AFC WEST-LEADING BRONCOS FACE STOUT DEFENSE SUNDAY IN TAMPA BAY

The Broncos got back in the win column Sunday, with an important 23-13 win over division-rival San Diego at INVESCO Field at Mile High. With the victory, Denver improves to 2-1 overall, and is in first place in AFC West. Behind a solid performance by quarterback Jake Plummer, Denver's air attack got into full gear. Plummer completed 25 of 36 passes (69 percent) for 294 yards and two touchdowns. But more importantly, Plummer's heroics and scrambling ability in the third quarter, paid off for Denver. With Denver clinging to a 13-10 lead, Plummer stepped up to avoid a rush, scrambled out of pocket and hit wide receiver Ashley Lelie in the end zone for a 33-yard touchdown pass, giving the Broncos a 20-10 lead. With the win, Denver remained undefeated (2-0) in AFC West play.

The Broncos look to keep it rolling Sunday, when they travel to Raymond James Stadium to face the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Kickoff for the game is scheduled for 4:15 p.m. (EDT), and it will be broadcast nationally on CBS-TV and locally on CBS-4 (KCNC-TV). Despite an 0-3 record, the Buccaneers have one of the league's best defenses, ranking 10th overall in the NFL, including fourth against the pass.

The game will be only the sixth regular-season meeting between the teams, with Denver holding a 3-2 advantage. The Buccaneers won the last contest in the series, however, pulling out a 13-10 win in Tampa Bay in 1999.

RADIO/TELEVISION vs. TAMPA BAY

The Broncos/Buccaneers game will be broadcast nationally on CBS-TV and locally on CBS-4 (KCNC-TV). Kickoff for the game is 4:15 p.m. (EDT), and for the second consecutive week, **Dick Enberg** will provide the play-by-play, with **Dan Dierdorf** joining him in the booth and **Armen Keteyian** on the sidelines.

For the 35th consecutive year, KOA radio (850) is the flagship station for the Denver Broncos radio network, and every game this season will be broadcast. **Dave Logan** and **Scott Hastings** will provide the play-by-play and color commentary respectively, with **Alan Roach** on the sidelines. The Broncos radio network extends to nine states, and the KOA pregame show, hosted by **Mike Rice**, begins two hours prior to kickoff.

The game will also be broadcast in Spanish on KBNO radio (1280). **Milo Sanchez** will do the play-by-play, with **Luke Sandoval** adding color commentary.

Sports Radio USA will provide a national radio broadcast, with **Larry Kahn** and **Gino Torretta** on the call, and **Troy West** on the sidelines.

THE SERIES vs. TAMPA BAY

Sunday's contest against the Buccaneers will be only the sixth all-time meeting between the teams, with **Denver holding a 3-2 (.600)** advantage. The teams have met two previous times in Tampa, with Denver winning 24-7 in 1981 and the Bucs coming out on top, 13-10, in 1999. Under Head Coach Mike Shanahan, the Broncos are **1-1 (.500)** against the Buccaneers, including **1-0 (1.000)** at home and **0-1 (.000)** on the road.

Posted eight tackles (5 solo) and one sack (-4 yds.) vs. T.B. 9/8/96 for the Lions. Had one sack (-11 yds.) and six tackles (3 solo) vs. T.B. 9/7/97 for the Lions. Played well in NFC Wild Card Game at T.B. with seven tackles (5 solo) and one sack (0 yds.). Added eight tackles (6 solo) at T.B. 12/12/99 for Detroit after posting a sack (-9 yds.) vs. T.B. 10/31 earlier that season. In 16 career games vs. T.B., has 71 tackles (45 solo) along with 4.5 sacks (-24 yds.).

LAST TIME vs. TAMPA BAY (9/26/99) at TAMPA BAY 13, DENVER 10

The Broncos fell to 0-3 to start the season for the first time since 1994 with a 13-10 defeat at Tampa Bay in front of 65,297 at Raymond James Stadium.

Denver's offense had a difficult time getting into gear, mustering only 173 yards of total offense. The Bucs took the opening kickoff and drove 78 yards in nine plays, capping the drive with a 28-yard Mike Alstott touchdown run. The Broncos took advantage of a Tampa Bay special teams mistake tie the score at 7-7. Buccaneers punt returner Jaquez Green fumbled a punt and Denver recovered at the Bucs 12, setting up a two-play drive that culminated in a 12-yard Brian Griese-to-Ed McCaffrey touchdown pass.

Tampa Bay added two field goals in the second quarter, the second coming as time expired in the half, sending the Buccaneers to the locker room with a 13-7 lead. After a scoreless third quarter, Jason Elam pulled Denver to within 13-10 with 14:04 remaining, but the offense could not take advantage of its four remaining possessions, producing no points.

Shannon Sharpe led all Denver receivers with five catches for 39 yards and became the all-time leading receiver in Broncos' history, passing Lionel Taylor in receptions (543) and receiving yards (6,872) with a total of 5 catches for 39 yards for the day. Denver garnered seven sacks in the contest—including a career-high three for Trevor Pryce—for the first time since Oct. 25, 1998 against Jacksonville, but it was the two by Neil Smith that were most significant in an historical sense. Smith's first, which came just before halftime, was the 100th of his NFL career, making him just the 17th player in NFL history to record 100.

**WEEK 3: at DENVER 23, SAN DIEGO 13
(INVESCO FIELD AT MILE HIGH, 9/26/04)**

A stingy defensive effort and a 294-yard passing day by quarterback Jake Plummer helped the Broncos improve to 2-1 with a 23-13 victory over the San Diego Chargers before a crowd of 74,533 at INVESCO Field at Mile High.

Denver scored first on its second drive of the game, as Plummer connected with wide receiver Rod Smith for a 16-yard touchdown to cap off a six-play, 72-yard drive to give the Broncos a 7-0 lead.

Holding on to a 10-3 lead early in the second quarter, the Broncos forced a fumble after safety Kenoy Kennedy sacked San Diego quarterback Drew Brees and defensive tackle Mario Fatafehi scooped up the ball on the Chargers' 36-yard line. Fatafehi's 8-yard return to the Chargers' 28-yard line helped set up an eventual 23-yard Jason Elam field goal to give Denver a 13-3 lead.

In the second half, a Quentin Griffin fumble on Denver's second play of the third quarter yielded a seven-play, 36-yard drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by Brees to close the gap to 13-10.

On the ensuing drive, the Chargers forced the Broncos to punt, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave Denver the ball on San Diego's 34-yard line. After the Chargers' defense forced Denver into another 4th-down situation, the Broncos opted to go for it, and the result was a 33-yard touchdown strike from Plummer to wide receiver Ashley Lelie to give the Broncos a 20-10 advantage.

Elam's 43-yard field goal on the Broncos' second drive of the fourth quarter gave Denver a 23-13 lead they would hold on to.

The Broncos kept San Diego star running back LaDainian Tomlinson in check for most of the contest, limiting the All-Pro to just 60 yards rushing, his lowest rushing output in his last 15 games.

Smith led all receivers with five catches for 75 yards while Plummer completed 25 of 36 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 112.5.

HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN MONDAY QUOTES

Injury report

"We have a few bumps and bruises. I don't think anything serious, nothing that should keep anybody out of this game. Tatum (Bell) is feeling a little bit better; hopefully he'll be able to practice on Wednesday. Besides that, we have a few people getting treatment, but nothing that should keep anybody out."

On the performance of RB Quentin Griffin and ground attack

"First of all, they (San Diego) had a good game plan to take away our running game. They did some things that we have not seen, a different type of defense, and I will give them a lot of credit. They did some things to take away the run. They played an eight man front the majority of the game. They did a good job with stunts inside to slow us down in the running game. They gave us some opportunities to throw the football and we took advantage of it. (Quentin Griffin) only carried the ball 12 times, and I'd say only two times that I saw he maybe could have got something more than he did. It's something that we will work on, but I don't want to give up on him."

On if Griffin's confidence level is hurt

"I think a little bit because he really listens to you guys (joking). He takes it very personally, he wants to play perfect. You like guys with that type of mindset. He's a quiet guy. He doesn't express how he feels, he just wants to go out there and do well. If he doesn't he is disappointed. That doesn't mean he can't handle the pressure or have great games, that's just the nature of this business."

On confidence in the running game

"I think we didn't do a very good job blocking. Nobody could have run in that situation, I don't care who it was. (LaDainian) Tomlinson is not a bad back is he? He was 2.7 (yards per carry), and I don't think they will give up on him."

"There are going to be some games where we get shutdown in the running game. Hopefully when we do, we can do some things in the passing game to offset it and still find a way to win. Sometimes they are going to take away the pass. We have a defense coming up this week that held Seattle (Seahawks) to 182 yards, a team that won 34-0 against San Francisco. So you're never really sure how a team is going to show up, what they are going to take away and how they are going to play. You just have to find a way to win. I was pleased that even though they did a good job stopping our run that we were able to do some things in the passing game to offset (the running game).

"It's always disappointing when you have had the success we have had in our running game. You take a look at those numbers and you say 'wow.' But I think sometimes people overreact a little bit. This is an NFL team. With the formations we were going out of it kind of opened up a little bit so we could do some things in the passing game. Hopefully if another team plays us like that again, we can still throw on them and be successful."

On the performance of QB Jake Plummer

"I thought it was a good performance. He made some plays. Anytime you don't throw any picks and get 300-yards, or thereabouts (294), and run some good things with a couple touchdowns, it's good. I thought he managed the game well. I still felt like we left a couple plays out there on the field and Jake (Plummer) will be the first one to tell you that. Most quarterbacks are trying to play a perfect game; if they don't think in those terms then I think you have the wrong quarterback. I think he is pleased with the way he handled himself and some of the plays he made, but he still wants to play that perfect game and that's why he is such a competitor."

On the team's lack of production on third-down

"You have to go back a practice the things you have been doing well. You have to go back and put guys in third-down situations as many times as we can. Hopefully we will put them in some situations that will occur during the game. If we do that we will get better. Same thing in the red zone, there is only one way to get better in the red zone and that is to work at it."

On what is lacking in red zone performance

"We're not getting the ball in the end zone. You always go back, I go back and look at it myself, what we could've done differently and if we need to change things up. We might have a missed assignment or a bad call but the combination of just getting it done. We'll go back there and try to work out that area."

On LB Jashon Sykes getting back into the starting lineup

"Jashon is a heck of a football player. Sometimes a guy's not out because of special teams, you might have to have a pass rusher, you might have to have an extra wide receiver. What Jashon proved last year was show that he could come into the National Football League and play well. He got a little setback with his injury and it took him awhile to come back and get at full speed. When a guy like (Terry) Pierce can play Mike linebacker and Sam linebacker, it gives us some more flexibility. So it all depends on who's healthy and not healthy. When you lose people, it's kind of tough to get your depth straight."

On if he thinks CB Lenny Walls will play at Tampa

"I think so. I think that we'll find out more once he gets a little contact, but he feels pretty good about it."

On Kelly Herndon playing well in place of Lenny Walls

"I don't know if he's in his place. It was great competition before the start of the season. I thought Lenny maybe had the upper hand going in with his height and his speed. But Kelly has been a scrapper from day one. We expect a guy like Kelly to stepped up and he stepped up. It's been nice too to see some other guys do the same. We've had a couple young guys like Roc Alexander, (Jeff) Shoate who are doing well for us."

On if he will be in contact with his son Kyle (currently an offensive quality control coach with Tampa) at all this week

"My wife will. I won't. That's a good question. One of the things you do as a head coach is you try to coach your kids. This is not a situation where you do talk to the older guy. I've got more experience so I can get stuff out of him. At least I think. But he'd probably get something out of me. On the serious side, it's one of those things where you talk after the game."

On the play of rookie LB D.J. Williams

"I'm very pleased. He's a heck of an athlete. He really prepares himself well. Like most rookies, it's a growing experience. Every time you're out there you learn something. But, he's making plays and learning at the same time. I think he was No. 1 amongst our linebackers in making the least amount of mental mistakes, and they don't make too many mental errors. It's really saying something for the kid, especially against a team like San Diego that runs formations with a number of motions and shifts."

BRONCOS HEAD COACH MIKE SHANAHAN

Mike Shanahan in 2004 completes a full decade as head coach of the Denver Broncos, and that decade of measurement against the game's all-time coaches places him among the pro football elite. After the team's 23-13 win over San Diego (9/26), he joined the exclusive club of head coaches to post 100 wins in the first 10 seasons with one club. The group that Mike Shanahan joined is listed below.

No head coach in the NFL has won more games than Mike Shanahan's 100 victories since the start of the 1995 season. Those 99 wins by Shanahan include seven straight in the playoffs (he is the only coach to have produced seven playoff wins in two years) during the 1997 and 1998 World Championship seasons, years in which he firmly established himself among the game's sideline greats. His postseason percentage of .700, on a 7-3 record, is second only to Vince Lombardi (9-1, .900) among coaches with more than five playoff victories.

Under Shanahan's guidance, Denver has: Posted the most wins in pro football history in a two-year period (33 in 1997-98); posted the most wins in pro football history in a three-year period (46 in 1996-98); won the most postseason games ever in a two-year period (seven, 1997-98); won 18 straight games over 1997-98 to tie the all-time NFL record for consecutive wins; been undefeated for three straight regular seasons at home (1996-98), just the second team ever to do so; and posted a 22-2 record in its last 24 games during the back-to-back title years.

He produced consecutive Super Bowl titles, three straight 13-plus win seasons (including postseason), and two AFC West titles from 1996-98. Shanahan led Denver to a 14-2 regular season mark and a 3-0 postseason mark in 1998, taking the Broncos back to the victorious Super Bowl glory they experienced in 1997. In his third season with the Broncos in 1997, Shanahan not only led the Broncos back to the Super Bowl for the first time in eight years, but he directed them to their first ever Super Bowl victory. Only Red Miller (1st year) in 1977 got a Broncos' team to the Super Bowl faster than Shanahan did.

In his 10th year with Denver, he has fashioned a franchise-record regular season home mark of **58-16 (.784)**, a regular season mark of **93-54 (.633)**, and an overall mark of **100-57 (.637)**. His NFL record as a head coach in regular season play is **101-66 (.605)** and his overall record is **108-69 (.610)**.

Over the last 12 years (ninth in Denver and the previous three in San Francisco) Mike Shanahan's offenses have finished number one in the NFL four times, second twice and third twice; in two of those campaigns Denver was just 17 yards and 83 yards short of the number one spot.

In 1998 the defending world champions stormed to their second straight title with an offense that scored 501 points and finished third in the NFL in total yards, while the defense had another spectacular postseason, allowing just 25 points and two touchdowns while sparking a remarkable 13-1 turnover ratio in the playoffs.

In 1997 he directed a Denver offense that scored a total of 583 points (29.2 per game) during the entire 1997 season, the fifth highest total in NFL history and the second highest total in AFC history for a combined regular and postseason. Of course, in 1998 Shanahan's Broncos topped that mark by producing 596 regular and postseason points. The all-time high of 636 points came from the 1994 World Champion San Francisco 49ers, for whom Shanahan was the offensive coordinator.

He led his team to a 12-4 regular season record in 1997, marking the first time in franchise history that the team won 12 or more games in back-to-back seasons.

During his NFL career, Shanahan has been a part of teams that have played in nine conference Championship Games, in addition to his six Super Bowl appearances (three victories), five with Denver and Super Bowl XXIX with San Francisco. In his 26 seasons as a pro and college coach, Shanahan's teams have participated in postseason or bowl games 21 times. Shanahan is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University, and also has a master's degree from that institution.

BUCCANEERS HEAD COACH JON GRUDEN

Jon Gruden is in his third season as head coach of the Buccaneers. Gruden led Tampa Bay to its first NFL title with a 48-21 victory over Oakland in Super Bowl XXXVII in San Diego on January 26, 2003. The Buccaneers, who were making their first appearance in the NFL's championship game, also claimed the first-ever NFC South title in 2002, just the fourth division crown in team history.

Over that period, the Buccaneers established a club record for victories in a regular season with 12 wins, breaking the previous mark of 11 in 1999, and their 15 overall wins were the most for a club in the then 27-year history of the franchise. In addition, Gruden became the youngest head coach in NFL history to win a Super Bowl and was also the first non-rookie head coach in the history of the NFL to lead his team to the Super Bowl in his first season with a new team. In the process, Gruden became just the third coach since 1966 to win 40 games before his 40th birthday while also becoming only the third head coach in NFL history (also Mike Holmgren with Green Bay and Seattle and Tony Dungy with Tampa Bay and Indianapolis) to lead a different team to a playoff appearance in consecutive years.

Gruden was named the seventh head coach in Tampa Bay Buccaneers history on February 18, 2002 after leading the Oakland Raiders to division titles in each of the final two seasons (2000-01). The NFL's youngest head coach (he turned 41 on August 17, 2004), Gruden had steered the Raiders to a 38-26 regular season mark in his four seasons (1998-2001) with the club, including postseason appearances in 2000 and 2001. Under Gruden, the Raiders advanced to the AFC title game in 2000 and lost in a second round playoff game to eventual Super Bowl champion New England following the '01 campaign. Gruden's offenses finished among the league's Top 10 in each of his last three seasons with the Raiders, including fifth in 1999.

As a seven-year NFL assistant, Gruden saw his teams qualify for the playoffs five times. He also coached five seasons at the collegiate level. Gruden spent the 1991 football season in the college ranks as wide receivers coach at the University of Pittsburgh under head coach Paul Hackett. Gruden was an offensive assistant to head coach George Seifert with the San Francisco 49ers in 1990, working closely with offensive coordinator Mike Holmgren. The 49ers were an NFL-best 14-2, finally losing in the NFC Championship Game.

Born August 17, 1963 in Sandusky, Ohio, Gruden attended South Bend Clay High School in Indiana and was a three-year letterman at quarterback at the University of Dayton, graduating in 1985 with a degree in Communications. The Flyers had a 24-7

record in Gruden's three varsity seasons there and Gruden was honored with the prestigious Lt. Andy Zulli Memorial Award, given to the senior player who best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship and character. Gruden and his wife Cindy, a former University of Tennessee cheerleader, have three sons, Jon II, 10, Michael, 7 and Jayson, 3.

BRONCOS CHAMPIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

Denver Broncos Charities and the Phil Long Community Fund joined together (Sept. 24-26th) to build a fantasy playground at the McGlone Elementary School in Montbello. Mike Shanahan and Jay Ciamino (Phil Long) were at the playground for a press conference and tour on Friday afternoon. Broncos and Phil Long have given more than \$1.1 million to fund the Fantasy Playground Project since 1996. The Mike Shanahan Golf Classic held in June benefits the cause that has built eight other fantasy playgrounds in Denver and Colorado Springs communities. The playground will be formally dedicated on Oct. 8, 2004.

Broncos Alumni all gathered in Denver over the weekend to take in the football game and catch up with old friends and teammates. The Alumni were recognized in a pre-game ceremony and participated in John Elway's acceptance of his Hall of Fame ring during halftime.

Monday, Sept. 20 marked the first speaker forum for the "Lynch's Leaders" program (a partnership between the Denver Broncos and the John Lynch Foundation). Select members from all six Boys and Girls Clubs of Metro Denver traveled to the Boettcher Branch located in Aurora to hear presentations from Jerry Wartgow, Superintendent of Denver Public Schools; Carrie Besnette, Vice President at The Daniels Fund; and Broncos alumni Haven Moses in addition to a videotaped message from John Lynch introducing the night's speakers.

Al Wilson will continue his promotion and support of Prostate Cancer Awareness Week (Sept. 19-25) by visiting the Prostate Cancer Education Council's free screening sites on Tuesday, Sept. 21 in Denver to promote testing during Prostate Cancer Awareness Week. Other efforts with this program have included collaborating with his good friend Marcus Stroud of the Jacksonville Jaguars in the week prior to the Broncos at Jacksonville game. Both players were featured in Game Day Magazine with a question and answer session to help encourage men in their respective communities to take advantage of the free screening sites throughout the week.

In addition, the Sept. 12 season-opener vs. Kansas City was dedicated to increasing prostate cancer awareness in collaboration with the Prostate Cancer Education Council. Wilson's involvement over the past four years has helped raise awareness of the disease and encourage men to get tested for this treatable form of cancer. BRONCOS STRONG IN SEASON'S FIRST MONTH

Getting off to a fast start is important in the NFL. Denver has the NFL's best record in the first month of the season over the past 10 years at 31-12 (.721).

The Broncos won their season opener for the fourth straight year by defeating division rival Kansas City, 34-24, in front of 75,939 fans at INVESCO Field at Mile High and a national television audience on ESPN's Sunday Night Football.

Second-year running back Quentin Griffin, in just his second career start, led the Broncos charge with three touchdowns (2 rush, 1 rec.) and 156 yards rushing on 23 carries, setting a new franchise record for rushing yards in a season opener.

Kansas City jumped on Denver early after running back Priest Holmes' 2-yard touchdown run completed an eight-play, 80-yard drive on the game's opening drive.

After a 43-yard field goal by Jason Elam narrowed the gap for the Broncos, Denver took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter when quarterback Jake Plummer hit Griffin for a 1-yard touchdown. The Broncos defense stuffed the Chiefs once again to regain the ball, setting the stage for Griffin's second touchdown—a 25-yard scamper in which the tailback slashed through several defenders en route to the end zone.

Denver opened the second half with a 17-7 lead, but the Chiefs quickly got back in the game after capitalizing on two Broncos turnovers. Plummer's first pass of the half was intercepted by Kansas City linebacker Monty Bessel, setting up a 50-yard field goal by Lawrence Lynch. On the Broncos' next possession, a solid Kansas City pass rush on third down forced Plummer to errantly heave the ball in the air and right into the hands of linebacker Shawn Barber deep in Broncos' territory. The Chiefs took advantage when Holmes scored his second touchdown on the contest on a 4-yard run tying the score at 17.

Griffin stepped up once again on Denver's next drive, as he burst up the middle for a 47-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career. Holmes' day was not finished, however, as he tied the game on a 33-yard touchdown run, his third of the game, to knot the score at 24.

Elam regained the lead after he booted a 45-yard field goal, and on the Kansas City's next possession, Denver's defense forced the Chiefs to punt. The Broncos responded with a 13-play, 87-yard drive that burned 7:10 on the clock and was capped by a 2-yard touchdown pass from Plummer to tight end Patrick Hope, securing the win for the Broncos.

Denver's offense amassed 413 total yards, including 202 on the ground. Defensive back Champ Bailey was solid in his Broncos debut, notching his 19th career interception in the second quarter and also doubled up as a wide receiver, catching one pass for 11 yards.

A stingy defensive effort and a 294-yard passing day by quarterback Jake Plummer helped the Broncos improve to 2-1 with a 23-13 victory over the San Diego Chargers before a crowd of 74,533 at INVESCO Field at Mile High. Denver scored first on its second drive of the game, as Plummer connected with wide receiver Rod Smith for a 16-yard touchdown to cap off a six-play, 72-yard drive to give the Broncos a 7-0 lead.

Holding on to a 10-3 lead early in the second quarter, the Broncos forced a fumble after safety Kenoy Kennedy sacked San Diego quarterback Drew Brees and defensive tackle Mario Fatatehi scooped up the ball on the Chargers' 36-yard line. Fatatehi's 8-yard return to the Chargers' 29-yard line helped set up an eventual 23-yard Jason Elam field goal to give Denver a 13-3 lead. In the second half, a Quentin Griffin fumble on Denver's second play of the third quarter yielded a seven-play, 36-yard drive that ended with a 1-yard touchdown run by Brees to close the gap to 13-10.

On the ensuing drive, the Chargers forced the Broncos to punt, but a roughing the kicker penalty gave Denver new life and the ball on San Diego's 34-yard line. After the Chargers' defense forced Denver into another 4th-down situation, the Broncos opted to go for it, and the result was a 33-yard touchdown strike from Plummer to wide receiver Ashley Lelie to give the Broncos a 20-10 advantage. Elam's 43-yard field goal on the Broncos' second drive of the fourth quarter gave Denver a 23-13 lead they would hold on to.

The Broncos kept San Diego star running back LaDainian Tomlinson in check for most of the contest, limiting the All-Pro to just 60 yards rushing, his lowest rushing output in his last 15 games.

Smith led all receivers with five catches for 75 yards while Plummer completed 25 of 36 passes for 294 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 112.5.

Plummer quietly is enjoying one of the strongest seasons among signal-callers in the NFL, ranking among conference and league leaders in several categories: passer rating (90.8 – fourth in the AFC), passing yards (774 – third in the AFC and seventh in the NFL), completions (66 – second in the AFC and seventh in the NFL) and touchdowns (4 – tied for third in the AFC and ninth in the NFL). In the second quarter against the Chargers, he moved into 10th place on the Broncos' all-time passing yards list, ahead of John McCormick. He utilized eight different receivers to throw for a game and season-high 250 yards on 23-of-39 passing with no touchdowns or interceptions at Jac. (9/19) while also scrambling for 24 yards on the ground. He hit wide receiver Ashley Lelie in stride for a 39-yard gain on the Broncos' 10-play, 76-yard drive at the end of the second half that set up Denver's second field goal of the game. Plummer directed the Broncos to a win in their season opener vs. K.C. (9/12) by completing 18-of-29 passes (with completions to eight different receivers) for a game-high 230 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He connected with WR Ashley Lelie for a 58-yard completion in the third quarter and also proved to be a threat on the ground, setting a career-high with eight rushes. Plummer led a pivotal 13-play, 87-yard touchdown drive late in the game that ate up 7:10 and resulted in a two-yard scoring pass to tight end Patrick Hape to put Denver ahead 34-24.

Marco Coleman joined the Broncos (3/11) as an unrestricted free agent from Philadelphia and will add depth to Denver's defensive line. In 184 career games (169 starts), Coleman has 656 tackles (468 solo), 62 sacks for -410 yards, 17 passes defensed, 20 forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. An experienced defensive lineman, he was voted to the Pro Bowl in 2000 when he made 12 sacks. Entering his 13th year in the NFL, he has played for Miami (1992-95), San Diego (1996-98), Washington (1999-2001), Jacksonville (2002) and Philadelphia (2003). Originally drafted in first round (12th overall) by Miami in the 1992 NFL Draft, he has missed just eight games in 12 seasons. Coleman has started all 16 games in seven seasons and appeared in 16 games nine of 12 seasons. He played right defensive end in his first eight seasons and left end the last four years. Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year in 1992 by *Sports Illustrated* and led San Diego's defensive linemen in tackles three consecutive seasons (1996-98). He has also appeared in nine postseason games, with 41 tackles (33 solo), three sacks and two forced fumbles.

2003: Coleman signed with Philadelphia on Sept. 5, replacing Derrick Burgess, who was placed on injured reserve. He played in 13 games, primarily as a backup defensive end, and posted 10 tackles (5 solo), a half sack and one quarterback pressure. Coleman made three tackles at Buffalo (9/28) and picked up the half sack in the season finale at Washington (12/27). He was a reserve in both of the Eagles' playoff games, where he made three tackles (all solo).

2002: Coleman signed with Jacksonville on June 19 and started all 16 games at left defensive end where he ranked 12th on team with 54 tackles (27 solo), adding five sacks, one forced fumble, one tackle for loss and five quarterback pressures. He led the team's defensive ends in tackles and was one of just six players to start every game on defense. Coleman picked up his first sack as a Jaguar on Oct. 6 vs. Philadelphia (of Donovan McNabb) and notched a sack of Chris Redman on Oct. 20 at Baltimore. He posted a season-high 10 tackles on Nov. 17 at Houston and made two sacks on Dec. 1 vs. Pittsburgh (of Kordell Stewart), marking first multi-sack game since 2000. Coleman tallied his fifth sack of the season Dec. 15 at Cincinnati (of Jon Kitna) and forced a fumble on the play.

2001: Coleman started 12 games in his final season with Washington and missed four games due to a right elbow injury. He collected 55 tackles (41 solo), 4.5 sacks and three forced fumbles. In Week 2 at Green Bay, he made six tackles but suffered a dislocated right elbow in the third quarter and left the game. He was inactive for the next four games, marking the first time in his career that he missed more than one game in a season. Coleman returned to the lineup Oct. 28 vs. N.Y. Giants and made three tackles. Against Seattle (11/4), he posted four tackles, one sack and one forced fumble, and two weeks later at Denver, made five tackles, one sack and one forced fumble. On Dec. 16 vs. Philadelphia, Coleman made six tackles, a half-sack and had one pass defensed that led to an interception. He made five tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and a pass deflection on Dec. 30 at New Orleans, and added four tackles and a sack in the season finale vs. Arizona (1/6).

2000: Coleman enjoyed his finest season as a pro when he made a career-high 12 sacks and earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl. His sack total topped his previous career-high of 6.5 in 1995 and 1999, and he finished the season tied for eighth in NFL in sacks. Coleman made 62 tackles (42 solo), which ranked eighth on team, and added three passes defensed and two forced fumbles. He started all 16 games for fourth consecutive season and played left defensive end for first time after eight years as a right end (switch made after Redskins signed Bruce Smith). Coleman recorded at least a half-sack in each of the first six games and was named the NFC Defensive Player of the Week after an 11-tackle, three-sack game vs. Tampa Bay in Week 5. Those three sacks tied his single-game career-high set

10/25/92 vs. Indianapolis, and his 11 tackles were a season-high. He posted 2.5 sacks in a season-opening win over Carolina. Against Philadelphia in Week 6, he sacked quarterback Donovan McNabb and forced a fumble on game's second play. He netted a half-sack in Week 11 at St. Louis, and again sacked McNabb in Week 12, forcing another fumble. Coleman tallied six tackles in Week 13 vs. N.Y. Giants, posted six tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Dallas and four tackles in Week 14 at Pittsburgh.

1999: Coleman signed with Washington as an unrestricted free agent on June 3 and started all 16 games at right end, finishing first on team in QB pressures (44), second in sacks (6.5) and tied for first in forced fumbles (three). He ranked eighth with 65 tackles (42 solo) and nine tackles for loss, while also posting a recovered a fumble and returned it 42 yards for his first career touchdown (Nov. 21 vs. N.Y. Giants). In Week 2 vs. N.Y. Giants, he had four tackles, two pressures and a forced fumble, and followed that up with five tackles and two QB pressures in the Redskins' 27-20 win over N.Y. Jets in Week 3. Coleman posted seven quarterback pressures in Week 4 vs. Carolina, and eight pressures, 1.5 sacks, four tackles and three assists in Week 7 vs. Chicago. In Week 9 vs. Philadelphia, he suffered a strained cervical spine and left game but came back to start the next week vs. N.Y. Giants and made three solo tackles, two assists, one sack, one tackle for loss and a recovered fumble that he returned 42 yards for a touchdown and his first career score. Coleman had four tackles in Washington's NFC Wild Card Playoff vs. Detroit and eight tackles in the NFL Divisional Playoff Game at Tampa Bay.

1998: Coleman led a San Diego defense, which claimed the league's No. 1 defensive ranking, that allowed only 263 yards and 71.3 yards rushing per game. He led the team's defensive linemen in tackles for the third consecutive season with 51, in 16 starts for the Chargers. Coleman added 3.5 sacks and two fumble recoveries. He collected a season-high nine tackles and a sack in Week 14 at Seattle.

1997: Coleman, who started all 16 games, led all Chargers defensive linemen in tackles for a second consecutive season (48). He added two sacks, one interception (the only one of his career) and forced a team-high three fumbles. Coleman recorded a season-high five tackles, a half-sack and his first career interception at New Orleans in Week 2, and posted five tackles in each game against Kansas City (Week 7 and Week 15).

1996: In his first season with San Diego after being signed as an unrestricted free agent, Coleman made 42 tackles, four sacks and one forced fumble in 15 starts. He posted a season-high six tackles and one sack in the Chargers' Week 6 Monday night game vs. Oakland.

1995: In 16 starts on the season for Miami, Coleman ranked seventh on team with 65 tackles and second with 6.5 sacks. He had a season-high nine tackles and added a sack vs. Saints (10/15), and set a postseason career-high with 11 tackles vs. Buffalo in the AFC Wild Card Playoff game (12/30).

1994: Coleman started all 16 games for the Dolphins and finished the year with 66 tackles, six sacks, four forced fumbles and three passes defensed, including five or more tackles in eight games. He opened the season with eight tackles and a sack vs. New England. Coleman posted eight tackles, two sacks (tied a team playoff record) and one forced fumble at San Diego in an AFC Divisional Playoff game (1/8).

1993: Coleman, who started 15 games for Miami, made 54 tackles, 5.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and one pass defensed. He had a season-high eight tackles and recorded a sack vs. Bills (9/26). After he fractured his hand vs. Washington (10/4), Coleman was inactive the next week vs. Cleveland. He returned to the lineup vs. Indianapolis (10/24) and made two tackles, and he made two tackles and 1.5 sacks vs. New England (11/21).

1992: Coleman was named the NFL Rookie of the Year by *Sports Illustrated* and Defensive Rookie of the Year by *Football News* after finishing the season with Miami with 84 tackles, six sacks and one forced fumble. His six sacks were the third-highest single-season total for a Dolphin rookie. He made 15 starts (16 played), started the season at outside linebacker before moving to right defensive end for the final 12 games. Coleman posted 13 tackles and three sacks vs. Indianapolis at his new position and followed that with a six-tackle, two sack performance vs. N.Y. Jets. He was the first Dolphins rookie to have back-to-back games with two sacks. Against Buffalo (11/16), he tallied 11 tackles, and made five tackles and one sack vs. Buffalo in the AFC Championship Game. He joined the Dolphins as the team's first-round selection (12th overall) in the draft.

COLLEGE: Coleman finished his career at Georgia Tech as the school's all-time leader with 28 sacks despite playing just three years, and earned All-ACC honors his junior year, playing in 11 games while tallying 67 tackles, 10 sacks and one fumble recovery. He helped lead the school to a share of the national championship as a sophomore in 1990 by making 81 tackles and 13 sacks. Coleman was named second-team All-America by the *Sporting News* and was named the ACC Defensive Player of the Week after a 12-tackle, five-sack performance vs. Maryland. As a redshirt freshman, he started all season at outside linebacker posting 63 tackles and five sacks.

PERSONAL: Coleman attended Patterson Co-Operative High School in Dayton, Ohio, where he was an all-area linebacker. As a senior, he made 84 tackles, 31 sacks, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and blocked an extra point. He lettered three times in football and once in track. Coleman performed a cameo role opposite actor Jim Carrey in the movie *Ace Ventura: Pet Detective*. Marco Darrrell Coleman is married (Katrina) and has three children, Kabrione, Kennedy and Kenneth. Born Dec. 18, 1969, in Dayton, Ohio, he resides in both Atlanta and Jacksonville.

DEFENSIVE TACKLE

Ellis Johnson, an accomplished defensive tackle who led all NFL interior linemen in sacks last season, joined the Broncos on Sept. 20, 2004, in a trade with Atlanta for an undisclosed draft choice. In 136 career games (89 starts), Johnson has made 532 tackles (273 solo) and recorded 48 sacks (-315 yds.), highlighted by his eight sacks in 2003 that tied a personal best. He has eight multiple-sack games during his nine years in the NFL spent with the Colts (1995-01) and Falcons (2002-03). A durable veteran who has missed only eight games in his career, Johnson should add to an already potent Denver defense by providing an inside pass-rushing threat on the Broncos' defensive line. He spent the previous two seasons with the Falcons, where he was a vital member of their defensive unit. He played in 32 games (5 starts) for Atlanta and totaled 118 tackles (65 solo) with 15 sacks (-107 yds.) from 2002-03 after the team signed him as a free agent Sept. 1, 2002. Johnson spent his first seven seasons in the NFL with the Colts and started every game he played during a five-year span from 1997-2001 (76 games). The Colts' leader in sacks in 1998 with eight (-34 yds.), Johnson's sack total that year also was a personal best and complemented his 75 tackles (48 solo). That season came before a strong 1999 Johnson in the first round (15th overall) of the 1995 NFL draft out of Florida, and he played in all 16 regular-season games as a rookie (2 starts), totaling 4.5 sacks (-26 yds.), while seeing action in three Indianapolis playoff games (1 start) that year. At Florida, Johnson was a three-year starter and totaled 165 tackles (112 solo), 17.5 sacks (-134 yds.), six forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 44 games

(26 starts) during four seasons with the Gators. His 36.5 career tackles for loss rank 10th all-time in Florida history. He was named National Defensive Player of the Year by CNM as a senior in addition to being tabbed a first-team All-Southeastern Conference selection and earning honorable mention All-American honors from *The Sporting News*.

2003: Johnson played in 16 games (3 starts) in his second season with the Falcons, collecting 64 tackles (35 solo) and eight sacks (-49 yds.). His eight sacks led all interior linemen in the NFL and tied his personal best, which he set in 1998 with the Colts. He had a pair of two-sack games with his first of the season coming vs. New Orleans (10/19) when he pulled down Saints quarterback Aaron Brooks twice for nine yards to post five tackles. A little over a month later at Houston (11/30), two of his seven total tackles were sacks (-9 yds.) to mark the eighth multiple-sack game of Johnson's career. During the Falcons' game at Carolina (9/28), he tied for the lead among Atlanta defensive linemen with seven tackles (6 solo). He had a strong game vs. Washington (9/14) with five tackles (4 solo) and a sack.

2002: Johnson was signed by the Falcons as a free agent on Sept. 1 after the Colts waived him Aug. 28. Playing in a new defensive system, he finished the year with 54 tackles (30 solo), seven sacks (-58 yds.) and one forced fumble in 16 games (2 starts). His seven sacks were second most by a Falcons player and were supplemented by 13 quarterback pressures. In Atlanta's upset win at Green Bay (1/4/03) in an NFC Wild Card Game, Johnson tackled Packers running back Ahman Green for a 4-yard loss on fourth down with Green Bay threatening to score in the second quarter. He combined for four tackles (3 solo) during the Falcons' two playoff games. He had one sack (-6 yds.), six tackles and a season-high three quarterback pressures at Minnesota (12/1). At Carolina (11/24), he added two sacks (-17 yds.). Johnson came off the bench vs. Baltimore (11/3) and enjoyed a strong game for the Falcons as he collected six tackles, one sack (-10 yds.) and one quarterback pressure.

2001: Johnson started all 16 games at right defensive tackle for the Colts to mark the third time in his career and the third time in the last four seasons that he has started 16 games. He registered 61 tackles (25 solo), 3.5 sacks (-38.5 yds.), two batted passes and one forced fumble in his final year in Indianapolis. Johnson showed consistency during his seventh NFL season by making at least four tackles in 11 games. He had a strong game vs. Denver (1/6/02) with one sack (-7 yds.) and four tackles against the Broncos. During the Colts' game vs. Atlanta (12/16), he collected six tackles and 1.5 sacks (-17.5 yds.). In a game at New Orleans (11/18), Johnson made his first sack of the season for a 14-yard loss and totaled three tackles. He made two stops vs. New England (10/21). Johnson had several strong performances in September, making five tackles vs. Buffalo (9/23) and four tackles at N.Y. Jets (9/9).

2000: Johnson played in 13 games (13 starts) at right defensive tackle and made 58 tackles (25 solo) with five sacks (-25 yds.), one interception and one forced fumble. He was inactive for three games (vs. Detroit (10/29), at Chicago (11/5) and vs. N.Y. Jets (11/12)) with a knee injury. He started in the Colts' AFC Wild Card Game at Miami (12/30) and recorded six tackles (3 solo) and one sack, his first ever in the playoffs, that went for -4.5 yards. The Colts played vs. Miami (11/26) a month before their playoff showdown with the Dolphins, and Johnson turned in an equally impressive game that day with five tackles and one sack (0 yds.). A week earlier at Green Bay (11/19), he produced four tackles, one sack and the second interception of his career against the Packers. When the Colts visited Seattle (10/15), he came through with three tackles, one sack and a forced fumble. He posted back-to-back five-tackle games at Buffalo (10/1) and at New England (10/8). Johnson was a dominating presence on the defensive line vs. Oakland (9/10) with seven tackles.

1999: Johnson started all 16 games at right defensive tackle, totaling 76 tackles (34 solo) and 7.5 sacks (-46.5 yds.) while recovering one fumble and breaking up three passes. His sack total in 1999 was the second-highest total among Colts defenders. Johnson started in the Colts' AFC Divisional Playoff Game vs. Tennessee (1/16/00), making four tackles (1 solo). While visiting the Giants (11/14), he turned in a strong showing with seven tackles (3 solo) and two sacks (-11 yds.). Johnson's season-high in tackles came when he had 10 stops vs. Kansas City (11/7). Two weeks earlier, Johnson made six tackles and two sacks (the third multiple-sack game of his career) vs. Cincinnati (10/24). He added five tackles, including one sack, at N.Y. Jets (10/17). The sack against the Jets came on the game's final play to seal the win for the Colts. In a game at San Diego (9/26), Johnson totaled six tackles and half a sack (-3.5 yds.).

1998: Johnson posted the most complete season of his career and was one of seven Colts to start all 16 games. His 75 tackles (48 solo) were fifth most on the team, and his eight sacks (-34 yds.) were a team and career high. Additionally, he registered one forced fumble and three pass breakups for the Colts. Johnson totaled the second multiple-sack game of his career vs. Carolina (12/27) with two sacks (-9 yds.) to go along with nine tackles and his lone forced fumble of the season. He posted back-to-back games with a sack at Seattle (12/20) and vs. Cincinnati (12/13). In a performance vs. San Diego (10/4), he created havoc on the defensive line with seven tackles (5 solo). His season-high in tackles came vs. New Orleans (9/27) with 10 stops and one sack against the Saints.
