BRONCOS LOOK TO REBOUND AFTER TOUGH ROAD LOSS; HOST DIVISION-RIVAL CHARGERS SUNDAY

In a game in which the Broncos dominated nearly every statistical category, Denver dropped a tough road loss to Jacksonville 7-6 at ALLTEL Stadium Sunday, and fell to 1-1 on the year. Denver rolled to 356 total yards, while holding the Jaguars to just 178, but a key turnover by the Broncos late in the fourth quarter, allowed Jacksonville to hold on to the win. On 3rd-and-9 from Jacksonville's 23-yard line, quarterback Jake Plummer's hand off to Quentin Griffin fell to the ground and was recovered by the Jaguars with just 37 seconds remaining, eliminating Denver's bid for the come-back victory.

The Broncos will look to rebound from the loss when they host division-rival San Diego at INVESCO Field at Mile High Sunday, Sept. 26. Kickoff for the game is scheduled for 2:05 p.m., and it will be broadcast nationally on CBS-TV and locally on CBS-4 (KCNC-TV). In a special halftime presentation, John Elway—the first player enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame to spend his entire career in Denver—will receive his ring from John Bankert, Executive Director of the Hall of Fame.

The Broncos-Chargers game will be Denver's 276th consecutive regular or postseason (non-strike) sellout at home. In the last 30 years (1974-03) the Broncos have had the best home record in the NFL, fashioning a 174-59-1 (.746) mark at home in the regular season. When the club's 11-2 (.846) postseason mark is included, the Broncos lead the league in that time frame with a 185-61-1 (.751) overall record.

RADIO/TELEVISION vs. SAN DIEGO

The Broncos/Chargers game will be broadcast nationally on CBS-TV and locally on CBS-4 (KCNC-TV). Kickoff for the game is 2:05 p.m. (MDT). In the first of two consecutive weeks, **Dick Enberg** will provide the play-by-play, with **Dan Dierdorf** joining him in the booth and **Armen Keteyian** on the sidelines.

For the 35th consecutive year, KOA radio (850) is the flagship station for the Denver Broncos radio network, and every game this season will be broadcast. **Dave Logan** and **Scott Hastings** will provide the play-by-play and color commentary respectively, with **Alan Roach** on the sidelines. The Broncos radio network extends to nine states, and the KOA pregame show, hosted by **Mike Rice**, begins two hours prior to kickoff.

The game will also be broadcast in Spanish on KBNO radio (1280). **Milo Sanchez** will do the play-by-play, with **Luke Sandoval** adding color commentary.

Sports Radio USA will provide a national radio broadcast, with **Eli Gold** and **Doug Plank** on the call, and **Tim Neverett** on the sidelines.

THE SERIES vs. SAN DIEGO

The Broncos and the Chargers have met 88 times in the regular season, with Denver holding a **49-38-1 (.563)** edge. Overall, the Broncos are **32-11-1 (.739)** at home vs. San Diego, but only **17-27 (.386)** on the road. With their season sweep of the Chargers last year, the Broncos have now won 11 of the last 13 meetings in the series. Under Head Coach Mike Shanahan, the Broncos are **16-5 (.762)** against the Chargers, including **10-1 (.909)** at home and **6-4 (.600)** on the road.

• **CB CHAMP BAILEY**

Intercepted a pass (-5 yds.), recovered a fumble and made four tackles (all solo) in the season-opener at S.D. 9/9/01 for the Redskins.

• **S SAM BRANDON**

Started at free safety at S.D. 9/14/03 and made five tackles (three solo) while breaking up a pass for the Broncos.

• **TE DWAYNE CARSWELL**

Caught five passes for 54 yards (10.8) at S.D. 12/1/02 for the Broncos and had back-to-back three catch, one-touchdown games (10/8/00 at S.D. and 11/19/00 vs. S.D.) against the Chargers for the Broncos. In 17 games played (11 starts) vs. S.D., totaled 24 receptions for 205 yards (8.5 avg.) and three touchdowns.

• **FB REUBEN DROUGHNS**

Made two catches for 26 yards (13.0 avg.) and a touchdown at S.D. 12/1/02 for the Broncos while also catching a 12-yard touchdown pass at S.D. 9/14/03. Returned three kicks for 58 yards (19.3 avg.), including a long of 27 yards, 12/1/02 at S.D. In four career games (1 start), totaled four catches for 40 yards (10.0 avg.) and two touchdowns.

• **DE MARCO COLEMAN**

Tied a Dolphins postseason record with two sacks (-12 yds.) at S.D. 1/8/95 in an AFC Divisional Playoff Game while making eight tackles (seven solo) and forcing a fumble. Recorded a sack (-12 yds.) at S.D. 11/5/95 for the Dolphins. In five career games (5 starts) vs. San Diego, has 13 tackles (11 solo), three sacks (-24 yds.) and one forced fumble.

• **K JASON ELAM**

Connected on 4-of-4 field-goal attempts, including a 55-yarder and two field goals from greater than 40 yards out, at S.D. 11/7/99 for the Broncos. Also went 4-of-4 on field-goal attempts vs. S.D. 11/11/01. In 22 career games vs. S.D., converted 38-of-48 field-goal attempts (79.2 avg.), highlighted by a 7-for-8 mark on attempts from greater than 50 yards out, and all 64 extra-point attempts.

• **S NICK FERGUSON**

Started at free safety vs. S.D. (11/16/03) for the Broncos, making five tackles (all solo) and collecting the first safety of his career (-13 yds.) on Doug Flutie.

• **RB QUENTIN GRIFFIN**

During his rookie season, rushed 15 times for 55 yards (3.7 avg.) vs. S.D. 11/16/03 for the Broncos.

• **TE PATRICK HAPE**

Started at fullback at S.D. 10/21/01 and caught a 12-yard reception for the Broncos. Totaled three catches for 25 yards (8.3 avg.) in six games vs. S.D. (1 start).

• **DE REGGIE HAYWARD**

Forced and recovered a fumble while adding a sack (-1 yd.) vs. S.D. 11/16/03.

• **RB GARRISON HEARST**

Ran for 87 yards on 22 carries (4.0) and caught two passes for five yards vs. S.D. 11/23/97 for the 49ers. Collected 66 rushing yards on 12 carries (5.5 avg.) and caught three passes for 22 yards (7.3 avg.) at S.D. 11/17/02. In four career games (3 starts) vs. S.D., rushed 52 times for 187 yards (3.6) and has 10 receptions for 54 yards (5.4).

• **CB KELLY HERNDON**

Made four tackles (3 solo) at S.D. 9/14/03 for the Broncos. Also intercepted a pass (-16 yds.) and defended two passes vs. S.D. 11/16/03.

• **QB DANNY KANNELL**

Completed 17-of-33 passes for 208 yards, one touchdown and one interception at S.D. 9/27/98 for the Giants.

• **S KENOY KENNEDY**

Posted 10 tackles (7 solo) at S.D. (12/1) for the Broncos. Totaled 22 tackles (7 solo) in seven games (six starts) vs. S.D.

• **WR ASHLEY LELIE**

Caught two passes for 57 yards (28.5), including a 48-yard grab vs. S.D. 11/16/03 while also rushing twice for 20 yards (10.0) that game for the Broncos. In four career games (1 start) vs. S.D., caught seven passes for 119 yards (17.0).

• **S JOHN LYNCH**

Intercepted a pass (25 yds.) and made five stops at S.D. 11/17/96 for the Buccaneers.

- **QB JAKE PLUMMER**

Completed 23-of-34 passes for 253 yards, three touchdowns and one interception vs. S.D. 11/16/03 for the Broncos. That game followed a 9-of-13 performance for 94 yards and three touchdowns (a 129.5 rating) at S.D. 9/14/03. In five career games (5 starts) vs. S.D., completed 87-of-155 passes for 1,091 yards, nine touchdowns and five interceptions.

- **DE TREVOR PRYCE**

Recorded three sacks (-17 yds.) with seven tackles (5 solo) at S.D. 10/8/00 for the Broncos. Recorded a sack for -18 yds. Vs. S.D. 11/11/01. In 14 games (14 starts), registered 36 tackles (23 solo) and eight sacks (-52 yds.).

- **WR ROD SMITH**

Produced two double-digit reception games vs. S.D. (11 catches for 187 yards (17.0 yds.) and one touchdown vs. S.D. 11/19/00 and 10 catches for 84 yards (8.4 yds.) 11/16/03 vs. S.D. In 17 career games (14 starts) vs. S.D., registered 90 receptions for 1110 yards (12.3) and five touchdowns.

- **CB LENNY WALLS**

Totaled six tackles (5 solo) and a career-high four passes defended at S.D. 9/14/03 for the Broncos.

- **MLB AL WILSON**

Made a career-high 21 tackles (18 solo) at S.D. 12/1/02 for the Broncos. Added nine tackles (7 solo) and one sack (-7 yds.) at S.D. 10/21/01. In 10 games (9 starts), recorded 75 tackles (65 solo) and two sacks (-13 yds.).

BRONCOS/CHARGERS FESTIVITIES (9/26/04)

During the pregame, the Denver Broncos organization will honor over 100 former players who are in town for the annual Alumni Reunion Weekend. Each year, Broncos Alumni from the 1960s through the new century are invited by Broncos owner Pat Bowlen to reunite in Denver and enjoy a weekend of golf, dinner and old memories.

Presenting the Colors is the U.S. Air Force Academy Cadet Honor Guard. The Cadet Honor Guard was founded in 1974, primarily to function as an exhibition drill unit, but later became the sole cadet unit to perform Color Guard, flag details, and all other ceremonial details.

Performing the National Anthem is Sergeant First Class James Gaudet, an active duty recruiter for the Colorado Army National Guard. He has over 21 years of service in the U.S. military and has sung the National Anthem at numerous military ceremonies during that time.

During halftime, John Elway, the first player enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame to spend his entire career in Denver, will receive his ring from John Bankert, Executive Director of the Hall of Fame. In the sky at the conclusion of halftime four F-16s from the 120th Fighter Squadron, 140th Wing, located at Buckley Air Force Base in Aurora, Colo., will wow fans with a four-ship fly by. Also at the conclusion of halftime, members of the United States Air Force Academy parachute team, the Wings of Blue, will parachute into the stadium.

LAST TIME vs. SAN DIEGO (11/16/03) at DENVER 37, SAN DIEGO 8

The Broncos ended their three-game losing streak, with an outstanding defensive effort and the return of Jake Plummer, by defeating the San Diego Chargers 37-8 in front of 75,217 fans at INVESCO Field at Mile High to improve to 6-4 on the season. In the game, tight end Shannon Sharpe, who caught three touchdown passes, broke Jerry Smith's (60) record for all-time touchdown receptions by an NFL tight end. Sharpe finished the game with 101 yards receiving on seven catches and the three scores. Additionally, in his first game since Week 5, Jake Plummer returned to the starting lineup and threw for 253 yards and three touchdowns. Defensively, Denver held San Diego to just 96 total offensive yards and five first downs—the second lowest total by an opponent in franchise history.

Denver caught an early break when linebacker Al Wilson recovered Doug Flutie's fumble on the second play of the game at San Diego's 23-yard line, but the Broncos were unable to capitalize after San Diego stopped them on 4th-and-1 at the Chargers 14-yard line. Flutie fumbled again on the Chargers' next possession, and Trevor Pryce recovered. Denver, this time, was able score when Plummer found Sharpe in the end zone for an 11-yard touchdown pass. After a strong defensive stand, Denver took over near midfield, and pushed the scored to 10-0 on Jason Elam's 42-yard field goal. Midway through the second quarter, Denver scored again, this time on a 22-yard Elam field goal, which capped a 15-play, 86-yard drive. After holding the Chargers to a three-and-out, Denver's special teams blew the game wide open. Wide receiver Rod Smith fielded the punt at his own 35-yard line, and raced 65 yards for a touchdown, and a 20-0 lead. The scoring would continue late in the first half as Sharpe tallied his second touchdown catch of the game—on a 26-yard strike from Plummer—giving Denver a 27-0 halftime lead.

The Broncos continued where they left off late in the third quarter when Plummer hit Sharpe for a 26-yard touchdown connection, the tandem's third of the day. With the score, Sharpe moved passed Jerry Smith for first place all-time among NFL tight ends in touchdown receptions (61). After adding another field goal in the fourth quarter—a 27 yarder by Micah Knorr who kicked in place of Elam after he aggravated a groin injury—Denver had its biggest lead of the game, 37-0. With 10:19 left in the game, San Diego ended Denver's hopes of a shutout when Doug Flutie hit Kassim Osgood for a 19-yard touchdown. A successful two-point conversion attempt closed out the scoring and Denver came away with the 37-8 win.

In the win, Smith finished with a game-high 10 catches for 84 yards, while Sharpe added seven catches for 101 yards and the three touchdowns. Running back Clinton Portis rushed for 106 yards on 25 carries—his fourth consecutive 100-yard against San Diego. On the defensive side of the ball, the Broncos stifled San Diego, allowing just 40 yards rushing and 56 yards passing. Smith's second-quarter touchdown marked the second consecutive game the Broncos have returned a punt for a touchdown. Coupled with Deltha O'Neal's punt return for a touchdown in the previous week, Rod Smith's return made

NFL history as it marked the first time two different players returned punts for touchdowns in consecutive weeks. It was only the second time in franchise history that Denver has returned punts for touchdowns in back-to-back games. In 1976, Rick Upchurch accomplished the feat Sept. 26 vs. Cleveland and Oct. 3 vs. San Diego.

**WEEK 2: at JACKSONVILLE 7, DENVER 6
(ALLTEL STADIUM, 9/19/04)**

The Broncos fell to 1-1 on the season after a 7-6 defeat at the hands of the Jacksonville Jaguars in front of 69,127 at ALLTEL Stadium.

Despite statistically dominating the contest in terms of total yards, time of possession and first downs, the Broncos failed to reach the end zone and committed a costly turnover with seconds remaining in the fourth quarter.

Jacksonville scored the game's only touchdown with 12:39 left in the second quarter as Byron Leftwich found wide receiver Ernest Wilford for a 12-yard touchdown pass to give the Jaguars a 7-0 lead.

Two Jason Elam field goals (44, 22) narrowed the gap to 7-6 at the end of the first half for the Broncos.

Neither squad could sustain a drive for most of the second half as a total of eight punts were forced by the two defenses.

Denver missed an opportunity to take the lead with 36 seconds remaining in the third quarter after Elam's 51-yard attempt into the wind fell just short.

The Broncos struggled with poor field position in the fourth quarter, starting on their own two, 10, and 11-yard lines in their final three possessions of the game.

With no timeouts remaining and 2:20 left in the game, Broncos quarterback Jake Plummer took control of the offense on Denver's 11-yard line and marched downfield with four straight completions, including a key 20-yard strike to Nate Jackson. Plummer then scrambled for nine yards and ducked out-of-bounds on the Jacksonville 26-yard line.

After running back Quentin Griffin picked up the first down on a two-yard run, Plummer spiked the ball to stop the clock at 1:07. Two more Griffin runs brought up third down on the Jaguars 23-yard line with 37 seconds remaining.

On the next play, a bad exchange between Plummer and Griffin resulted in a fumble that was recovered by Jacksonville's Akin Ayodele, halting the Broncos' comeback bid.

Plummer completed 23-of-39 passes for 250 yards while Griffin finished with 66 yards on 25 carries. Veteran wide out Rod Smith led all receivers with six receptions for 83 yards.

HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN MONDAY QUOTES

Injury Update

"Willie Middlebrooks has a sore shoulder. He should be all right. Darius Watts had a little bruise on his (buttocks). He should be (fine). Trevor Pryce still has an enflamed nerve in his lower back right now. We'll have an MRI today and we'll know more Wednesday. Tatum Bell should be getting the pin removed from his finger so he should be in pretty good shape. Champ Bailey should be OK with a little calf strain. Reuben Droughns has a little ankle sprain. He should be all right. Garrison Hearst's ankle is getting better. We'll find out Wednesday if he can go, but he's much improved. Lenny Walls is still working on his shoulder. I'm not sure if he'll be ready this week but maybe by next week."

On the fumble by Quentin Griffin in the fourth quarter

"Anytime there's a fumble, it's the quarterback and the running back. I just think he got a little excited because the hole was so big. You usually don't get holes that big. The bottom line is that it was a fumble. We had our opportunities. Anytime you move the ball like we did and score six points, it's always disappointing. You know, it's a little bit of everybody. You don't control the ball like we did and move the ball like we did and score six points without being a number of factors."

On running the ball on 3rd down instead of kicking a field goal

"I didn't really think it was a debate. When you go through a scenario like that, it's 2nd-and-10 and the ball is on the 24 yard line with 24 seconds left, we run a running play. Of course, they called a timeout with 37 seconds left on the clock. The reason why they called the timeout was because they wanted the ball back. If we ran the play, we didn't have any time outs and obviously we would've kicked the field goal. The reason why we ran the running play is to let it go down to zero and throw our

field goal team out there. But they were smart enough to call a timeout because they didn't want to give us a chance to kick a field goal at that time, obviously, with no chance to get the ball back. So what they did was call the time out right away with 37 seconds left, which meant we had a chance to kick the field goal then. But if we did, they still would've had 32 seconds left on the clock plus a timeout. Of course, my thoughts would be that we could still get a couple more yards but more importantly, they would have to use their timeout. So now they've got it with 32 seconds and no timeout. If you get a good kickoff return, even with a squib kick, if you get one play down the middle, I think they have a chance to win the football game. I thought it was heads up on their part to give themselves a chance to at least get the ball back and call a timeout like they did. You know, that's just football. Now if we get the handoff and things workout well, he walks into the end zone and we're not talking about this. But that's the nature of the game. You've got to get it done. It shouldn't have even come down to that play. I was proud with the way we did go drive down the field. We had to make a play and had to get a drive, and we did some good things. Unfortunately, we just turned the ball over at that point."

On how he thinks Quentin Griffin will react next week

"He'll be fine. He made some good runs in that game. That's the nature of being in the National Football League. He's so conscientious and such a good kid. He's the type of guy that puts on the blame on his shoulders. That's what you've got to understand is that wasn't that play that did it. We had a number of opportunities to get the job done. But when you got a guy that's got a lot of pride, he puts all the blame on his shoulders and he obviously shouldn't do that."

On being concerned about Griffin fumbling the ball consistently

"I think if you look to the one on the goal line, I think he knew that he was going to score. He was just waltzing into the end zone. I think there's an experience there that he just went through saying, 'Hey, I've got to hold on to that ball until I get all the way into the end zone.' He was so nonchalant at the goal line, he just thought he was going to waltz in. So, that's experience right there. Now if he was running the football, and people were taking that ball away from him, I'd be concerned. But I'm not concerned at all. That hole was so big on that third down play, heck, I would've got excited getting through there. But, the bottom line is that you learn from your mistakes and you go on."

On injury to Jaguars DE Paul Spicer

"It was just a running play. What happened is Matt Lepsis is supposed to block the defensive end, he stepped outside and came back inside, and of course Reuben (Droughns) is responsible for the linebacker. What happened is that (Lepsis) whipped around to go block his guy and there was a collision with Reuben Droughns on the defensive end. So (Lepsis) went back to block (Spicer) and unfortunately it was a freak accident. Nothing like that is designed. On a running play those things do happen, it is just unfortunate it had to happen then."

On accusations of malice in injury to Jaguars DE Paul Spicer

"First of all that is totally untrue, and a lot of people get caught up in the emotion of the game not knowing what had happened. Anybody that watches film can understand that it was completely unintentional."

On teams performance in third-down situations

"We did a pretty good job on third-downs, overall. Where we made our mistakes, we had three 3rd-and-1 situations that we normally convert and one 3rd-and-2 that we missed. If you take just two of those four, three 3rd-and-1's and one 3rd-and-2, you get half of those, which we should be about 85 percent, then we are at 50 percent and that will lead the National Football League every year. Against a team like Jacksonville, when you get a chance to keep the ball on third-down and short, it is something we usually do. So it is a credit to them and obviously disappointing to us."

On treatment for injured DE Trevor Pryce

"That's what the MRI is for, to find out exactly how serious it is. We need to get some doctors and specialists to look at the MRI and find out what they recommend for treatment."

"He practiced on Thursday (last week). He took a few reps on Thursday and got a few reps in on Friday, the whole practice. He just said that he doesn't have the leg strength he normally has. When Trevor says something like that, there is something wrong. He hasn't missed any games and he's been to every practice through all the summer camps. We'll just have to wait and see what the MRI gets back, exactly what is wrong. Hopefully it is nothing serious and he will be back shortly."

On performance of DE Reggie Hayward

"He played good. Anytime you can hold a team to eight first downs and 175-yards that is good. With a couple guys out of our starting line-up he played well."

"Reggie has played very well. He played a little bit better than Raylee (Johnson) did the week before so we gave (Reggie) the starting job, which he should, he is a lot younger and we brought Raylee in for more of a substitute role. We don't want to overwork (Raylee) but Reggie played well and so did Raylee."

On offensive performance inside the Red Zone

"We only had the ball one time inside the Red Zone and obviously we got a field goal. What we would like to do is get down there more. If we get down there more we can score some points. Like I said, when we move the ball like that-we had two penalties that brought back 75-80 yards, Rod Smith's play and Quentin Griffin's screen-on top of all that we stopped ourselves a couple times. We just have to get together. When you move the ball like that, 20 first downs in 37 minutes, you should be able to score a few more points than we did."

BRONCOS HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN

Mike Shanahan in 2004 completes a full decade as head coach of the Denver Broncos, and that decade of measurement against the game's all-time coaches places him among the pro football elite. After the first two weeks, he needs just one win to join the exclusive club of head coaches to post 100 wins in the first 10 seasons with one club. The group that Mike Shanahan will join is listed below.

No head coach in the NFL has won more games than Mike Shanahan's 99 victories since the start of the 1995 season. Those 99 wins by Shanahan include seven straight in the playoffs (he is the only coach to have produced seven playoff wins in two years) during the 1997 and 1998 World Championship seasons, years in which he firmly established himself among the game's sideline greats. His postseason percentage of .700, on a 7-3 record, is second only to Vince Lombardi (9-1, .900) among coaches with more than five playoff victories.

Under Shanahan's guidance, Denver has: Posted the most wins in pro football history in a two-year period (33 in 1997-98); posted the most wins in pro football history in a three-year period (46 in 1996-98); won the most postseason games ever in a two-year period (seven, 1997-98); won 18 straight games over 1997-98 to tie the all-time NFL record for consecutive wins; been undefeated for three straight regular seasons at home (1996-98), just the second team ever to do so; and posted a 22-2 record in its last 24 games during the back-to-back title years.

He produced consecutive Super Bowl titles, three straight 13-win seasons (including postseason), and two AFC West titles from 1996-98. Shanahan led Denver to a 14-2 regular season mark and a 3-0 postseason mark in 1998, taking the Broncos back to the victorious Super Bowl glory they experienced in 1997. In his third season with the Broncos in 1997, Shanahan not only led the Broncos back to the Super Bowl for the first time in eight years, but he directed them to their first ever Super Bowl victory. Only Red Miller (1st year) in 1977 got a Broncos' team to the Super Bowl faster than Shanahan did.

In his 10th year with Denver, he has fashioned a franchise-record regular season home mark of **57-16 (.780)**, a regular season mark of **92-54 (.630)**, and an overall mark of **99-57 (.635)**. His NFL record as a head coach in regular season play is **100-66 (.602)** and his overall record is **107-69 (.608)**.

Over the last 12 years (ninth in Denver and the previous three in San Francisco) Mike Shanahan's offenses have finished number one in the NFL four times, second twice and third twice; in two of those campaigns Denver was just 17 yards and 83 yards short of the number one spot.

In 1998 the defending world champions stormed to their second straight title with an offense that scored 501 points and finished third in the NFL in total yards, while the defense had another spectacular postseason, allowing just 25 points and two touchdowns while sparking a remarkable 13-1 turnover ratio in the playoffs.

In 1997 he directed a Denver offense that scored a total of 583 points (29.2 per game) during the entire 1997 season, the fifth highest total in NFL history and the second highest total in AFC history for a combined regular and postseason. Of course, in 1998 Shanahan's Broncos topped that mark by producing 596 regular and postseason points. The all-time high of 636 points came from the 1994 World Champion San Francisco 49ers, for whom Shanahan was the offensive coordinator.

He led his team to a 12-4 regular season record in 1997, marking the first time in franchise history that the team won 12 or more games in back-to-back seasons.

During his NFL career, Shanahan has been a part of teams that have played in nine conference Championship Games, in addition to his six Super Bowl appearances (three victories), five with Denver and Super Bowl XXIX with San Francisco. In his 26 seasons as a pro and college coach, Shanahan's teams have participated in postseason or bowl games 21 times. Shanahan is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University, and also has a master's degree from that institution.

CHARGERS HEAD COACH MARTY SCHOTTENHEIMER

Marty Schottenheimer is in his third season as head coach of the San Diego Chargers. With 165 regular-season victories in 17-and-a-half seasons as an NFL head coach, Schottenheimer ranks first among active coaches in career wins. Schottenheimer also ranks ninth on the NFL's all-time list for career regular-season wins. He trails Paul Brown, who is eighth with 166 career wins. Don Shula is the NFL's all-time leader with 328 career victories.

This is Schottenheimer's fourth stint as an NFL head coach, having previously guided the Cleveland Browns (1984-88), Kansas City Chiefs (1989-1998) and most recently the Washington Redskins (2001). Schottenheimer has compiled a record of 165-113-1 in regular season action.

The 60-year-old Schottenheimer has led his teams to the playoffs 11 times, more than any other active NFL coach. Since 1960, only four coaches have done it more; Don Shula (19), Tom Landry (18), Chuck Noll (12) and Bud Grant (12). All four have been enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Schottenheimer is tied for fifth in league history with 11 playoff appearances.

From 1986-1997 as head coach of the Browns and Chiefs, Schottenheimer led his teams to 12 straight winning seasons and 10 trips to the playoffs. He led six of his teams to division titles, including the Browns in 1985, '86 and '87, and the Chiefs in 1993, '95 and '97. Including the playoffs, Schottenheimer has a combined record of 170-124-1 (.578) as an NFL head coach.

Prior to coaching the Redskins in 2001, Schottenheimer worked for two years (1999-2000) as an NFL analyst for ESPN.

From 1989-1998 Schottenheimer spent 10 seasons as head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs. During his tenure, the Chiefs posted a 101-58-1 regular-season record for a .634 winning percentage, which was the second highest in the NFL during that time span.

Prior to his successful stint in Kansas City, Schottenheimer spent four and a half seasons as the head coach of the Cleveland Browns from 1984 to 1988. During the four full seasons (1985-88) in which he was head coach of the Browns, Schottenheimer produced four playoff berths, three AFC Central titles, and two AFC Championship game appearances.

Schottenheimer's coaching career started with the Portland Storm of the World Football League in 1974. He began that season as one of the team's linebackers, but a shoulder injury ended his playing career and he remained with the team as an assistant coach, tutoring the Storm's linebackers.

In 1975, he landed his first NFL coaching job as the linebackers coach for the New York Giants. He was brought on board by Bill Arnsparger, the Chargers' defensive coordinator during their Super Bowl season in 1994, who returned to San Diego in 2002 as the team's Associate Head Coach-Defense. After two seasons (1975-76) as linebackers coach, Schottenheimer was named the Giants' defensive coordinator.

After one season (1977) as the Giants' defensive coordinator, Schottenheimer became the linebackers coach for the Detroit Lions for two seasons (1978-79). In 1980, he took over as the defensive coordinator for the Cleveland Browns. Schottenheimer became Cleveland's head coach midway through the 1984 season, taking over for Sam Rutigliano on Oct. 22, 1984 after the Browns had a 1-7 start. He went on to lead the Browns to a 4-4 record in the remaining eight games during his first half-season as an NFL head coach.

Born on September 23, 1943 in Canonsburg, Pennsylvania, Schottenheimer and his wife, Pat, have two children, Kristen (Feb. 17, 1970) and Brian (Oct. 16, 1973), and one grandchild, Brandon (April 20, 2001).

The Broncos fell to 1-1 on the season after a 7-6 defeat at the hands of the Jacksonville Jaguars in front of 69,127 at ALLTEL Stadium.

Despite statistically dominating the contest in terms of total yards, time of possession and first downs, the Broncos failed to reach the end zone and committed a costly turnover with seconds remaining in the fourth quarter.

Jacksonville scored the game's only touchdown with 12:39 left in the second quarter as Byron Lettwich found wide receiver Ernest Wilford for a 12-yard touchdown pass to give the Jaguars a 7-0 lead.

Two Jason Elam field goals (44, 22) narrowed the gap to 7-6 at the end of the first half for the Broncos.

Neither squad could sustain a drive for most of the second half as a total of eight punts were forced by the two defenses. Denver missed an opportunity to take the lead with 36 seconds remaining in the third quarter after Elam's 51-yard attempt into the wind fell just short.

The Broncos struggled with poor field position in the fourth quarter, starting on their own two, 10, and 11-yard lines in their final three possessions of the game.

With no timeouts remaining and 2:20 left in the game, Broncos quarterback Jake Plummer took control of the offense on Denver's 11-yard line and marched downfield with four straight completions, including a key 20-yard strike to Nate Jackson.

Plummer then scrambled for nine yards and ducked out-of-bounds on the Jacksonville 26-yard line.

After running back Quentin Griffin picked up the first down on a two-yard run, Plummer spiked the ball to stop the clock at 1:07.

Two more Griffin runs brought up third down on the Jaguars 23-yard line with 37 seconds remaining.

On the next play, a bad exchange between Plummer and Griffin resulted in a fumble that was recovered by Jacksonville's Akin Ayodele, halting the Broncos' comeback bid.

Plummer completed 23-of-39 passes for 250 yards while Griffin finished with 66 yards on 25 carries. Veteran wideout Rod Smith led all receivers with six receptions for 83 yards.

Plummer has started both of the Broncos' games in 2004, completing 41-of-68 passes (60.3 %) for 480 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. **His 66 total completions tie for the fourth-highest AFC total and tie for ninth-best in the NFL. Plummer's 47 rushing yards tie for second-most yards by an AFC quarterback and tie for third in the NFL among signal-callers. He has been sacked only once, which ties the Jets' Chad Pennington for the lowest sack total by a starting quarterback in the NFL.** He utilized eight different receivers to throw for a game and season-high 250 yards on 23-of-39 passing with no touchdowns or interceptions at Jac. (9/19) while also scrambling for 24 yards on the ground. He hit wide receiver Ashley Lelie in stride for a 39-yard gain on the Broncos' 10-play, 76-yard drive at the end of the second half that set up Denver's second field goal of the game. Plummer directed the Broncos to a win in their season opener vs. K.C. Marco Coleman joined the Broncos (3/11) as an unrestricted free agent from Philadelphia and will add depth to Denver's defensive line. In 184 career games (169 starts), Coleman has 656 tackles (468 solo), 62 sacks for -410 yards, 17 passes defended, 20 forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. An experienced defensive lineman, he was voted to the Pro Bowl in 2000 when he made 12 sacks. Entering his 13th year in the NFL, he has played for Miami (1992-95), San Diego (1996-98), Washington (1999-2001), Jacksonville (2002) and Philadelphia (2003). Originally drafted in first round (12th overall) by Miami in the 1992 NFL Draft, he has missed just eight games in 12 seasons. Coleman has started all 16 games in seven seasons and appeared in 16 games nine of 12 seasons. He played right defensive end in his first eight seasons and left end the last four years. Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year in 1992 by *Sports Illustrated* and led San Diego's defensive linemen in tackles three consecutive seasons (1996-98). He has also appeared in nine postseason games, with 41 tackles (33 solo), three sacks and two forced fumbles.

2003: Coleman signed with Philadelphia on Sept. 5, replacing Derrick Burgess, who was placed on injured reserve. He played in 13 games, primarily as a backup defensive end, and posted 10 tackles (5 solo), a half sack and one quarterback pressure. Coleman made three tackles at Buffalo (9/28) and picked up the half sack in the season finale at Washington (12/27). He was a reserve in both of the Eagles' playoff games, where he made three tackles (all solo).

2002: Coleman signed with Jacksonville on June 19 and started all 16 games at left defensive end where he ranked 12th on team with 54 tackles (27 solo), adding five sacks, one forced fumble, one tackle for loss and five quarterback pressures. He led the team's defensive ends in tackles and was one of just six players to start every game on defense. In Week 2 at Green Bay, he made six tackles but suffered a dislocated right elbow in the third quarter and left the game. He was inactive for the next four games, marking the first time in his career that he missed more than one game in a season. Coleman returned to the lineup Oct. 28 vs. N.Y. Giants and made three tackles. Against Seattle (11/4), he posted four tackles, one sack and one forced fumble, and two weeks later at Denver, made five tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. On Dec. 16 vs. Philadelphia, Coleman made six tackles, a half-sack and had one pass defended that led to an interception. He made five tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass deflection on Dec. 30 at New Orleans, and added four tackles and a sack in the season finale vs. Arizona (1/6).

2000: Coleman enjoyed his finest season as a pro when he made a career-high 12 sacks and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl. His sack total topped his previous career-high of 6.5 in 1995 and 1999, and he finished the season tied for eighth in NFL in sacks. Coleman made 62 tackles (42 solo), which ranked eighth on team, and added three passes defended and two forced fumbles. He started all 16 games for fourth consecutive season and played left defensive end for first time after eight years as a

right end (switch made after Redskins signed Bruce Smith). Coleman recorded at least a half-sack in each of the first six games and was named the NFC Defensive Player of the Week after an 11-tackle, three-sack game vs. Tampa Bay in Week 5. Those three sacks tied his single-game career-high set 10/29/92 vs. Indianapolis, and his 11 tackles were a season-high. He posted 2.5 sacks in a season-opening win over Carolina. Against Philadelphia in Week 6, he sacked quarterback Donovan McNabb and forced a fumble on game's second play. He netted a half-sack in Week 11 at St. Louis, and again sacked McNabb in Week 12, forcing another fumble. Coleman tallied six tackles in Week 13 vs. N.Y. Giants, posted six tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Dallas and four tackles in Week 14 at Pittsburgh.

1999: Coleman signed with Washington as an unrestricted free agent on June 3 and started all 16 games at right end, finishing first on team in QB pressures (44), second in sacks (6.5) and tied for first in forced fumbles (three). He ranked eighth with 65 tackles (42 solo) and nine tackles for loss, while also posting a recovered a fumble and returned it 42 yards for his first career touchdown (Nov. 21 vs. N.Y. Giants). In Week 2 vs. N.Y. Giants, he had four tackles, two pressures and a forced fumble, and followed that up with five tackles and two QB pressures in the Redskins' 27-20 win over N.Y. Jets in Week 3. Coleman posted seven quarterback pressures in Week 4 vs. Carolina, and eight pressures, 1.5 sacks, four tackles and three assists in Week 7 vs. Chicago. In Week 9 vs. Philadelphia, he suffered a strained cervical spine and left game but came back to start the next week vs. N.Y. Giants and made three solo tackles, two assists, one sack, one tackle for loss and a recovered fumble that he returned 42 yards for a touchdown and his first career score. Coleman had four tackles in Washington's NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Detroit and eight tackles in the NFL Divisional Playoff Game at Tampa Bay.

1998: Coleman led a San Diego defense, which claimed the league's No. 1 defensive ranking, that allowed only 263 yards and 71.3 yards rushing per game. He led the team's defensive linemen in tackles for the third consecutive season with 51, in 16 starts for the Chargers. Coleman added 3.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries. He collected a season-high nine tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Seattle.

1997: Coleman, who started all 16 games, led all Chargers defensive linemen in tackles for a second consecutive season (48). He added two sacks, one interception (the only one of his career) and forced a team-high three fumbles. Coleman recorded a season-high five tackles, a half-sack and his first career interception at New Orleans in Week 2, and posted five tackles in each game against Kansas City (Week 7 and Week 15).

1996: In his first season with San Diego after being signed as an unrestricted free agent, Coleman made 42 tackles, four sacks and one forced fumble in 15 starts. He posted a season-high six tackles and one sack in the Chargers' Week 6 Monday night game vs. Oakland.

1995: In 16 starts on the season for Miami, Coleman ranked seventh on team with 65 tackles and second with 6.5 sacks. He had a season-high nine tackles and added a sack vs. Saints (10/15), and set a postseason career-high with 11 tackles vs. Buffalo in the AFC Wild Card Playoff game (12/30).

1994: Coleman started all 16 games for the Dolphins and finished the year with 66 tackles, six sacks, four forced fumbles and three passes defended, including five or more tackles in eight games. He opened the season with eight tackles and a sack vs. New England. Coleman posted eight tackles, two sacks (tied a team playoff record) and one forced fumble at San Diego in an AFC Divisional Playoff game (1/8).

1993: Coleman, who started 15 games for Miami, made 54 tackles, 5.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and one pass defended. He had a season-high eight tackles and recorded a sack vs. Bills (9/26). After he fractured his hand vs. Washington (10/4), Coleman was inactive the next week vs. Cleveland. He returned to the lineup vs. Indianapolis (10/24) and made two tackles, and he made two tackles and 1.5 sacks vs. New England (11/21).

1992: Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year by *Sports Illustrated* and Defensive Rookie of the Year by *Football News* after finishing the season with Miami with 84 tackles, six sacks and one forced fumble. His six sacks were the third-highest single-season total for a Dolphin rookie. He made 15 starts (16 played), started the season at outside linebacker before moving to right defensive end for the final 12 games. Coleman posted 13 tackles and three sacks vs. Indianapolis as his new position and followed that with a six-tackle, two sack performance vs. N.Y. Jets. He was the first Dolphins rookie to have back-to-back games with two sacks. Against Buffalo (1/16), he tallied 11 tackles, and made five tackles and one sack vs. Buffalo in the AFC Championship Game. He joined the Dolphins as the team's first-round selection (12th overall) in the draft.

COLLEGE: Coleman finished his career at Georgia Tech as the school's all-time leader with 28 sacks despite playing just three years, and earned All-ACC honors his junior year, playing in 11 games while tallying 67 tackles, 10 sacks and one fumble recovery. He helped lead the school to a share of the national championship as a sophomore in 1990 by making 81 tackles and 13 sacks. Coleman was named second-team All-America by the *Sporting News* and was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week after a 12-tackle, five-sack performance vs. Maryland. As a redshirt freshman, he started all season at outside linebacker posting 63 tackles and five sacks.

PERSONAL: Coleman attended Patterson Co-Operative High School in Dayton, Ohio, where he was an all-area linebacker. As a senior, he made 84 tackles, 31 sacks, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and blocked an extra point. He lettered three times in football and once in track. Coleman performed a cameo role opposite actor Jim Carrey in the movie *Ace Ventura: Pet Detective*. Marco Darrell Coleman is married (Katrina) and has three children, Kabrione, Kennedy and Kenneth. Born Dec. 18, 1969, in Dayton, Ohio, he resides in both Atlanta and Jacksonville.
