- Started all 13 games played in 2020, tallying 38 tackles, one interception (25 yds., 1TD), 12 pass breakups and one fumble recovery.
- Collected 42 tackles (32 solo), two interceptions (24 yds.), eight pass breakups, three forced fumbles and one fumble recovery in 2019 while starting all 13 games for the Crimson Tide.



- Voted as the team's offensive MVP and was named a Maxwell Award (National Player of the Year) and Doak Walker Award (nation's top RB) semifinalist after rushing 157 times for 1,140 yards (7.3 avg.) with 19 scores as a senior.

2020: Williams appeared in 11 games (1 start) during his junior season, totaling 157 rushes for 1,140 yards (7.3 avg.) with 19 touchdowns in addition to catching 25 passes for 305 yards (12.2 avg.) with three scores... Voted as the team's offensive MVP and was named a Maxwell Award (National Player of the Year) and Doak Walker Award (nation's top RB) semifinalist... Garnered *Associated Press* All-America Second Team honors while being chosen to the All-ACC Second Team... Set the single-season program record with 132 points and 22 total touchdowns (fourth most in the country) and tied former Tar Heel RB Don McCauley (1970) for the most rushing scores in a single campaign (19)... Tied career high with four three-touchdown games on the ground and had a four-score performance (3 rush, 1 receiving) at Duke (11/7)... Rushed for 100 yards or more six times and had one 200-yard output on the ground.

2019: Williams saw action in all 13 games (1 start) in 2019, totaling 166 attempts for 933 yards (5.6 avg.) with five touchdowns in addition to catching 17 passes for 176 yards (10.4 avg.) and one receiving score... Collected first touchdown of the season and added 76 yards on 10 carries (7.6 avg.) vs. Miami (9/7)... Had 49 yards on 10 rushes (4.9 avg.) and added one rushing score vs. Clemson (9/28)... Rushed 20 times for a season-high 144 yards (7.2 avg.) with one touchdown at Georgia Tech (10/5)... Totaled 22 rushes for 111 yards (5.0 avg.) vs. Duke (10/26)... JOHNSON AT A GLANCE:

- A safety who played 31 games (9 starts) at Indiana University, totaling 70 tackles (53 solo), four sacks (31 yds.), seven interceptions (166 yds.; 1 TD), seven pass breakups and two forced fumbles during his collegiate career.
- Became the first Indiana safety since Eric Allen in 1996 to earn first-team All-Big Ten honors after posting 43 tackles (33 solo), four interceptions (94 yds.), four pass breakups and one forced fumble in eight games (all starts) in 2020.
- Played 13 games (1 start) for the Hoosiers in 2019, compiling 25 tackles (18 solo), three sacks (23 yds.), two interceptions (72 yds.; 1 TD), two pass breakups and one forced fumble.
- Saw action in 10 games at safety and on special teams in 2018, posting two solo tackles, one interception and one pass breakup.
- Prepped at Riverview High School, where he posted 62 tackles, one sack, six interceptions (1 TD), three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, while tallying 13 receptions for 219 yards with two touchdowns, nine carries for 112 yards and two scores and three special-teams TDs (2 PR; 1 KO) during his senior campaign.
- Selected by the Broncos in the fifth round (164th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft.



2020: Johnson started all eight games he appeared in during his final collegiate campaign, recording 43 tackles (33 solo), four interceptions (94 yds.), four pass breakups and one forced fumble... Earned first-team All-Big Ten (media) and second-team All-Big Ten (coaches) honors, becoming the first Indiana safety to garner first-team honors since Eric Allen in 1996... Was tied for the team lead in interceptions (4) and finished second in tackles (43) and third in pass breakups (4)... Collected a career-high 10 tackles (7 solo), one interception (17 yds.) and one forced fumble vs. Penn State (10/24), earning Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week honors... Had five solo tackles, one sack (8 yds.), two interceptions (57 yds.) and one pass breakup at Ohio State (11/21)... Recorded one interception (20 yds.), one pass breakup and added four tackles (3 solo) at Wisconsin (12/5)... Posted nine tackles (8 solo) and one pass breakup in the Outback Bowl vs. Mississippi (1/2).

2019: Johnson played 13 games (1 start) for the Hoosiers in 2019, compiling 25 tackles (18 solo), three sacks (23 yds.), two interceptions (73 yds.; 1 TD), two pass breakups and one forced fumble... Talled one sack (7 yds.) vs. Ball State (8/31)... Posted a season-high six tackles vs. Connecticut (9/21)... Nabbed a sack (11 yds.) and had three tackles (2 solo) at Maryland (11/2)...
