number one spot.

In 1998 the defending world champions stormed to their second straight title with an offense that scored 501 points and finished third in the NFL in total yards, while the defense had another spectacular postseason, allowing just 25 points and two touchdowns while sparking a remarkable 13-1 turnover ratio in the playoffs.

In 1997 he directed a Denver offense that scored a total of 583 points (29.2 per game) during the entire 1997 season, the fifth highest total in NFL history and the second highest total in AFC history for a combined regular and postseason. Of course, in 1998 Shanahan's Broncos topped that mark by producing 596 regular and postseason points. The all-time high of 636 points came from the 1994 World Champion San Francisco 49ers, for whom Shanahan was the offensive coordinator.

He led his team to a 12-4 regular season record in 1997, marking the first time in franchise history that the team won 12 or more games in back-to-back seasons.

During his NFL career, Shanahan has been a part of teams that have played in nine conference Championship Games, in addition to his six Super Bowl appearances (three victories), five with Denver and Super Bowl XXIX with San Francisco. In his 26 seasons as a pro and college coach, Shanahan's teams have participated in postseason or bowl games 21 times. Shanahan is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University, and also has a master's degree from that institution.

JAGUARS HEAD COACH JACK DEL RIO

Jack Del Rio is in his second year as head coach of the Jaguars after becoming the second head coach in franchise history on Jan. 17, 2003. In his first season, the Jaguars posted a 5-11 record, with six losses coming by less than seven points.

Del Rio was the architect of a defense that ranked sixth overall in the NFL and second against the run. He had inherited a team that had not been in the top 10 in total defense since 1999 and ranked 20th overall in 2002. In only one season, he took a porous run defense that was ranked 25th in 2002 and elevated it to second in the NFL, and only allowed one 100-yard rusher all year. This vast improvement was no coincidence since Del Rio was only one year removed from taking the Panthers defense from 31st in the league to second overall as defensive coordinator of Carolina.

Del Rio was the defensive coordinator of the Carolina Panthers in 2002, his sixth season as an NFL assistant coach. He previously spent 11 years as an NFL linebacker and had a

standout college career at the University of Southern California. At 41, Del Rio is the second-youngest head coach in the NFL, just four months older than Tampa Bay's Jon Gruden.

Del Rio joined the Carolina Panthers' staff on January 27, 2002 as the team's defensive coordinator. In his only season with Carolina, the defense improved to second in the league from 31st in 2001. Despite coming off a 1-15 season, the Panthers' defense allowed only 290.4 yards per game, behind only the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

From 1999 to 2001, Del Rio was the linebackers coach of the Baltimore Ravens, helping the team win Super Bowl XXXV over the New York Giants. Del Rio coached two seasons in New Orleans, as the linebackers coach in 1998 and the assistant strength coach in 1997.

An 11-year NFL veteran, Del Rio was a third-round choice by the New Orleans Saints in 1985. He was named to the NFL's All-Rookie team and earned the Saints' Rookie of the Year award in 1985. Following two seasons in New Orleans, Del Rio played for the Kansas City Chiefs (1987-88), Dallas Cowboys (1989-91) and Minnesota Vikings (1992-95). He led the Vikings in tackles three straight years (1992-94) and played in the Pro Bowl following the 1994 season.

Del Rio was a four-year starter from 1981 to '84 at Southern California, where he earned consensus All-America honors as a senior and was runner-up for the Lombardi Award.

Drafted out of high school by the Toronto Blue Jays in 1981, Del Rio batted .340 while playing catcher on Southern California's baseball team in 1983 and '84. He was a teammate of current Arizona Diamondbacks pitcher Randy Johnson and former major league slugger Mark McGwire.

Del Rio graduated from Hayward (Calif.) High School and holds a political science degree from the University of Kansas, which he finished while playing for the Chiefs. Born April 4, 1963 in Castro Valley, Calif., he and his wife, Linda, have three daughters: Lauren, Hope and Aubrey, and a son: Luke.

BRONCOS CHAMPIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

Al Wilson will continue his promotion and support of Prostate Cancer Awareness Week (Sept. 19-25) by collaborating with his good friend Marcus Stroud of the Jacksonville Jaguars in the week leading up to the Broncos at Jacksonville game Sept. 19. Both players will be featured in Game Day Magazine with a question and answer session and will encourage men in their respective communities to take advantage of the free screening sites throughout the week.

In addition, the Sept. 12 season-opener vs. Kansas City was dedicated to increasing prostate cancer awareness in collaboration with the Prostate Cancer Education Council. Wilson's involvement over the past four years has helped raise awareness of the disease and encourage men to get tested for this treatable form of cancer. Safety John Lynch visited the Denver Broncos Boys and Girls Club on Tuesday, Sept. 7 to kick off the "Lynch's Leaders

Program.” The six-month long leadership program is a partnership between the Denver Broncos and The John Lynch Foundation that brings in a variety of Denver’s leaders in business, education, politics, and the community to speak to select junior and senior high youth from all of the six Boys and Girls Clubs of Metro Denver. GRIFFIN TOPS BRONCOS SEASON-OPENING MARK

While posting 156 rushing yards on 23 carries and two touchdowns in the Broncos’ Week 1 win vs. Kansas City, running back Quentin Griffin set a new franchise record for most rushing yards in the team’s season opener, besting the previous record set by Clinton Portis last season. In addition, it was the seventh time in the franchise’s 45 season openers that a back rushed for more than 100 yards.

HE IS THE “CHAMP”ION

After coming to Denver as part of one of the biggest recent trades in the NFL (for running back Clinton Portis and a 2004 second-round draft pick [RB Tatum Bell]), cornerback Champ Bailey immediately showed his worth in his first start as a Bronco. The multi-talented defensive back held his own on that side of the ball, but also contributed on offense. In Denver’s 34-24 win over Kansas City, Bailey finished the game with five tackles (4 solo), three passes defensed and one interception. The pick was Bailey’s fourth opening day interception in his six years in the league. Below is a list of Bailey’s opening day interceptions:

Bailey also contributed on offense, catching one pass for 11 yards, becoming the first Broncos defender to catch a pass in a regular-season game since LB Dave Wyman accomplished the feat at San Diego, Dec. 5, 1993.

SHANAHAN EXCELS IN OPENERS

With the Broncos’ 34-24 win over Kansas City, Head Coach Mike Shanahan now has a 10-2 (.833) record in regular-season openers, including 8-2 with the Broncos. He ranks first among active NFL coaches (minimum of five games) in winning percentage.

The Broncos rank among those top teams. Denver is tied for the best record in the first month of the season over the past 10 years at 30-11 (.731), with Miami (30-11, .731).

DEFENSIVE END

Marco Coleman joined the Broncos (3/11) as an unrestricted free agent from Philadelphia and will add depth to Denver's defensive line. In 184 career games (169 starts), Coleman has 656 tackles (468 solo), 62 sacks for -410 yards, 17 passes defended, 20 forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. An experienced defensive lineman, he was voted to the Pro Bowl in 2000 when he made 12 sacks. Entering his 13th year in the NFL, he has played for Miami (1992-95), San Diego (1996-98), Washington (1999-2001), Jacksonville (2002) and Philadelphia (2003). Originally drafted in first round (12th overall) by Miami in the 1992 NFL Draft, he has missed just eight games in 12 seasons. Coleman has started all 16 games in seven seasons and appeared in 16 games nine of 12 seasons. He played right defensive end in his first eight seasons and left end the last four years. Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year in 1992 by *Sports Illustrated* and led San Diego's defensive linemen in tackles three consecutive seasons (1996-98). He has also appeared in nine postseason games, with 41 tackles (33 solo), three sacks and two forced fumbles.

2003: Coleman signed with Philadelphia on Sept. 5, replacing Derrick Burgess, who was placed on injured reserve. He played in 13 games, primarily as a backup defensive end, and posted 10 tackles (5 solo), a half sack and one quarterback pressure. Coleman made three tackles at Buffalo (9/28) and picked up the half sack in the season finale at Washington (12/27). He was a reserve in both of the Eagles' playoff games, where he made three tackles (all solo).

2002: Coleman signed with Jacksonville on June 19 and started all 16 games at left defensive end where he ranked 12th on team with 54 tackles (27 solo), adding five sacks, one forced fumble, one tackle for loss and five quarterback pressures. He led the team's defensive ends in tackles and was one of just six players to start every game on defense. Coleman picked up his first sack as a Jaguar on Oct. 6 vs. Philadelphia (of Donovan McNabb) and notched a sack of Chris Redman on Oct. 20 at Baltimore. He posted a season-high 10 tackles on Nov. 17 at Houston and made two sacks on Dec. 1 vs. Pittsburgh (of Kordell Stewart), marking first multi-sack game since 2000. Coleman tallied his fifth sack of the season Dec. 15 at Cincinnati (of Jon Kitna) and forced a fumble on the play.

2001: Coleman started 12 games in his final season with Washington and missed four games due to a right elbow injury. He collected 55 tackles (41 solo), 4.5 sacks and three forced fumbles. In Week 2 at Green Bay, he made six tackles but suffered a dislocated right elbow in the third quarter and left the game. He was inactive for the next four games, marking the first time in his career that he missed more than one game in a season. Coleman returned to the lineup Oct. 28 vs. N.Y. Giants and made three tackles. Against Seattle (11/4), he posted four tackles, one sack and one forced fumble, and two weeks later at Denver, made five tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. On Dec. 16 vs. Philadelphia, Coleman made six tackles, a half-sack and had one pass defended that led to an interception. He made five tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass deflection on Dec. 30 at New Orleans, and added four tackles and a sack in the season finale vs. Arizona (1/6).

2000: Coleman enjoyed his finest season as a pro when he made a career-high 12 sacks and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl. His sack total topped his previous career-high of 6.5 in 1995 and 1999, and he finished the season tied for eighth in NFL in sacks. Coleman made 62 tackles (42 solo), which ranked eighth on team, and added three passes defended and two forced fumbles. He started all 16 games for fourth consecutive season and played left defensive end for first time after eight years as a

right end (switch made after Redskins signed Bruce Smith). Coleman recorded at least a half-sack in each of the first six games and was named the NFC Defensive Player of the Week after an 11-tackle, three-sack game vs. Tampa Bay in Week 5. Those three sacks tied his single-game career-high set 10/29/92 vs. Indianapolis, and his 11 tackles were a season-high. He posted 2.5 sacks in a season-opening win over Carolina. Against Philadelphia in Week 6, he sacked quarterback Donovan McNabb and forced a fumble on game's second play. He netted a half-sack in Week 11 at St. Louis, and again sacked McNabb in Week 12, forcing another fumble. Coleman tallied six tackles in Week 13 vs. N.Y. Giants, posted six tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Dallas and four tackles in Week 14 at Pittsburgh.

1999: Coleman signed with Washington as an unrestricted free agent on June 3 and started all 16 games at right end, finishing first on team in QB pressures (44), second in sacks (6.5) and tied for first in forced fumbles (three). He ranked eighth with 65 tackles (42 solo) and nine tackles for loss, while also posting a recovered a fumble and returned it 42 yards for his first career touchdown (Nov. 21 vs. N.Y. Giants). In Week 2 vs. N.Y. Giants, he had four tackles, two pressures and a forced fumble, and followed that up with five tackles and two QB pressures in the Redskins' 27-20 win over N.Y. Jets in Week 3. Coleman posted seven quarterback pressures in Week 4 vs. Carolina, and eight pressures, 1.5 sacks, four tackles and three assists in Week 7 vs. Chicago. In Week 9 vs. Philadelphia, he suffered a strained cervical spine and left game but came back to start the next week vs. N.Y. Giants and made three solo tackles, two assists, one sack, one tackle for loss and a recovered fumble that he returned 42 yards for a touchdown and his first career score. Coleman had four tackles in Washington's NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Detroit and eight tackles in the NFL Divisional Playoff Game at Tampa Bay.

1998: Coleman led a San Diego defense, which claimed the league's No. 1 defensive ranking, that allowed only 263 yards and 71.3 yards rushing per game. He led the team's defensive linemen in tackles for the third consecutive season with 51, in 16 starts for the Chargers. Coleman added 3.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries. He collected a season-high nine tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Seattle.

1997: Coleman, who started all 16 games, led all Chargers defensive linemen in tackles for a second consecutive season (48). He added two sacks, one interception (the only one of his career) and forced a team-high three fumbles. Coleman recorded a season-high five tackles, a half-sack and his first career interception at New Orleans in Week 2, and posted five tackles in each game against Kansas City (Week 7 and Week 15).

1996: In his first season with San Diego after being signed as an unrestricted free agent, Coleman made 42 tackles, four sacks and one forced fumble in 15 starts. He posted a season-high six tackles and one sack in the Chargers' Week 6 Monday night game vs. Oakland.

1995: In 16 starts on the season for Miami, Coleman ranked seventh on team with 65 tackles and second with 6.5 sacks. He had a season-high nine tackles and added a sack vs. Saints (10/15), and set a postseason career-high with 11 tackles vs. Buffalo in the AFC Wild Card Playoff game (12/30).

1994: Coleman started all 16 games for the Dolphins and finished the year with 66 tackles, six sacks, four forced fumbles and three passes defended, including five or more tackles in eight games. He opened the season with eight tackles and a sack vs. New England. Coleman posted eight tackles, two sacks (tied a team playoff record) and one forced fumble at San Diego in an AFC Divisional Playoff game (1/8).

1993: Coleman, who started 15 games for Miami, made 54 tackles, 5.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and one pass defended. He had a season-high eight tackles and recorded a sack vs. Bills (9/26). After he fractured his hand vs. Washington (10/4), Coleman was inactive the next week vs. Cleveland. He returned to the lineup vs. Indianapolis (10/24) and made two tackles, and he made two tackles and 1.5 sacks vs. New England (11/21).

1992: Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year by *Sports Illustrated* and Defensive Rookie of the Year by *Football News* after finishing the season with Miami with 84 tackles, six sacks and one forced fumble. His six sacks were the third-highest single-season total for a Dolphin rookie. He made 15 starts (16 played), started the season at outside linebacker before moving to right defensive end for the final 12 games. Coleman posted 13 tackles and three sacks vs. Indianapolis as his new position and followed that with a six-tackle, two sack performance vs. N.Y. Jets. He was the first Dolphins rookie to have back-to-back games with two sacks. Against Buffalo (1/16), he tallied 11 tackles, and made five tackles and one sack vs. Buffalo in the AFC Championship Game. He joined the Dolphins as the team's first-round selection (12th overall) in the draft.

COLLEGE: Coleman finished his career at Georgia Tech as the school's all-time leader with 28 sacks despite playing just three years, and earned All-ACC honors his junior year, playing in 11 games while tallying 67 tackles, 10 sacks and one fumble recovery. He helped lead the school to a share of the national championship as a sophomore in 1990 by making 81 tackles and 13 sacks. Coleman was named second-team All-America by the *Sporting News* and was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week after a 12-tackle, five-sack performance vs. Maryland. As a redshirt freshman, he started all season at outside linebacker posting 63 tackles and five sacks.

PERSONAL: Coleman attended Patterson Co-Operative High School in Dayton, Ohio, where he was an all-area linebacker. As a senior, he made 84 tackles, 31 sacks, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and blocked an extra point. He lettered three times in football and once in track. Coleman performed a cameo role opposite actor Jim Carrey in the movie *Ace Ventura: Pet Detective*. Marco Darrell Coleman is married (Katrina) and has three children, Kabrione, Kennedy and Kenneth. Born Dec. 18, 1969, in Dayton, Ohio, he resides in both Atlanta and Jacksonville.
